

***Third Sunday of Lent Reflection***







La salvación no está en venta

Este mundo es un mercado donde todo se compra y se vende. Los anuncios publicitarios nos informan continuamente de que podemos obtener todo lo que necesitamos y a buenos precios. Y tantas veces oímos el mensaje que terminamos creyéndolo. A pies juntillas. A veces pensamos que eso es típico de nuestra sociedad capitalista pero no es así. A lo largo de la historia siempre ha estado presente en la mentalidad de las personas, de una forma u otra, esa idea de que todo se puede comprar. Y, cómo no, esa idea también ha estado presente en la relación con Dios. A Dios también se le compra. Se supone que él tiene algo que ofrecernos y que nosotros le podemos dar algo a cambio. Todo se queda en un toma y daca. Quizá por eso los judíos habían terminado convirtiendo el templo en un mercado como cuenta el Evangelio de Juan. No sólo porque hubiese allí muchos cambistas y puestos donde se vendían las ofrendas para el templo, exvotos, recuerdos y cosas parecidas. Lo peor era la mentalidad de la gente que pensaba que ofrecer aquellas cosas era el precio que había que pagar para obtener el favor de Dios, aplacar su ira u obtener el perdón de los pecados. Frente a esa idea, las lecturas de este domingo lanzan un mensaje poderoso: nuestro Dios no está en venta, nuestro Dios no tiene un puesto en el mercado de la vida ofreciendo paz de conciencia o tranquilidad o salud o... Nuestro Dios no vende ni compra nada. Nuestro Dios es el que nos sacó de Egipto, el que nos liberó de la esclavitud. Ése es nuestro Dios. Dios es el que da la libertad, la vida y la salvación a los que vivían en la esclavitud y en la muerte. Sin pedir nada a cambio, sin pagar un precio previo. Su única condición: que vivamos la libertad, que no nos dejemos esclavizar por nada ni por nadie, que compartamos la vida. Podemos releer todas las normas que se dan en la primera lectura y veremos como todas ellas son liberadoras, todas invitan a la persona a vivir en solidaridad y en fraternidad, en libertad y respetando la libertad de los otros.

En Cuaresma, Dios se nos manifiesta como el que nos libera de la esclavitud, de todas las esclavitudes. Hasta de la muerte, que es la última de las esclavitudes. Así lo experimentaremos cuando celebremos la resurrección de Jesús en los días ya no lejanos de la Pascua. Y eso lo hace Dios por pura gracia, por puro amor nuestro. No hay precio que pagar, no hay condiciones previas. No tenemos que venir a la Iglesia como si fuera parte del precio de nuestra salvación. Dios nos ama porque sí. Y basta. En nosotros está el ser agradecidos por lo que nos regala y compartirlo con los que nos rodean. En nosotros está el amarle como él nos ama. En nosotros está el reconocer como Padre al que tanto nos ama .



SANTIFICA EL SÁBADO

No hay mejor forma de profundizar nuestras devociones de Cuaresma que repasar los Diez Mandamientos. Los primeros tres, los cuales se refieren a una buena relación con Dios, son más extensos. Quizás el que más nos cueste a nosotros, que siempre estamos tan ocupados, es santificar las fiestas refiriéndose al día del Señor. Si tomáramos este mandamiento literalmente, no cambiaríamos a los bebés, los platos quedarían en la mesa y quizás ni siquiera serviríamos las comidas. Como proclama "Los mandatos del Señor son rectos y alegran el corazón" . Nuestro descanso del domingo es un gran regalo que debemos recibir de Dios con alegría, no poniendo peros




