




**St. Junipero Serra: The Man Behind the Sensationalism**



***DIOS NOS LLAMA Y NOS SUEÑA .***

La liturgia de la Iglesia nos enseña con sus celebraciones acerca de cómo vivir y seguir más de cerca el misterio salvífico. Hemos terminado la navidad, pero no por eso dejamos de sorprendernos en como Dios actúa cada día naciendo en muchísimas situaciones en nuestro mundo. Y entramos al tiempo ordinario, que nos enseña sobre la esperanza y la venida de nuestro salvador cada día.

Este domingo las lecturas tienen un tono vocacional en todo sentido, no solo para aquellos o aquellas que quieren consagrarse como religiosos o religiosas, misioneros etc. Es para todo hombre y mujer que ha recibido el bautismo. Nos llama el Señor a vivir plenamente nuestra vida como bautizados respondiéndole a El desde nuestro estado.

Decimos que la vocación es la respuesta a una llamada que el hombre recibe de parte de Dios. Quien toma la iniciativa es el que llama, el Señor. Esto se observa claramente en la primera lectura donde el "convocado" es un adolescente inexperto que vive en una época en que "era rara la palabra de Yahvé". Dios se fijó en un muchacho, no en el sacerdote Elí, porque Dios prefiere a los pequeños tal como había cantado Ana, madre de Samuel. La llamada es pura gracia, don que Dios da. Él se fija en ti y te llama por tu nombre como a Samuel. Te está diciendo primero que te ama; después, que cuenta contigo; al fin, pide tu colaboración para que trabajes por el Reino, que ayudes al hermano necesitado, que compartas el dolor del que está enfermo o excluido, que seas instrumento de paz, que hagas de tu profesión un servicio, que proclames con tu vida la Buena Noticia e incluso que lo dejes todo por El. Es hermoso saber que Dios "te ha soñado" desde el principio de una manera, que espera mucho de ti, pero que respeta tu libertad. El sólo quiere que seas feliz haciendo felices a los demás.

Dios no llama sólo una vez en la vida. Su llamada se mantiene a lo largo de toda tu vida. Te puede llamar también a través de los hermanos. Son las mediaciones que Dios utiliza para darnos a conocer su sueño.

Tras la llamada hay un discernimiento para aclarar mejor por dónde tenemos que ir. No es fácil, por eso necesitamos como Samuel alguien que nos acompañe. Samuel fue a ver a Elí. Los dos discípulos acudieron a Juan, que les mostró a Jesús "que pasaba". El paso de Jesús por nuestra propia historia personal no es fácil de apreciar. Muchos como Herodes y el joven rico también se cruzaron con él, pero no fueron capaces de escucharle y de seguirle. Hoy decimos que hay menos vocaciones para la vida religiosa o el sacerdocio. Yo creo que Dios sigue llamando, pero no sabemos escucharle porque hay mucho ruido a nuestro alrededor. Todo lo relacionado con la vocación necesita de mucha oración, reflexión y consejo. No siempre percibimos la Palabra con claridad. En toda vocación hay mucho de búsqueda, pero en muchas ocasiones Dios nos da la luz a través de experiencias y de personas que nos iluminan.

"Habla, Señor, que tu siervo escucha", Dios nos invita a experimentar su vida y a gozar de los dones que nos regala. "Fueron, vieron y se quedaron" .¡Qué generosidad y que amor demostraron! No sabían bien lo que implicaba su decisión, pero se han dejado seducir, se han enamorado de Dios. Andrés, uno de los discípulos comunica su alegría a su hermano Simón: "Hemos encontrado al Mesías" y lo llevó a Jesús , la felicidad de experimentar y saber que Dios te llama debe transmitirse, necesitamos eso más y más, sobretodo en nuestra comunidad parroquial, que nos sintamos todos y todas llamados por Dios a servir , no sean sordos a su llamado. Amen.





**Mass Intentions at Our Lady of Guadalupe**

Mass intentions refer to the particular purpose for which a specific Mass is offered (Catholicculture.org). This tradition is closely linked with the concept

of “communion with the saints,” that is, the Catholic teaching that all the faithful (including us here on earth, our brothers and sisters who are already in heaven, and those who are in Purgatory) form one community.<sup>1</sup> When we ask a priest to offer a Mass for a deceased loved one, we do so as an expression of our belief in the communion of saints, as part of our acknowledgment that our loved one, although deceased, is still a member of the community of the faithful. Because it is ultimately an expression of communal faith in the Lord and in His promise of eternal life, the tradition of offering Masses for those who have died often brings some measure of comfort to the loved ones they left behind. Masses are offered for many reasons: in thanksgiving to God, for someone who is sick, in remembrance of a loved one’s birthday or anniversary, and perhaps most frequently, in remembrance of a loved one who has passed away. 


