Fourth Sunday of Easter

What an extraordinary example we have in the person of Saint Peter. On this Good Shepherd Sunday it is fitting that the first reading draws our attention to the "rock." The scene depicted in the reading from the Acts of the Apostles contains an example that can be useful to all of us, whether ordained or lay. Notice that after the miracle of the curing of the crippled person, Peter immediately turns everyone's attention not to himself, but to the Lord Jesus Christ. This is what we are called to do when we experience the presence of God in the struggles of our own Christian journeys. Like Saint Peter, we can let other people know that it is only through the power of Christ within each of us that we are able to embrace the cross and experience the power of the Lord's resurrection. ROOTED IN BAPTISM Today gives us the opportunity to take the time to pray for those who lead us in ordained ministry. In this time of crisis in the Church, our bishops, deacons, and priests need our support as they continue to embrace their vocation to do as Saint Peter did-to point others to the Lord. Since all vocations are rooted in the sacrament of baptism, it is good for us to remember that it was at the moment of our baptism that we became Christ for others. Each of us is called to become more and more like the Good Shepherd as we learn to live out our baptismal call. As we make our way along the Christian journey, we need nourishment and guidance from those appointed to be our shepherds. We need to pray that God will strengthen those who have become weary. On this Good Shepherd Sunday, let us pray especially for the ordained and all those called to point us to the Lord.

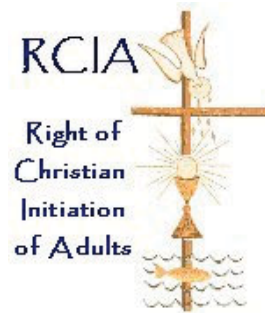
OLG Niland Education Fund Scholarship

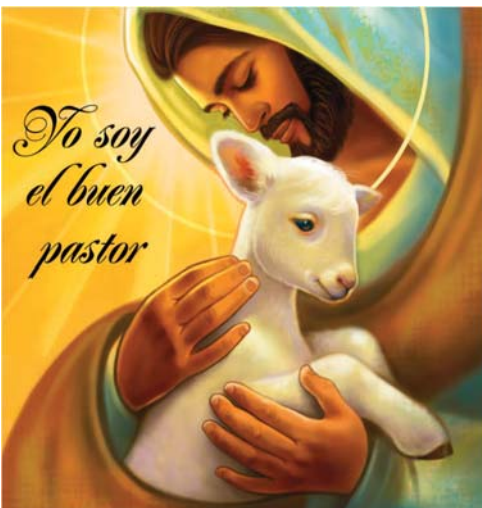
¡QUÉ BUENO CAMINAR CON EL SEÑOR!

Este cuarto domingo de pascua, llamado Domingo del BUEN PASTOR, tenemos esta imagen y experiencia tan bella de Jesús El, es el Buen Pastor. La imagen del Buen Pastor es muy querida por las primeras comunidades cristianas. El Buen Pastor “da la vida por las ovejas”. Sin haber cometido pecado sufre la pasión por nosotros, carga con nuestros pecados, sube al leño para curarnos. Nos defiende de todo peligro, no perecemos y nadie puede arrebatararnos de su mano. No hay otro guía que nos conduzca por verdes praderas y nos dé la vida eterna. Preguntémonos, ¿a quién seguimos?, ¿quién es nuestro pastor?, ¿qué voces seguimos? Pedro escuchó la Voz de Jesús y decidió seguirle. Ahora da testimonio valiente de Jesús ante el Consejo de ancianos. Actúa ya como pastor asumiendo la misión que le ha dado Jesucristo resucitado. Pedro recibió de Jesús la misión de apacentar las ovejas, el rebaño del Señor. En ningún otro existe la salvación, sólo en Jesucristo, el Resucitado, así concluye el discurso del apóstol Pedro. Desde entonces, esta misión le ha sido transmitida al papa, quien nos alienta cariñosamente a escuchar con alegría evangélica la voz de Cristo, que nos habla en el interior de nuestra persona. Hemos de caminar con la enseñanza del Papa y manifestar amor, respeto y unión a él como buen pastor en beneficio de toda la Iglesia y de todo el mundo.

“El Papa Francisco habla mucho de ser pastores con olor a oveja, este domingo, debemos recordar nuestra misión y compromiso para que haya más pastores y pastoras en la Iglesia que pastoreen el rebaño que Cristo apacentó y cuidó con esmero hasta dar su vida por ellos. ¿Quiénes? Pues nosotros mismos hoy y surge la gran necesidad de pensar en que hemos descuidado la oración por las vocaciones, es un compromiso de todos, de cada familia y la Iglesia, Orar por más pastores comprometidos en la Iglesia con la atención a los fieles.

Celebramos con la Iglesia universal la Jornada Mundial de Oración por las Vocaciones y, a la vez que oremos al Dueño de la mies que envíe nuevas vocaciones a su mies, nos sentimos responsables de la formación y el sostenimiento de quienes han respondido a la llamada en los territorios de misión. En Jesús se cumplen las promesas del pastor esperado, con características nuevas, según los signos de los tiempos, aquí y ahora: el mismo que curó al ciego, el mismo que sanó al leproso, el mismo que lloró a Lázaro, ese es Jesús, una razón, una esperanza, una noticia y una luz, quien se nos acerca y nos habla. La Iglesia es universal porque la fe puede predicarse en todas las culturas. Esto conlleva una gran riqueza, por las diversas manifestaciones de la fe en la pluralidad de aquellas. No obstante, siempre será fundamental la promoción de las vocaciones nativas, a fin de fortalecer la evangelización de cada cultura. Así, mediante personas hijas de su cultura, se manifiesta a Cristo, Buen Pastor, que camina cercano a las tradiciones y cambios de cada sociedad. Él estuvo junto a los suyos, “olía de verdad a oveja”.

Muchas pueden ser las experiencias con estos pastores, y podríamos mencionar a tantos que hacen tantas cosas en nombre de Jesucristo Resucitado y también podríamos criticar a otros por sus palabras o acciones, pero no olvidemos que este reto y compromiso debe pasar por todos, consagrados o no consagrados, recordemos que todos somos bautizados y que todos tenemos la misión en la Iglesia, no seamos de los que le dejamos todo al Papa, obispos, sacerdotes, religiosos, no, tomemos conciencia del compromiso que cada uno tiene en este proyecto de expandir el Reino de Dios por todo lado con nuestro ejemplo. Que Dios mande más hombres y mujeres a su Iglesia para ese compromiso de Salvación para todos. Paz y Bien.



SAN PEDRO: EJEMPLO PARA TODOS

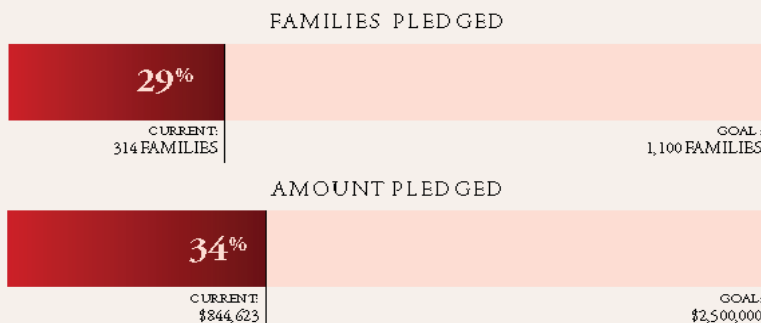
