


**Food Drive TODAY**

Reflexiones del Padre. Carlos

Durante la Pascua, leemos muchos relatos de la presencia real de Jesús Resucitado en medio de las acciones de los Apóstoles y sus seguidores, pero sobre todo los que han creído en El como el Hijo de Dios, es que es Fe lo que se necesita y decir Yo creo que Este hombre es el Hijo de Dios y Ha resucitado.

Pedro acaba de curar al paralítico que estaba pidiendo limosna a la entrada del Templo. A continuación dirige unas palabras a los que han presenciado este hecho. La fe en Jesús resucitado tiene que ser testimoniada siempre con los hechos y, cuando sea oportuno, con la palabra. El signo y la palabra van siempre inseparablemente unidos en la actividad misionera de los apóstoles. El milagro ha sido realizado porque el enfermo tenía fe en el "nombre de Jesús". La fe es una condición indispensable para gozar de la vida en plenitud. Pedro da testimonio de que Dios no es un Dios lejano; es un Dios familiar, cercano: "el Dios de nuestros padres". A la salida del pueblo de Egipto se corresponde ahora la salida de Jesús de la muerte. Al pueblo lo liberó Dios; a Jesús lo resucita Dios. Pedro dice que el justo que ellos mataron, el autor de la vida, Dios lo resucitó. Comprende que ha sido por ignorancia, pero la ignorancia también es culpable cuando es vencible, por eso les anima a arrepentirse y convertirse para que se borren sus pecados. Es importante la conclusión a la que Pedro invita: cambio de mentalidad y de actuación como condición imprescindible para superar los condicionamientos injustos y las decisiones arbitrarias. Dios borra los pecados lo mismo que se borra una deuda. Dios perdona y no tiene en cuenta los pecados de aquellos que creen en Jesucristo.

Tener experiencia de Jesucristo resucitado. El evangelio de San Lucas de este domingo es la continuación de la aparición a los discípulos de Emaús. Ellos le reconocieron y volvieron a Jerusalén a contárselo a todos. Reconocieron que "era verdad, ha resucitado el Señor y se ha aparecido a Simón". Pedro fue de los primeros en reconocer al Señor resucitado después de las mujeres que fueron al sepulcro. No basta con que alguien hable de la resurrección, sino que es necesario tener experiencia del resucitado. Esta experiencia es personal e intransferible, poco a poco la van teniendo los discípulos. Cuando recibieron a los dos de Emaús estaban comentando lo que les había sucedido por el camino y cómo lo habían reconocido al partir el pan. Pero ahora Jesús toma de nuevo la iniciativa y se hace presente en medio de los discípulos. La insistencia en que le palpan las manos y los pies es porque quiere demostrarles que Él es el mismo que murió en la cruz. Muerte y resurrección van unidas. Se cumplen así las Escrituras: el Mesías padecerá, pero resucitará al tercer día. Lo del tercer día es porque para los judíos uno no estaba definitivamente muerto hasta que pasaban tres días del óbito. Así se aseguraban totalmente de que no enterraban a un ser vivo. Sólo entonces procedían a enterrarle definitivamente en el sepulcro.

Seamos testigos de Jesucristo resucitado. Jesús les pide a los discípulos, también a nosotros, que sean testigos de la resurrección, que anuncien la conversión y el perdón de los pecados, comenzando por Jerusalén. Testigo es aquél que no sólo ha visto o ha oído, sino que sobre todo ha experimentado algo que ha transformado su vida. Entonces no le queda más remedio que comunicarlo a todos. Podemos preguntarnos: ¿Cómo puedo ser testigo aquí y ahora de la experiencia de Cristo resucitado? En nuestro tiempo se necesitan testigos antes que maestros. La experiencia de fe no se transmite de memoria o por lo que hemos aprendido en los libros, sólo nuestro testimonio será creíble si lo que decimos lo hemos experimentado antes en nuestra vida. Es un mandato del Señor resucitado dar testimonio de nuestra fe.

Aun para nosotros hoy, Jesús sigue invitándonos a lo mismo, dar testimonio, ser testigos de la Resurrección y esto solo se hace con nuestra convicción, nuestro compromiso, amando y sirviendo a la Iglesia, defendiendo la presencia viva y presente en la Eucaristía, testimoniándola diariamente con nuestros actos. Dios ha resucitado a Jesús de entre los muertos y nos resucitará también a nosotros si creemos y le seguimos. Vivo y presente, actuando en medio de los demás. Paz y bien.

Mass Intentions at Our Lady of Guadalupe

Mass intentions refer to the particular purpose for which a specific Mass is "offered" (Catholicculture.org) This tradition is closely linked with the concept of "communion with the saints," that is, the [Catholic teaching](#) that all the faithful

(including us here on earth, our brothers and sisters who are already in heaven, and those who are in Purgatory) form one community.¹ When we ask a priest to offer a Mass for a deceased loved one, we do so as an expression of our belief in the communion of saints, as part of our acknowledgment that our loved one, although deceased, is still a member of the community of the faithful. Because it is ultimately an expression of communal faith in the Lord and in His promise of eternal life, the tradition of offering Masses for those who have died often brings some measure of comfort to the loved ones they left behind. Masses are offered for many reasons: in thanksgiving to God, for someone who is sick, in remembrance of a loved one's birthday or anniversary, and perhaps most frequently, in remembrance of a loved one who has passed away. 


