


## *OLG Niland Education Fund Scholarship* \$1000 scholarship for a graduating 8<sup>th</sup> grader



#### ¡CARIDAD, ANTE TODO! ¿Qué es?

Un día un hombre del campo enseñaba a sembrar la tierra a su hijo, el joven le preguntaba, como lo hago papa? Y, el padre, le respondía: ¡excava más hondo! Cuanto más hondo el agujero, más posibilidades tendrá la planta de sobrevivir.

El evangelio de hoy, siguiendo las ideas del domingo pasado, nos invita a seguir bebiendo en esa fuente de vida y de amor que es Dios, a través de Jesús.

No hay mayor hazaña que la de entregarse olvidándose de uno mismo; el dar sin esperar nada a cambio; el ganar, aunque aparentemente ante el mundo estés perdiendo. ¿Dónde reside esta forma tan rara y tan extraña de amar perdiendo? Ni más ni menos que en Dios.

El Dios que se rebajó en Belén, el Dios que se inclinó en la tarde de Jueves Santo, el Dios que se humilló con brazos abiertos en la cruz, nos enseña que –ese camino- es el más privilegiado y el más idóneo para descubrir la verdad o la mentira de nuestra amistad con El; la grandeza o la pobreza de nuestra fe; el vasallaje a Dios o nuestro sometimiento al mundo que ensalza, no el amor gratuito, sino "tanto das, tanto recibes".

Hay amores eventuales. Amores que pasan. Amores que fracasan. Porque, cuando no son agradecidos, se cansan. El amor que predica Jesús, y que nosotros sostenemos con el paso del tiempo, es un amor que nunca se aburre. O por lo menos, cuando surgen tropiezos, se plantea de nuevo el levantarse para entregarse de nuevo aún a riesgo de perder de nuevo. Me gusta mucho la distinción entre solidaridad y caridad: la solidaridad sale al paso en un momento determinado. La caridad cristiana, por el contrario, siempre y sin límites.

El amor, cuando es excluyente, ansioso, ya no es amor. Produce asfixia, agotamiento y, a la larga, fracaso. Nuestro corazón, cuando está puesto en Dios, espontáneamente se ofrece a los demás. Cuando ponemos el amor humano, por encima del amor divino, corremos el riesgo de sufrir un serio revés. Dios lo primero y, desde Dios, a continuación lo demás.

El amor cristiano, que es distintivo de los seguidores de Jesús, nos hace ver a las personas como hermanos. O dándole la vuelta a la frase, porque nos vemos como hermanos, somos capaces de entregarnos los unos a los otros.

Impresiona la Carta de Juan. ¡Qué cerca tuvo que sentir el amor de Dios para decirnos "ámense"! Los anteojos que, los cristianos tendríamos que comprar en la óptica, es precisamente la de ver al prójimo con amor, de juzgarlo con amor, de quererlo con amor y de ayudarle a levantar con amor. Sólo así, al Dios del cielo, lo podremos distinguir verdaderamente en la tierra.

¿Quieren saber la calidad de vida cristiana de aquel hermano? Pregúntale cuánto ama; si ama a todos; si ama a todos horas.

¿Quieren saber el grado de amistad de Dios de aquel cristiano? Preguntadle cómo anda con los que le rodean; en el trabajo; en el barrio; en las relaciones personales.

Jesús se va al cielo pero, detrás de sí, nos deja a nosotros. Para que sigamos profundizando en todo lo que ha dicho y ha realizado. Para que, en el amor, entremos en comunión con El y con el resto de los hermanos.

AYÚDANOS, SEÑOR A ver en los hermanos, tu rostro, A volcarnos por amor, aunque recibamos abrojos A ser siervos, antes que dueños A ser vasallos, antes que reyes. AYÚDANOS, SEÑOR A conocerte, amando sin esperar nada a cambio A revelarte, por el amor que sembramos A anunciarte, con el amor que regalamos.



## Share In the Power

This Sunday is two weeks before Pentecost, but already the readings prepare us for that feast. The first

reading from Acts shows us the conversion of the Samaritans, thanks to Philip's preaching and curing the sick. He did this through the power of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit makes Jesus present today, not just in the sacraments, but through us, his disciples.

Jesus knew that after his Resurrection appearances, he would not be visible as a man. Instead, he would live in all of his followers through the power of the Holy Spirit. That's why he tells the disciples that the Spirit will be with them and in them. So confirmation, the laying on of hands (Acts 8:17), reminds us that when God lives in us, we share in the power of the Holy Spirit. In the second reading, Peter gives us practical advice. First, he tells us to be ready to explain our hope in the Lord. That hope comes from our faith in the Resurrection. When you hear that people saw and talked to Jesus after he rose from the dead, then hear that anyone who follows Jesus will share in that resurrection, you begin to have real hope. Next, Peter tells us to avoid sin, not because we won't be forgiven again, but to show that we can live a life free from sin, selfishness, and hatred. Freedom from sin allows us to give a good example of how to live. Abandoning selfishness allows us to love others without counting the cost. When we are free from hatred, we are able to forgive others as we have been forgiven. As we live in Jesus and he in us, our happiness will attract people to God.

# Month of Mary

#### May the Month of Mary

Traditionally, May is the month of Mary when we celebrate her unique place in salvation history. Because of God's initiative, through a young girl answering "Yes" to the unforeseen, the presence of God becomes vulnerable in human flesh. In the days of God's Old Testament people it was the Ark

of the Covenant that marked the presence of God. Now something new is happening: Mary of Nazareth is the tabernacle of God. Like all mothers, Mary give over her body and soul so that new life may be born. All mothers must wait for the gradual process that is happening within them, they must learn to let go of the child within them, they must not only nurture and protect the presence of the life within them but also foster its leaving. The act of childbirth is the painful act of letting go, so that the life within can take its own separate place in the life of the world. Mary's vocation is not only to hold Jesus within her, but also to let him go, to let him become the person he must be. Mary assists the struggle of God to be one like us. There is something dangerously new about Mary, the woman at the center of the Christian story. It is this woman, not a man, who brings God's real presence into the world. And through her the presence of the Redeemer will be known and celebrated
