The Transitus of St. Francis is traditionally celebrated by Franciscans all over the world on October 3rd. This is the vigil of the Feast of St. Francis and is a night to commemorate the death of our beloved Saint. Transitus is a Latin word that means passage or crossing over. In every account written on the death of St. Francis, it is remembered that he crossed over from life on earth to eternal life with the Lord, full of great joy and song.

We will celebrate the Transitus (bi-lingual) at 7:00 pm. Please make an effort to join us if you are able to attend! Of course, attending Mass is the best way to celebrate both the life and death of St. Francis, but there are a few other things that you can do to honor St. Francis and take part in the Transitus in your own home:

2. St. Francis is the patron saint of animals and ecology. Spend some time picking up trash and cleaning up your neighborhood.

Baptisms at Our Lady of Guadalupe



As you prepare for the Baptism of your child, we, your parish community, offer you love and support. Together, we begin to undertake the

Christian upbringing of your child and offer you here the beginning steps in this lifelong journey of faith. Baptism is a commitment to living and sharing the life and values of Jesus Christ within the family of the Church. Since we cannot expect such a commitment from an infant, the Church looks to the faith of you, the parents, and godparents and to your active membership in the parish, as the basis for baptizing your child.

Before Requesting Baptism:

Parents need to be active worshipping members of Our Lady of Guadalupe attending weekly Mass and participating in the life of the community.

Parents and Godparents should attend a baptismal class that are held here at OLG on the 2nd Wednesday of every month at 7PM in the Parish Hall. If parents or Godparents cannot attend this class they may go to any church and attend a class and bring a certificate of completion to the baptism. Our Lady of Guadalupe offers baptism in English on the 3rd Sunday of every month at 1PM and in Spanish on the 2nd Sunday of every month at 1PM. Please call the parish office to request a baptism registration or for more information.

SER SERVIDOR DE TODOS!!

(El justo) se opone a nuestro modo de actuar (Sab 2, 12). Quien quiera ser el primero, que sea... el servidor de todos (Mc 9,35).

La invitación de siempre para todos, es volver a leer y pensar, meditar las escrituras de la misa, especialmente, hoy, Sabiduría (2, 12.18-20), ya que es un resumen de lo que acabamos de escuchar en el pasaje evangélico. Éste es un breve resumen de lo que nos dice el autor sobre lo que decían y pensaban llevar a cabo contra el justo los impíos: el justo nos resulta pesado..., se opone a nuestra conducta..., nos reprocha, nos reprende..., su sola presencia nos resulta insoportable... Por eso lo someteremos a ultrajes y torturas... Lo condenaremos a muerte ignominiosa. Veremos si aguanta, pues según dice, Dios lo salvará (Sab 2, 12-20). La Iglesia siempre vio en este pasaje la imagen del Cristo perseguido por quienes veían en sus palabras una condena de su conducta.

Pero no quedó ahí la acción de “los impíos”, sino que, a lo largo de la historia, se han repetido frecuentemente los mismos hechos, entendiendo también que “los justos”, quienes quiera que lo hayan sido por su ejemplaridad, haciendo suyas las palabras de Cristo, siempre constituyeron un estorbo para los planes perversos de “los impíos”. En efecto, el citado pasaje del libro de la Sabiduría y los hechos vividos por el propio Jesús de Nazaret han cobrado viva actualidad en múltiples ocasiones. Y es que siempre habrá justos que con su palabra y su vida dirán a “los impíos” no les es lícito; y, por tanto, serán llevados a los tribunales y serán condenados injustamente. ¡La historia “del justo” de Antiguo Testamento y de Cristo se ha repetido tantas veces hasta nuestros días!

Jesús ya ha habido hecho por primera vez el anuncio de su pasión, muerte y resurrección a los apóstoles días antes de lo hará ahora. Dicho anuncio había tenido lugar, precisamente, a continuación de la proclamación por parte de Pedro: Tú eres el Mesías (Mc 8, 29). Y, por lo mismo, Pedro no podía aceptar en modo alguno lo que les había dicho Jesús, actitud que le valió al apóstol una dura regañada por parte de Jesús y una llamada a todos sus seguidores: El que quiera venir en pos de mí, que se niegue a sí mismo, que cargue con su cruz y me siga (Mc 8, 44).

Dice el evangelista: Atravesaron la Galilea; no quería que nadie se enterase, porque iba instruyendo a sus discípulos. Les decía: El Hijo del Hombre va a ser entregado en manos de los hombres y lo matarán; y después de muerto, a los tres días resucitará (Mc 9, 31). Al parecer, no hubo reacción alguna por parte de los apóstoles; sí se nos dice que, al llegar a Cafarnaúm es Jesús el que les pregunta de qué discutían por el camino. Ellos callaban, pues por el camino habían discutido quién era en más importante (Mc 9 33). Claro que Jesús se había dado cuenta de eso; de ahí sus palabras: Quien quiera ser el primero que sea el último de todos y el servidor de todos (Mc 9, 35). En pequeño o en grande algo parecido puede pasar entre nosotros: deseamos triunfar, que nos aplaudan y admiren y acaso sea muy legítima esta aspiración; pero cuando esto significa pisotear a los demás y hacer caso omiso del “servicio a todos”, nuestra aspiración no es cristiana.

Concretamente, la exigencia de la servicialidad gratuita sólo podía reclamarla quien la hizo centro de su propia vida al afirmar: El Hijo del Hombre no ha venido a ser servido sino a servir y a dar la vida en rescate por muchos (Mt 20, 28). Actitud esta que quedará bien patente cuando en la última Cena Jesús se levantó de la mesa y se puso a lavarles los pies a sus apóstoles, acción que era exclusiva de los esclavos. Les he dado ejemplo para que lo que yo he hecho con ustedes, también ustedes lo hagan. El cristiano ha de ser siempre servidor de Cristo y de la comunidad; ésa es su gran vocación, y su gran dignidad está en servir a los hermanos. Oremos para terminar: Señor, enséñanos a servir siempre con amor. Enséñanos a pensar en los otros y a amar, sobre todo, a aquellos a los que nadie ama. Amén.

Registering in a parish is a declaration of your desire to be part of a Catholic community and a commitment to the life of the parish family. To so clearly state your Catholic commitment in all its dimensions brings you advantages, recognition, and responsibilities of many kinds. Being a registered parishioner makes things much easier when it is time for infant baptism, school registration, weddings, when asked to be a baptismal or confirmation sponsor, and even funerals. We are often asked to provide affidavits for baptismal and confirmation sponsors. We can only do this if a person is a registered, active, and contributing member in our parish. How do you know if you are already registered? A registered parishioner receives all parish mailings. So, are you a registered parishioner? If not, please consider registering. Registration forms are always available at the church office or you can call the office and have one emailed to you



Mass Intentions

When the Eucharist is celebrated (the Mass), the Church is gathered and united both earth and heaven. As we celebrate, we also pray for all the living, and the dead – our faithfully departed. We also have a tradition of praying for an individual who is either living or deceased. Requesting that a Mass be offered for an individual is a beautiful tradition. Many times we want to do something when someone is sick or has died. **Having a Mass offered** is a possibility and often is a source of **great comfort and peace**. When a Mass is requested normally one gives a stipend for the Mass. Today that stipend is normally \$10 but more can be given. In most Churches in USA, Mass stipends are used to run the parish. You are encouraged to join in this tradition. Requesting a Mass is easy – just drop by the office or contact Jodi. Jodi will try to accommodate you if there is a special date. She also will provide you with a **Mass Card** to send to the person or family for whom the Mass is being offered. This is a wonderful Catholic Tradition.
