Hello from Fr. Paul...

I am looking forward to getting to know each of you, at least a little. I thought I'd say a few more words about myself, to help you get to know me better. I was originally born in Detroit, MI and moved to the South Bay after graduating from the University of Michigan, Dearborn, as an electrical engineer. I worked for Hughes Aircraft, and received a master's in electrical engineering from the University of Southern California. I worked as an engineer for ten years and was a parishioner of Our Lady of Guadalupe church co-leading the young adult group, playing bass in the 6:30PM Mass choir, and serving in the parish council. I was inspired by the friars ministering here and at Bishop Montgomery High school to enter the Conventual Franciscans. After my Novitiate year with the friars, I taught for two years (religion and physics) at Bishop Montgomery and then studied at the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley to receive a master's in divinity and was ordained to the priesthood in 1999. I then ministered for seventeen years at St. Paul of the Shipwreck in San Francisco, where my ministries included running a food pantry for ten years, and for eight years managing an after-school program offering sports, arts, meal and tutoring for boys and girls in the third through eighth grade, and working with other churches in efforts to reduce homelessness and crime in our neighborhood. For my last ten years there, I was the pastor ministering to a predominantly African American, Hispanic and Filipino congregation. Most recently, I've been the associate pastor at Our Lady of Grace Church in Castro Valley, CA and the Vocation Director for our Order for the last three years. I am passionate about teaching the faith, preaching and celebrating the sacraments. I have been learning more about the Pope's and Bishop's call for the Church in the United States to take on the "New Evangelization" and believe we are in a very exciting time of the church with much work to do in preaching and living the Gospel, both within the church walls and beyond them. I am excited about being here and continuing the good work of the many who have ministered here before me. Please take the time to say hello after the Sunday Masses where I will try to be present regularly.



La evangelización es nuestra misión solo por el

Hecho de ser bautizados , tenemos que predicar la conversión, echaban muchos demonios, ungían con aceite a muchos enfermos y los curaban. La predicación cristiana debe tener siempre estas dos dimensiones: predicar el evangelio, la Palabra de Dios, y hacer el bien a las personas a las que se predica. Así lo hacía Cristo y así lo hicieron todos los verdaderos profetas cristianos. Hablar es necesario, pero no es suficiente; las palabras deben estar siempre corroboradas con las obras. Si uno habla y habla, y lo que dice es verdad, pero sus acciones son contrarias a sus palabras, automáticamente está perdiendo credibilidad. Cristo predicaba a los enfermos y los curaba, hablaba a los pecadores, los acogía y los convertía, predicaba la humildad y la pobreza y él era pobre y humilde. Criticaba la hipocresía de fariseos y jefes del pueblo y él era sincero a carta cabal, anunciable el reino de Dios y él vivía ya dentro de ese reino. Si los cristianos del siglo XXI, además de predicar el evangelio lo cumpliéramos de verdad, el mundo nos vería como veían a los cristianos de los primeros siglos, con admiración y respeto. Las palabras hoy día están bastante devaluadas, porque nuestros gobernantes están acostumbrados a decirnos unas cosas y a hacer otras, y los grandes medios de comunicación son más servidores de quienes les pagan que de la verdad. En cambio, los más grandes santos de nuestro calendario cristiano fueron personas que sobresalieron tanto por sus hechos como por sus palabras. Hagamos nosotros lo mismo, si queremos ser cristianos de verdad hoy. Les encargó que llevaran para el camino un bastón y nada más, pero ni pan, ni alforja, ni dinero suelto en la faja. Es evidente que los tiempos han cambiado, pero el mensaje que nos transmiten estas palabras del evangelio sigue siendo válido para nosotros. Sobre todo, en estos tiempos de crisis económica los cristianos debemos ser sobrios y austeros en nuestros gastos y en nuestra vida en general. La pobreza no debemos entenderla como miseria y falta de lo necesario para vivir, sino como sobriedad y austерidad en nuestros gastos. Además de ser pobres en este sentido, la pobreza cristiana debe tener siempre una dimensión social; así lo predicaba siempre san Agustín con su palabra y con su ejemplo: en los monasterios agustinianos no había diferencia alguna económica entre los monjes, porque todo era de todos y lo que les sobraba lo daban a los pobres. San Agustín decía a sus fieles que lo que no necesitaban, los bienes superfluos, se lo dieran a los pobres, porque los bienes superfluos de los ricos son los bienes necesarios de los pobres.

El Señor me sacó de junto al rebaño y me dijo: "ve y profetiza a mi pueblo de Israel". El profeta Amós hizo una dura crítica social y religiosa contra el sacerdote Amasías y los que dirigían el santuario de Betel. Los dirigentes del santuario le pidieron al rey que lo expulse de su territorio porque está predicando contra ellos, pero Amós dice que a él lo ha enviado el Señor a predicar allí y que allí seguirá predicando. El ejemplo de Amós como profeta es un ejemplo que debe servirnos a todos, cuando prediquemos el evangelio. La obligación de todo predicador cristiano es ser fiel al evangelio, guste o no guste a los jefes religiosos o políticos. Aunque esto no haya sido siempre así en la historia de nuestra Iglesia, sí es verdad que así lo hicieron los mártires y muchos de los grandes santos del calendario cristiano. Hagámoslo así también nosotros.

Bendito sea Dios, Padre de nuestro Señor Jesucristo, que nos ha bendecido en la persona de Cristo con toda clase de bienes espirituales y celestiales. Este himno cristológico que aparece en la carta a los Efesios resume la fe de los cristianos de los primeros tiempos en Cristo Jesús. Vivamos nuestra vida Cristiana con pasión y entrega, recordando que Cristo ya nos salvó y nos bendijo para siempre. No lo echemos a perder . Bendiciones.



Did you Know?

Go beyond just saying "no" to teach children about polite exceptions. Rules about politeness seem to be in contradiction to the rules we teach children about avoiding predators and responding to behaviors that make them uncomfortable. It's important to expand on the idea of saying "no" when someone asks them to cross a boundary.

Explain that there are situations where being rude is acceptable, if that's what it takes, and help them understand that being polite has its limits. Plan ahead for safe, fun summer trips. Amusement parks are great places to make memories as a family, but it's important to plan ahead to maximize fun and keep everyone safe. Go over the family rules in advance, and refresh information on the way there. Make sure that everyone follows the buddy system, with at least two people together at all times. Pick a predetermined meet-up site in the event of separations, and show children where they can go for help (information desk, park security). Keep an eye out for any adults that may approach children, and stay on top of children's locations at all times.
