### *The Feast of St. Anthony*

The Feast of St. Anthony is Wednesday – June 13<sup>th</sup>. St. Anthony of Padua is one of the Catholic Church's most popular saints. Saint Anthony of Padua, patron saint of lost and stolen articles, was a powerful Franciscan preacher and teacher. He's typically portrayed holding the child Jesus—or a lily—or a book—or all three—in his arms. Many people give alms to St. Anthony Bread in thanksgiving to God for blessings received through the prayers of St. Anthony.

St. Anthony of Padua's life is what every Christian's life is meant to be; a steady courage to face the ups and downs of life, the call to love and forgive, to be concerned for the needs of others, to deal with crisis great and small, and to have our feet solidly on the ground of total trusting love and dependence on God. ### *Father's Day Novena*

Jesus, our most loving Redeemer, came to enlighten the world with His teaching and example. It was His Will to spend the greater part of His life in humble obedience to Mary and Joseph in the poor home of Nazareth. In this way He sanctified that Family which was to be an example for all Christian families.

As the foster-father of Jesus, St. Joseph stands in close relation to the Son of God, the Fountain of all holiness. St. Joseph served Jesus with a singular love: one of great unselfishness, without any regard to self-interest, but not without sacrifices. He did not toil for himself, but he seemed to be an instrument intended for the benefit of others, to be put aside as soon as it had done its work, for he disappeared from the scene once the childhood of Jesus had passed.

## ***QUIENES SON MI MADRE Y MIS HERMANOS?***

Este domingo decimo del tiempo ordinario, celebramos con pasión y alegría, que Jesucristo es El Hijo de Dios y que para muchos incluyendo sus familiares estaba loco, fuera de sí. Ha perdido la cabeza y deben conternarlo volviéndolo a su casa y haciéndole reflexionar, para eso llevan a su madre con ellos. Y para los letrados de Jerusalén, Jesús está poseído de un demonio. Loco y endemoniado. Desquiciado y dominado por un mal espíritu. ¡Pobre Jesús! Se necesitaba mucha valentía y convicción para superar opiniones tan negativas de su propia familia y de los maestros de su pueblo. ¡Cómo quedarían de confundidos los discípulos después de escuchar comentarios de tal calibre sobre el Maestro que recién comenzaban a seguir!

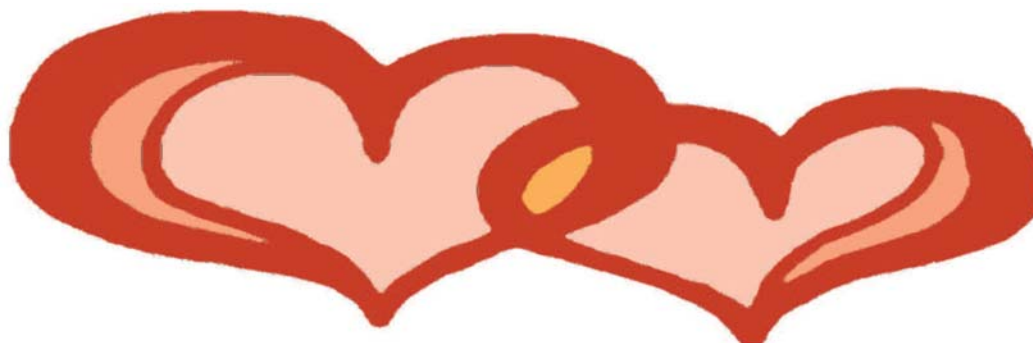
Jesús no pierde la serenidad. Enfrenta con firmeza profética a sus adversarios. A los escribas los desenmascara colocándolos delante de sus propias contradicciones. Si está poseído por un demonio ¿Cómo puede echar otro demonio? Si Satanás está contra Satanás significa que su reino está siendo destruido. Si una persona está siendo liberada por el poder de Jesús de la alienación a la que estaba sometida, ¿cómo pueden declarar a Jesús endemoniado, si el que aliena y domina es el demonio? Están luchando contra la evidencia de que Dios ha comenzado a actuar en la historia a través de Jesús. Están luchando para no ver, para cerrar los ojos a la verdad. Están luchando contra el Espíritu de Dios que libera y da vida. Ese pecado no puede ser perdonado porque es cerrazón a la gracia, es contumacia, es obstinación. No niegan a Dios, niegan que la práctica liberadora de Jesús sea de Dios. Y a su familia que lo tiene por desquiciado, Jesús agrega una nueva locura: declara que ese pequeño grupo de hombres y mujeres de Galilea, sentados a su alrededor, son más familia suya que la que lo busca. Esa nueva familia está comulgando con sus ideas y sus enseñanzas más que la otra.

Delante de este Jesús valiente y libre, debemos preguntarnos cuántas veces nosotros mismos que nos decimos cristianos, que nos decimos su comunidad, enmascaramos nuestras cobardías ante lo nuevo de Dios y nos refugiamos en poner etiquetas y descalificar lo que no queremos admitir: que donde hay liberación, más salud, más vida y dignidad está actuando el Espíritu de Dios.

Para nosotros cristianos de este siglo, que nos decimos creyentes, católicos, debemos preguntarnos muchas veces, ¿Vivo mi vida con convicción y valentía, como Jesús, o tengo miedo al qué dirán, me callo, no digo lo que pienso ni testimonio lo que creo...?

La libertad de Jesús le cuesta su vida, pero esa vida ofrecida en la Cruz por nosotros, tiene muchas vidas mas, la libertad debe practicarse para que nos hagamos libres, si no estaremos siempre anclados, amarrados a nuestros complejos, a nuestras comodidades, a nuestra forma estrecha de concebir lo que somos. Es por eso que hoy Jesús se libera aun de su familia de sangre y llama familia a todos los que quieran hacer la voluntad del Padre. La consigna de la libertad es de las pocas que son todavía capaces de conseguir que gentes de todas clases e ideologías salgan a la calle y se manifiesten en defensa del derecho sagrado de la libertad.

Pero ser libre sigue siendo una aventura difícil, un camino arriesgado. Significa asumir la responsabilidad de tomar las riendas de la propia vida. Implica asumir también los errores sin buscar excusas, sin echar la culpa a los otros. Eso es difícil. Eso cuesta. La primera lectura es un ejemplo clarísimo de que no se nace libre sino que se aprende a ser libre con esfuerzo. Adán y Eva no supieron asumir su propia responsabilidad. Lo único que hacen es echar la culpa a otro. El castigo le tocó a la serpiente porque ya no tenía a nadie a quien echar la culpa. Por el contrario, el Evangelio pone de manifiesto la soberana libertad de Jesús. Para defender su propia opción no tiene miedo a enfrentarse no sólo a la sociedad sino a su propia familia. Se siente libre de los lazos sociales y de los lazos familiares. Hasta tal punto que declara que su familia no es la de la sangre sino la de los que obedecen la voluntad de Dios. Y Dios no tiene otra voluntad que nuestra salvación y nuestra libertad. Porque “para ser libres nos liberó el Señor” (Ga 5,1). Esa libertad le llevó a Jesús al enfrentamiento con la sociedad de su tiempo. Le llevó a la muerte. Pero no renunció a ella por la vida. Jesús dijo con su vida aquello de “antes muerto que arrodillado”. Le pudieron quitar la vida pero no la libertad.
