

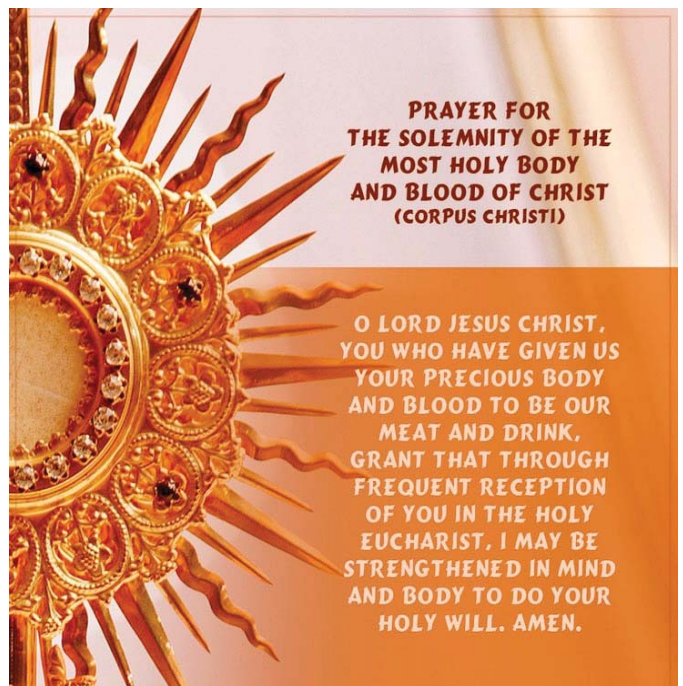
Did you Know?

O LORD JESUS CHRIST, YOU WHO HAVE GIVEN US YOUR PRECIOUS BODY AND BLOOD TO BE OUR MEAT AND DRINK, GRANT THAT THROUGH FREQUENT RECEPTION OF YOU IN THE HOLY EUCHARIST, I MAY BE STRENGTHENED IN MIND AND BODY TO DO YOUR HOLY WILL. AMEN.



CUERPO Y SANGRE DE CRISTO.

Hoy la Iglesia celebra al igual que todos los días, el gran misterio de la Eucaristía, Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo presentes en la asamblea que se reúne para celebrar su fe en Jesucristo el Hijo de Dios Altísimo que murió y Resucitó de entre los Muertos y que se nos da en Su Cuerpo y en su Sangre. La Sangre de la alianza, Los ritos antiguos de la Pascua judía hunden sus raíces en ritos aún más antiguos, aunque adquieren un sentido nuevo y prefiguran al mismo tiempo el sacrificio por excelencia, el sacrificio definitivo, el sacrificio de Cristo. La sangre ha sido siempre un elemento que ha estremecido al hombre, al mismo tiempo que ha visto en ella una fuerza misteriosa.

Al relacionarla con la alianza se pone el acento en la unidad. En cierto modo es una realidad que también hoy está en vigor. Y así se dice que los hermanos tienen la misma sangre, o se establece una especial relación entre quien da su sangre y el que la recibe. Así al participar los pactantes de la misma sangre se establecía entre ellos una estrecha unión.

LA SANGRE DE CRISTO.- El Misterio de la Redención alcanza cuotas muy altas en la Eucaristía. Hemos de recordarlo de modo especial hoy, día en que se celebra la gran fiesta del Corpus Christi, en la que los cristianos rendimos adoración al Santísimo Sacramento del altar, le tributamos el culto supremo a Jesús sacramentado. Él quiso derramar su sangre en sacrificio de expiación por nosotros. Antes esta realidad el autor sagrado exclama: "Si la sangre de los machos cabríos... tienen el poder de consagrar a los profanos, ¡cuánto más la sangre de Cristo que, en virtud del Espíritu eterno se ha ofrecido a Dios como sacrificio sin mancha, podrá purificar nuestra conciencia de las obras muertas, llevándonos al culto del Dios vivo!"... Sangre de Cristo, embriágame.

