Did You Know?

¿ NUESTRAS ACCIONES SIGNIFICAN ALGO PARA NUESTRO MUNDO?

Hoy los profetas siguen haciéndose presente en la acción de muchos hombres y mujeres que se dedican a la tarea de la evangelización, pero todavía hacen falta profetas auténticos. Al profeta Ezequiel se le otorga una investidura con una gran responsabilidad: predicar la palabra de Dios a un pueblo de cabeza dura que no quiere escucharla. La experiencia de la presencia de Dios fue para Ezequiel tan fuerte que cae en tierra, pero el espíritu lo levanta y lo mantiene en pie. El hombre recupera su verticalidad con la fuerza de Dios que lo lanza a la acción. Ezequiel, cuyo nombre significa "Dios es fuerte", va a necesitar toda esa fortaleza divina para cumplir su difícil misión. Pero antes necesita recibir el mensaje, digerirlo, asimilar todas las palabras que Dios quiere decir a su pueblo: Dios le ofrece un libro en el que están escritas, y Ezequiel lo come. Si nos alimentáramos nosotros de la palabra de Dios el mundo sabría que hay hombres que no se doblegan y que aún viven los profetas. El Señor sabe que no es fácil la misión que encomienda a su profeta. Por eso le desengaña claramente de cualquier ilusión sobre futuros éxitos. Pues el pueblo al que va a ser enviado es un pueblo de cabeza dura y rebelde, su historia es una cadena de falsedades e infidelidades al pacto con el que está unido a Yahvé. Sin embargo, estamos acostumbrados a creer que un profeta es alguien que adivina el futuro. No es fácil la labor del profeta, pues muchas veces es incomprendido y perseguido. Los falsos profetas se dejan alagar por el éxito o el poder. Son aquellos que dicen a los poderosos lo que quieren oír, o sea se ponen a su lado, evitan la denuncia para evitar también la incomodidad del desprecio y de la persecución. El verdadero profeta es aquél que dice palabras que arden, que pueden molestar, no busca la fama ni el éxito, ni los honores, sino sólo quiere ser fiel a la palabra que ha recibido de Dios. Profeta es el que denuncia la injusticia y el pecado, es el que anuncia la buena noticia. Dios presta su apoyo a Ezequiel y le dice que no se desanime, pues al final se cumplirán sus palabras. Ezequiel es el profeta de la esperanza. Todos reconocerán que "hubo un profeta en medio de ellos". Sin embargo, el éxito de la misión no es asunto del profeta y no debe preocuparle. Además, Dios le garantiza que todos tendrán que oírlo y, hagan o no hagan caso, todo el mundo sabrá que hay un profeta. Nadie puede reducir al silencio la palabra de Dios.

Nadie es profeta en su tierra. El rechazo de su propia gente, de sus parientes, solo porque su origen es humilde, el hijo de José el Carpintero, tiene diversos matices según los evangelistas. La reacción que presenta Marcos tiene un cierto tono de insulto. Le piden que haga en su pueblo los milagros realizados en otros lugares. El milagro se encuentra principalmente en la interpretación de un hecho como acción salvadora de Dios. Sin la fe de los testigos de una curación no puede haber milagro. En este caso, los actos de Jesús no fueron leídos desde una óptica de fe, y el milagro no fue posible. Jesús comentó amargamente: "Un profeta sólo en su patria, entre sus parientes y en su casa carece de prestigio". Esta frase se ha convertido en un dicho o un proverbio: nadie es profeta en su tierra. Pero esto es sólo una curiosidad. El pasaje evangélico nos lanza también una advertencia implícita que podemos resumir así: ¡atentos a no cometer el mismo error que cometieron los nazarenos! En cierto sentido, Jesús vuelve a su patria cada vez que su Evangelio es anunciado en los países que fueron, en un tiempo, la cuna del cristianismo. El episodio del Evangelio nos enseña algo importante. Jesús nos deja libres; propone, no impone sus dones. Aquel día, ante el rechazo de sus paisanos, Jesús no se abandonó a amenazas e inventos. Dios tiene mucho más respeto de nuestra libertad que la que tenemos nosotros mismos, los unos de la de los otros. Es importante que estemos atentos al paso de Jesús por nuestras vidas, lo podríamos ignorar o negar y efectivamente pasa mucho, pongámosle atención a sus signos.

Somos profetas. Hemos sido consagrados como tales en nuestro Bautismo. Ser profeta es anunciar la Palabra de Dios. Y nuestro bautismo se sella con el óleo del santo crisma, somos ungidos y eso nos hace a todos ser: SACERDOTES, PROFETAS Y REYES. Hoy hacen falta profetas que testimonien con su vida la verdad del Evangelio. Parece que hay un déficit de profetismo en nuestra Iglesia. ¿Dónde están los profetas?, es la pregunta que se hacía un cantautor en la letra de su composición, y es la pregunta que tenemos que hacernos todos nosotros. El Papa Francisco es uno de ellos ¿Hoy nosotros qué hacemos con Jesús, con su mensaje, y con su testamento de amor?

Jesús sigue siendo admirado por muchos. Jesús sigue siendo predicado en miles de iglesias. Jesús sigue siendo invocado por muchos y está en la boca de muchos hombres y mujeres, ¿pero en cuántos corazones está vivo? ¿Cuántos creen en Él? ¿Cuántos aman, sirven y viven como Él? Muchos piden el bautismo de Jesús, pocos lo piden para nacer al hombre nuevo que es Jesús. No basta admirar a Jesús, hay que creer en Él. Creer es seguirle y seguirle es transformarse en Jesús. Los paisanos de Jesús le rechazaron porque conocían muy bien a sus parientes. . . Nosotros rechazamos a la iglesia de Jesús porque conocemos muy bien sus pecados. . . Hemos de recuperar nuestro sentido profético, necesitamos personas que vayan abriendo camino y que nos den fuerza para caminar. No admires, cree. No critiques, edifica. No busques, ama. Así significaremos algo para nuestro mundo. Nuestras acciones deben ser significativas en medio de donde nos desarrollamos cada día. Paz y Bien.
