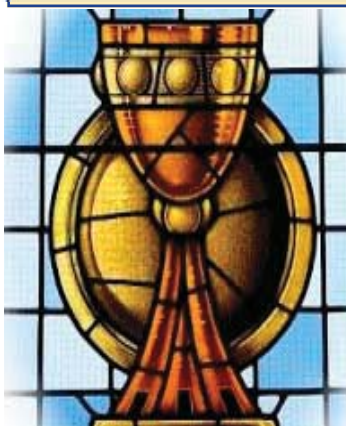

**Scripture Reflection**

When the people of Nineveh repented, they showed it by wearing sackcloth and fasting from food. Sometimes we might think that way: That repenting means punishing ourselves or feeling sorry. Jesus sees things differently. He preached repentance that was a change of heart, a new way of look-

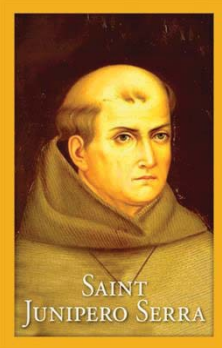
ing at things, a new way of acting. In the gospel today, we see an example. The first people he calls to be disciples were fisherman. They would have considered their family, their partners, and their boat as the most important things in their lives. You need all of them to be a successful fisherman.

Yet the disciples don't even hesitate when called by Jesus. They leave behind their boats, their nets, even their father, to follow Jesus. They don't worry about what they will do, or look back at what they are leaving behind. Now they are fishers of men. Their "repentance" was more than just giving up sins. They were beginning a new life and a new way of looking at the world.

St. Paul refers to this as a new world. When he talks about not using the world fully, he means not fully engaged in the world, but looking to a better one, where God is more important than any passing pleasure or pain. Is your marriage an example of God's love for your friends and relatives? When you are rejoicing, do you give thanks to God? When you are shopping, do you buy what you really need, or what you think will make you happy? Jesus calls us all to this new way of living. With Jesus, we can make a new world.

**Something to Think About**

Here we are almost the end of January. Twenty one days into the year of our Lord, Jesus Christ. January often brings to mind the season of winter. Only 24 days to the season of Lent!!!!!! Something that we associate with sacrifice. It isn't too soon to begin to think about our spiritual lives. What really makes a good spiritual life? Doesn't Sunday Mass make a good spiritual life? Some say no, it doesn't. Spiritual life is so much more than just attendance at Mass. It is a life of the Gospel put into action. Perhaps we could take some time to look at our lives and see how we can put the Gospel into action. May your week be one of God's Good News put into action.

## ***NO LE DEMOS SÓLO UN TROZO DE LA RED***

Continuamos con el tema del llamado que Dios nos hace a todos, este domingo, Jesús nos recuerda que los sencillos, los más pobres, y no estudiados, han sido llamados de primer momento por el mismo.

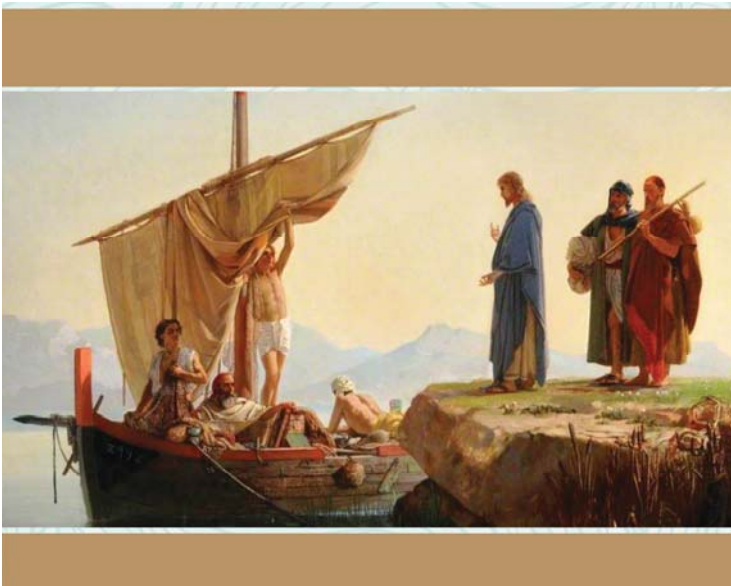
Tenemos tiempo para todo menos para lo esencial. Y, con nuestras prisas, dejamos de lado precisamente eso: lo substancial. ¿Por qué la crisis que estamos padeciendo? ¿Dónde están sus causas? Como que hoy el hombre y la mujer, no ponemos atención a ese llamado a la vida de santidad, vida de servicio, entrega desinteresada. Hay muchos factores que nos están distraendo y no nos dejan pasar esos momentos a solas con nuestro Señor.

Hoy, en medio de las aguas turbulentas, el Señor nos invita a desenmarañarnos de los caminos que sólo nos conducen a premios efímeros, a promesas falsificadas o ficticias. La conversión que nos propone Jesús es precisamente la que el Papa Benedicto, hace un tiempo, nos sugería: hay que volver a Dios porque, a Dios, lo hemos orillado y la secuela más grave ha sido que hemos caído en un humanismo deshumanizador y deshumanizante o en un deshumanizado humanismo. No es juego de palabras, es así. Sólo cuando pongamos a Dios en el centro de nuestra vida, clave y mensaje del Reino anunciado por Jesucristo, llegaremos a esa armonía personal, social y universal que muchos se empeñan frívolamente en conquistar al margen de toda referencia a Dios. ¿Es posible alcanzarla sin Dios?

Estamos en un tiempo privilegiado para la fe. La Nueva Evangelización, de la cual se habla tanto, nos exige precisamente eso: desembarazarnos de aquellas redes que han servido en otro tiempo pero que, ahora, se nos quedan cortas o débiles. No olvidemos que, la exigencia a la conversión, sigue siendo la misma. Que las verdades fundamentales de Jesucristo, y guardadas en el Depósito de la Fe de la Iglesia, son inalterables. ¿Dónde fallamos entonces? La prueba de fuego está en el entusiasmo de nuestra vida cristiana ¿Cómo es? ¿Respondemos con generosidad a las llamadas del Señor? ¿Dejamos algo por El? ¿No respondemos, a veces, con unos minutos semanales para la misa y poco más? El Señor, cuando pasó al lado de los discípulos, no les invitó a romper con un trozo de aquellas redes que eran su forma de vida. Les exigió algo más: si creen en mí, dejenlo todo. Pero con todas las consecuencias. Lo valoraron y, mirando al horizonte del mar y lo que tenían entre manos, comprobaron que Jesús, sus palabras y sus obras, eran un tesoro. Lo que era aparente pérdida lo juzgaron como ganancia. Acertaron de lleno. ¿Es un tesoro para nosotros Cristo?

Dios, porque es bueno y justo, confía en que vayamos cumpliendo con ese programa que se inició en el día de nuestro Bautismo. Si hay plazo para que un artista entregue su obra, para que un profesora acabe una asignatura o para que un pesquero regrese a puerto también los cristianos tenemos un vencimiento para dar muestras de nuestro buen hacer, de que nuestra fe es sincera (no simbólica) y de que nuestras obras y nuestras palabras son un perfecto acorde.

Ha pasado el Señor y, lejos de mirarnos por encima de los hombros, nos mira frente a frente. Nos sienta a su mesa. Nos habla. Nos explica las escrituras y parte para nosotros lo más grande que tiene: su vida. Y cada eucaristía se presenta ahí para que le recibamos, somos conscientes de ese amor? De esa misericordia?, de esa oportunidad que tengo de adherirme a El y a su proyecto? Paz y Bien.
