NO TODO ES BONITO DESDE LA FE.

Ya hemos arrancado con nuestro camino hacia la vida Nueva, la Pascua, y al hacerlo, como Santiago, Pedro y Juan, necesitamos apartarnos por lo menos del ruido, superficialidad y “más de lo mismo” para prepararnos a la muerte y resurrección de Cristo. Sólo así, si lo hacemos así (eucaristía, oración, vigilia, caridad, contemplación) llegaremos a la Semana Santa con una actitud distinta: no es vacación sino devoción.

Mirar a nuestro alrededor es caer en la cuenta de muchos rostros desfigurados o deprimidos porque tal vez, hace tiempo, dejaron de sentir y de escuchar aquello de “tú eres mi hijo amado”.

De nuevo, en este segundo domingo de cuaresma, Jesús nos invita a reemprender el camino junto con El. No será una senda fácil ni de respuestas a la carta. Pero, como siempre, nos lanzará a la cruda realidad, ayudados de su mano y sobrecogidos si, de verdad, hemos intentado tener una experiencia profunda de Él y con El. A nadie nos gusta la cruz pesada; a ninguno nos seduce el final de un camino dibujado con el horizonte de las espinas o del dolor. Preferimos, y hasta echamos en falta, una vida más merengada y con éxitos, sin llantos ni pruebas, sin lamentos ni zancadillas, tranquila y sin sobresaltos. Todos sabemos...que no siempre es así. El anuncio de su pasión y muerte, por parte de Jesús, nos trae a la memoria la inquebrantable fe de los hombres y mujeres cristianos asesinados a lo largo de la historia, Ej Monseñor Romero en San Salvador.

El domingo pasado, Jesús en el desierto, nos recordaba que –la tentación- avanzará en paralelo con nosotros, pero que nunca nos faltará la fuerza de Dios para darle batalla y progresar hacia la victoria.

Hoy, con su Transfiguración, da un paso más: nos toma de su mano y nos lleva a un lugar tranquilo (por ejemplo la Eucaristía o la misma Palabra de Dios) para que nos vayamos configurando con El, meditemos sus enseñanzas o reconstruyamos de nuevo ese edificio espiritual y hasta corporal que las prisas, el agobio, el egoísmo, el individualismo y la superficialidad han demolido.

También nosotros somos testigos de la Resurrección de Cristo. No estamos en el monte Tabor como meros espectadores o marionetas. Nuestra presencia, aquí y ahora, en la oración o en los sacramentos, nos debe de empujar a ser algo más que simple adorno, en la misión o en el apostolado que llevamos entre manos. ¡Qué más quisiéramos, como Pedro, construir tiendas lejos del ruido y de los dramas de la humanidad! Pero, el Señor, si nos lleva a un lugar apartado, es para que comprendamos y entendamos que vivir en su presencia en esta vida, es un adelanto de lo que nos espera el día de mañana: la Gloria de Dios y el compromiso activo en el día a día.

Hoy, con el evangelio en la mano, podríamos preguntarnos si en algún momento (ante los amigos, enemigos, cercanos o lejanos) hemos dado firme testimonio de nuestra fe. O si, tal vez, por miedo al rechazo hemos preferido esconder la fe en el bolsillo como se hace con una tarjeta de crédito. La fe no es algo bonito (aunque tenga sus expresiones estéticas, artísticas y musicales). La fe es algo que, cuando uno lo lleva hasta sus últimas consecuencias no deja indiferente a nadie: ni al que la profesa ni al que la observa

SUBIR Y BAJAR: Quiero subir y bajar, Señor, contigo y contemplar, cara a cara, el Misterio de Dios que –estando escondido-habla, se manifiesta y te señala como Señor. Quiero subir y bajar: Ascender para contemplar tu gloria bajar para dar testimonio de ella en la vida de cada día en los hombres que nunca se encaminaron a la cima de la fe, al monte de la esperanza, a la montaña donde, Dios, siempre habla nunca defrauda y siempre dice... que nos ama. Quiero subir y bajar, Señor; que no me quede en el sentimentalismo vacío que no quede crucificado por una fe cómoda que no huya de la cruz de cada día. Que entienda, Señor, que para bajar es necesario, como Tú, subir primero: a la presencia de Dios, para vivirlo ante la voz de Dios, para escucharlo ante la fuerza de lo alto, para que la vida brille luego con el fulgor y el resplandor de la fe. Nos toca vivir nuestra fe con todo lo que viene con ella y afrontar la responsabilidad y el compromiso de CREER. Amen.

Testing Testing Testing

Often it can seem as if our faith is being tested. We can be asked, like Abraham, how much we are willing to sacrifice in obedience to God's call. Abraham appeared willing to sacrifice his most precious gift, his son, Isaac. Abraham went so far as to take the knife with which he could have ended his son's life. But God did not ask that of him. God asked only that he be willing and that he continue to listen. In Mark, it is the disciples who are tested to understand the vision that they are given of Jesus, visibly transformed from an ordinary man like themselves to beloved Son of God. Peter, impulsive Peter, speaks and plans an action. He is rebuked and told to listen. The test is not about action. The test is to listen.




