## *A Word from Your Pastor, Fr. Paul*

### My First Year Plan

Having spent a few months here as your pastor, I've had a chance to look around. What I see is a very beautiful parish! There are many who are very faith filled and desiring to grow in their faith. There are many involved and serving. There are many very gifted people with much to share. There are many who want to be more involved. I am Blessed with a wonderful Associate Pastor, with a great staff, and a great school! We have young and older, new comers and long timers. I thank God for that, and I am inspired! So, I thought I'd share what I see as my goals and objectives for our first year together.

First, I'd like to continue to encourage everyone in the parish to not only regularly attend Mass, but also to spend time every day in personal prayer. I have been encouraging people to spend at least ten minutes a day in prayer. For a God who everyday gives us 24 hours, can we find ten minutes? So far, my homilies have tried to encourage a desire prayer, spiritual growth and receiving the sacraments. I've also suggested a few ways to pray, and I have begun a Prayer Workshops on the first Monday of every month, at 7PM in the church. We've established a podcast ([olgchurch.podbean.com](http://olgchurch.podbean.com)) with the homilies, and the first prayer workshop for those who were unable to attend. Please take some time to listen, and share these with others.

Second, I wish to form a parish council. This is essential to help establish a strategic plan for growth and to advise me in the pastoral ministry of the parish. Since one currently does not exist, I am asking my staff to suggest names. I will be contacting those persons and discussing with you the possibility of serving this way. I think the first pastoral council can also make plans for a more formal counsel. If you feel called to this ministry, please let me know.

Thirdly, we must focus on the ongoing Capital Campaign to add on to provide more meeting space for our Church and classroom space for our school. I am speaking at all the masses about this today and asking everyone to pledge what they can. If you are currently contributing, I do thank you very much! I have come to realize that this project is much needed, and we are close to being able to begin construction on our planned date of June 15, 2019.

Finally, I hope to simply continue to hear what you have to say to me, about your lives, your needs, how you see the parish, and how we can grow. I try to be available before or after all the Sunday Masses, and welcome anyone calling the office and making an appointment with me.

Thank You and May God Bless You and Your Families. Our Lady of Guadalupe, Pray for us.




## ***NO DEJEMOS QUE NADA NOS IMPIDA SEGUIR A JESUS.***

Continua Jesús llamando a muchos hombres y mujeres a la construcción de su Reino y hoy nos invita a nosotros sus siervos, esta llamada puede ser mediatizada o argumentada de muchas formas, pero, la salvación no tiene argumentos que la impidan El, (Jesús) mismo nos la dio con su muerte y resurrección. Pero nosotros tenemos que construirla con nuestros propios actos aquí en la tierra y de lo contrario la perderemos, nada puede ser más importante que Ella, (nuestra Salvación), por eso hoy podemos decir El dinero no es un valor. Es sabio aquél que encuentra la auténtica felicidad. Nos lo recuerda hoy el Libro de la Sabiduría. Sin embargo, hoy fácilmente se vincula la felicidad a la posesión frenética de bienes. Pero la experiencia nos dice que esto no es verdad, no es posible que los bienes materiales nos llenen del todo. Es verdad que para el judaísmo la riqueza es signo de la bendición de Dios y recompensa a la piedad. Sin embargo, las palabras de Jesús son un camino nuevo, que está en contradicción con las creencias aprendidas por el joven del evangelio desde su niñez sobre la relación entre piedad y felicidad. El Reino de Dios es la alternativa que Jesús propone para todo el que quiera ser cristiano. Se desarrolla en el presente y tendrá su culminación en el futuro. Este texto no es para quien quiera ser más perfecto. Jesús habla para todo el que quiera ser cristiano. No se es cristiano por cumplir los mandamientos. Lo específico del cristiano no se mueve en el campo de la ética, de los mandamientos, de la conciencia: éste es el campo común a todo ser humano. La salvación está al alcance de todo ser humano, con tal de que siga las normas de su conciencia. Según este texto, ser cristiano es vivir un modelo de vida distinto de los habituales. Entrar en el Reino de Dios, es decir en la alternativa que Jesús propone, es vivir un tipo de vida en el que el dinero no es un valor. Esto sólo es posible en la medida en que se descubre otro valor radical: Dios. El descubrimiento de Dios lleva a un modelo de vida fraternal, realmente nuevo. Pertener al Reino significa fundamentalmente haber descubierto a Dios. A Dios se le descubre sólo como Padre. Consecuentemente, los demás hombres son hermanos míos.

**El peligro de las riquezas.** Podemos suponer que este joven era un rico terrateniente. Le dice Jesús que cumpla los mandamientos. Da por sabido que el joven ya los conoce, y, a título de ejemplo, se limita a nombrar los que se refieren a los deberes con el prójimo. No se puede dudar de la sinceridad y de la honradez de este joven, que cumple efectivamente las normas generales de la Ley y no se contenta con ello. Por eso Jesús le mira con complacencia y con amor. Según la doctrina judía, el que daba limosna adquiría un tesoro en el cielo. Por lo tanto, la riqueza era una oportunidad para que un hombre piadoso y rico pudiese ganarse el cielo más fácilmente que los pobres. Pero Jesús propone a este joven que haga todas las limosnas a la vez y se haga a sí mismo pobre. Porque las riquezas para Jesús, lejos de ser una ayuda, son un estorbo para los que quieren entrar en el Reino de Dios. Nos separan de Dios y de los demás, nos convierten en personas autosuficientes, que no necesitan a Dios ni a los hermanos. Lo peor es que algunas riquezas han sido adquiridas injustamente....

Jesús nos invita a seguirle. Le dice al joven: "sigueme". Más allá del cumplimiento de los mandamientos, más allá de las obras de caridad o de limosnas, más allá, incluso, de la pobreza voluntaria, hay un camino, comienza el camino de Jesús y de los que le siguen. La pobreza es una condición necesaria para recorrer ese camino, pero no basta para recorrerlo. El voto de pobreza no sitúa a los religiosos en "estado de perfección" entre otras razones, porque la perfección cristiana no es un estado, sino una meta, una vocación y un camino que han de seguir todos los discípulos de Jesús. Sólo el cumplimiento de este camino, que es el seguimiento de Jesús, saca al hombre de casa y de sí mismo para que se encuentre consigo en Jesucristo y, por Jesucristo, con los hombres, sus hermanos, y con el Padre. Seguir a Jesús no es propiamente "imitarle", haciendo exactamente lo que él hizo, sino hacer lo que cada uno tiene que hacer, pero como lo hizo Jesús, esto es, viviendo para los demás. Todos los ideales de este joven rico se vienen abajo ante la dificultad de cumplir la condición necesaria. No tuvo valor para dejar las riquezas. Prefirió seguir el camino de los fariseos, que veían en las riquezas una señal de la propia justicia -un premio de Dios a los justos- y un medio para acrecentarla haciendo limosnas ¿No es esto lo que hacemos muchas veces nosotros? ¿No estamos ricos en dones y cualidades? ¿y no las ponemos al servicio de los demás? Pensemos lo que debo compartir para lograr mi salvación.
