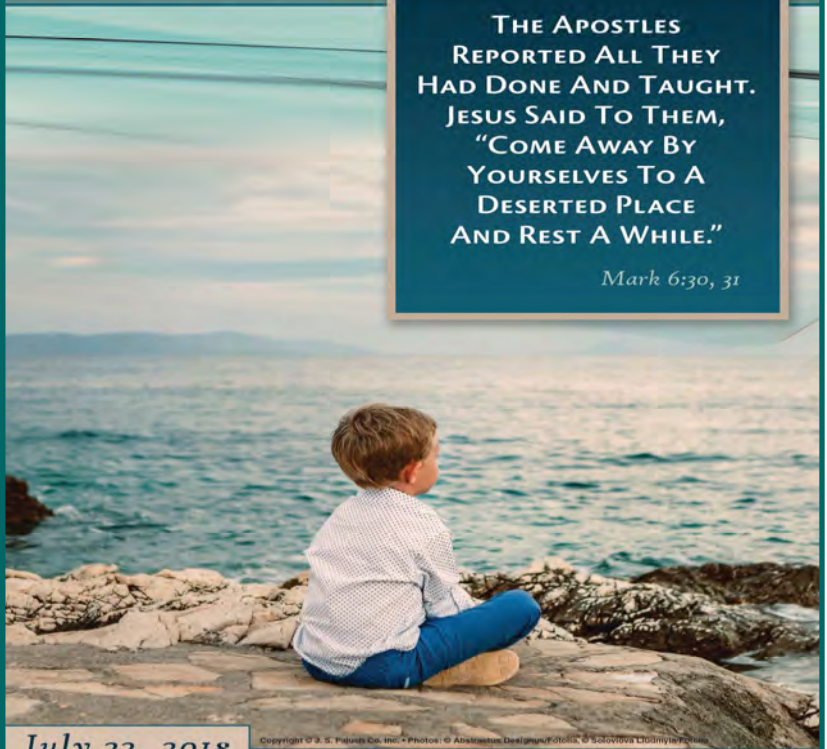

JESUS ES EL PASTOR DEJEMOS QUE EL NOS PASTOREE.

Los discípulos vuelven de la misión a la que Jesús les envió la semana pasada y “le contaron todo lo que habían hecho y enseñado”. Puede parecer demasiado simple, pero una buena manera de rezar, al final del día, es “contarle” a Jesús lo que hemos hecho, revisarlo con Él, ver si hemos sabido descubrirle y encontrarle en la vida y en las personas con las que hemos estado. Por eso me parece muy especial que Jesús reúna a sus discípulos para que le cuenten, para revisar como ha ido la misión.

- Por eso les dice: “vengan ustedes solos a un sitio tranquilo a descansar un poco”. Estamos en tiempo de “descanso”, aunque no para todos. Y es un tiempo que se puede dedicar a revisar como vamos. Pero el descanso a los discípulos les dura poco, porque la tarea continúa, porque el Reino de Dios no descansa, porque “el Señor no se va de vacaciones”. Por eso no podemos desaprovechar este tiempo de verano. Seguimos “conectados” a Él. Y Jesús también quiere estar con nosotros, y nos pregunta cómo nos va, qué nos preocupa.

- Porque Jesús es el PASTOR. Él se preocupa de nosotros, de cada uno y de todos. A Jesús se le conmueven las entrañas cuando llega con la barca y ve a toda aquella gente que le busca “porque andaban como ovejas sin pastor; y se puso a enseñarles con calma”. Aquella gente no tenía “pastor”, estaban desamparadas, abandonadas por los dirigentes del pueblo, que no cumplen su cometido. Y Jesús, acercándose a ellos, anuncia la Buena Noticia del Reino de

Dios y también denuncia la pasividad de los dirigentes..- Es como Jeremías en la primera lectura. La imagen del pastor y del rebaño es muy usada en el Antiguo Testamento para hablar de la relación de Dios con su pueblo, pero también se asocia la figura del pastor con los dirigentes políticos y religiosos. ¿Puede ser que nos esté pasando eso mismo también a nosotros, que nos sintamos abandonados por nuestros “dirigentes”, que nadie responda a nuestras inquietudes, a nuestras indignaciones, que estemos perdiendo la esperanza?

- Las palabras que Dios pronuncia a través del profeta Jeremías son esperanzadoras: “Yo mismo reuniré el resto de mis ovejas... les pondré pastores que las pastoreen... Suscitaré un vástago legítimo... hará justicia y derecho en la tierra... Y lo llamarán: El-Señor-nuestra-justicia”. El profeta, sin saberlo, está hablando de Jesús. Por eso Jesús tiene lástima de esa gente y muestra la compasión de Dios hacia ellos, hacia las ovejas desamparadas, a las que les promete un futuro diferente, un futuro en el que Él, el Buen Pastor, estará con ellas. Esa es nuestra esperanza, que Dios siempre estará con nosotros, de nuestra parte.

- Al celebrar la Eucaristía nos sentimos pastoreados por el único Pastor, Jesucristo. Él nos conduce hacia fuentes tranquilas y repara nuestras fuerzas (Salmo 22). Él, con su muerte en la Cruz, ha reconciliado a judíos y gentiles, a creyentes y no creyentes, ha formado un solo rebaño y nos pastorea con compasión, con misericordia y con amor. Que nuestra relación con las demás personas también sea así. Y que sepamos pedir a nuestros dirigentes que nos “pastoreen” respetando siempre la dignidad de cada persona, por encima de intereses económicos o de cualquier otro tipo.

Jesús nos invita a que conversemos con Él, “vengan, cuéntenme, eso nos dice” Amen.