CRISTO, CORDERO DE DIOS.- Los ázimos es el nombre que recibían los panes preparados sin levadura, para comerlos durante los días de la Pascua. El pan de días anteriores, confeccionados con levadura, tenía que haberse consumido ya o ser destruido, pues se consideraba que la fermentación de la masa amasada era una especie de impureza, incompatible con la fiesta pascual.

Pero más importante que el pan ázimo era el cordero inmolado en esa fiesta. Se recordaba así la sangre de aquellos corderos con la cual se tiñeron los dinteles de las casas de los hebreos, librándolos así de la muerte... En la nueva fiesta pascual, en la Pascua cristiana, Jesucristo es el Cordero de Dios que quita el pecado del mundo, como lo recordamos antes de la comunión de su Cuerpo y su Sangre, Alma y Divinidad. En ese momento se nos recuerda, con palabras del Apocalipsis, que estamos invitados a la cena nupcial del Señor. Celebramos el cuerpo glorioso glorioso de Cristo es el cuerpo de Cristo resucitado; es realmente la persona de Cristo, tal como vive junto al Padre, después de haber resucitado. Es un cuerpo que ya no está sometido a las leyes físicas del tiempo y del espacio, ni de la carne, ni de la sangre, un cuerpo inmortal y glorioso. No resulta fácil a nuestros sentidos corporales, físicos y carnales, imaginar, ni entender, cómo es y cómo vive este cuerpo glorioso, por eso decimos en el mismo himno religioso que "la fe debe suplir el defecto de los sentidos". Pero para nosotros es suficiente con que cada vez que adoramos a Cristo en la Eucaristía sepamos y creamos que estamos adorando al mismo Cristo que vivió, murió y resucitó aquí en nuestra tierra, para redimirnos, para salvarnos y para enseñarnos el camino que debemos seguir para llegar hasta Dios, nuestro Padre. Es nuestra fe, más que nuestros sentidos corporales, la que debe alimentar nuestra unción y nuestro agradecimiento cada vez que adoramos al Cuerpo, a la persona de Cristo, en la eucaristía. No importa tanto lo que vemos, es fundamentalmente lo que creemos lo que debe dirigir nuestras celebraciones del cuerpo glorioso de Cristo. Es el cuerpo de Jesús que se parte y se reparte por nosotros.

La Eucaristía es "fuente y cima de toda la vida cristiana" (LG 11). En este día del Corpus Christi nuestros ojos se concentran totalmente en el núcleo de la custodia. En ella, ante el mundo, manifestamos públicamente que sólo el Señor es digno de ser adorado. Que, sólo el Señor, va por delante de nosotros indicándonos con su vida entregada, radicalmente sacrificada llamándonos a ser custodias del Amor Divino, pregoneros de su presencia, brazo prolongado de su inagotable caridad allá donde la Iglesia tenga que salir al paso de la pobreza y necesidades. Eucaristía, acción de Gracias, desde Nuestra FE, eso celebramos y nos espera cada día y especialmente cada domingo. Paz y Bien.

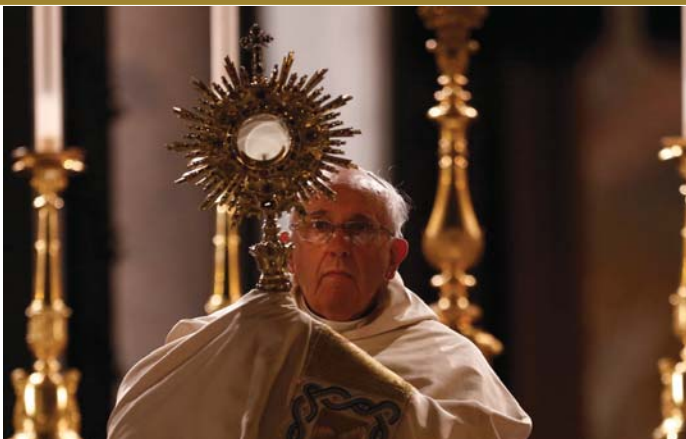
