Thanksgiving – Eucharistia!
Happy Thanksgiving from Fr. Paul

Let us give Eucharistia on this Thanksgiving Holiday. As you know, Eucharistia means Thanksgiving. Of all the names to give to the “Source and the Summit” of our Faith, the Church by the Holy Spirit chose Eucharistia. To be thankful, is a fundamental attitude that shapes what we see. I know that during these times, this life is pretty tough. Especially these days, many of us are suffering, here and throughout the world. The world today knows the highest numbers of refugees, and victims of slavery and human trafficking than ever before (and the list of our sufferings goes on and on). What can we really be grateful for? The answer is again found in the Eucharist. Jesus Christ, true man and true God, has entered into our suffering by His incarnation, life and death. By His resurrection, He has triumphed over our sin, suffering and death. He has brought to us, if we choose to accept it, eternal life. Moreover, He gives us eternal life that comes to its full power after our death, but even now in this life He has given us the down payment on that eternal life, the Holy Spirit (2 Cor 1:22). Jesus is still present by the Holy Spirit, in all who suffer, thus giving us hope and strength to perceive. As St. Paul tells us, “The suffering of this present times are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us.” (Rom 8:18).

An attitude of Thankfulness for all Jesus has done for us, will shape how we see our lives. If thankfulness can be the foundational attitude in which we view life, we will not suffer the things that drag us down such as; disappointment, shattered expectations, jealousy, bitterness and hate. We will instead enjoy the fruits of the Holy Spirit; “Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.” (Gal 5:22-23) May God Bless You during this Eucharistic Holiday that we call Thanksgiving!

CAMINEMOS GUIADOS POR LA ESPERANZA.

Estamos en la penúltima semana del año Litúrgico 2018 y empezaremos pronto, un nuevo año Litúrgico y con él un nuevo tiempo litúrgico, el Adviento. Al final el ambiente litúrgico se pone un poco apocalíptico, nos llama la atención a estar preparados, porque no sabemos cuándo será nuestro día, de reunirnos con Dios. Pero esto no es nada malo, al contrario, es la llamada a la Esperanza de la Salvación de la cual todos hemos sido involucrados con la muerte de Cristo en la Cruz y su Resurrección. La liturgia dominical coloca los textos bíblicos de una manera didáctica, de acuerdo con lo que la Iglesia quiere comunicar en su catequesis precisa, en un momento determinado. Asistimos al final del año litúrgico y, en cierto modo, es como un final de una larga etapa. Y guarda un cierto paralelismo con la idea que podemos tener del final de todo lo creado. El texto de Marcos narra las dificultades que sufrirá el mundo cuando se produzca la vuelta gloriosa de Jesús. Y eso es algo que tendrá que ocurrir porque Él lo ha dicho. Marcos no hace otra cosa que recoger sus palabras. Y aunque una cosa sea que sus argumentos –hoy concuerden con este final del calendario litúrgico, no podemos dejar de pensar que la Palabra de Jesús es verdadera y que, por tanto, en algún día, algunos hombres y mujeres serán testigos directos de los tiempos difíciles. Por eso no podemos tomarlas como algo lejano e increíble, como un reflejo de una historia antigua. Recordemos que Pablo de Tarso, en un momento, cuando escribe sus primeras cartas, cree firmemente que Jesús volverá antes de que el propio Pablo muera y que él mismo, junto con sus compañeros de fe, será arrebatado a la gloria tras el toque de la trompeta del ángel. Pablo comprendió que esa segunda venida iba para largo y se acomodó a la esperanza. En este caminar, no estamos solos. Avanzamos guiados por la Palabra de Dios. Fortalecidos por la Eucaristía. Impresionados cuando, de lleno, nos ponemos frente a Dios por la oración. Animados al saber que, cientos de miles de hermanos nuestros, creen, celebran, expresan y viven lo mismo que nosotros estamos creyendo, celebrando, expresando y viviendo en esta Eucaristía: la fe en Jesús muerto y resucitado. Eso sí, mientras nos encaminamos a ese momento, que Jesús nos indica en el Evangelio, lo último que podemos hacer es aguardar pasivamente y cómodamente sentados en la tierra. Un cristiano, y nosotros lo somos, hemos de vivir como nómadas. Haciendo del mundo que nos rodea una tienda más confortable, más habitable donde, además de Dios, puedan incorporarse –en nuestros esquemas, planteamientos, corazón, alma y vida- aquellas personas que, con un pequeño empujón, también podrían divisar, vivir y preparar ese horizonte del que nosotros somos sabedores. A punto de iniciar el Adviento y el año litúrgico 2019 no olvidemos que la esperanza de la salvación va unida con nuestros actos, por ejemplo “vestir al desnudo”. Nuestro mundo en estos momentos y en muchos lugares se encuentra totalmente despojado de valores espirituales. Parte de la gente que nos rodea se ha desposeído de una gran prenda que, durante siglos, ha sido el abrigo de la estructura de sus personas: la fe cristiana. Ojala seamos capaces, con motivo de este nuevo Año , de no olvidar a todos aquellos que –creyendo que están blindados y bien revestidos por el manto del mundo- tal vez necesitan que alguien les recuerde que cubiertos con la mano y de la mano del Señor las cosas se viven y se ven de otra manera. Animémonos a entrar en este espíritu de la esperanza, de la paz, de la salvación, y hagamos planes que incluyan nuevos momentos para la familia, especialmente, momentos de luz y de reconciliación. Paz y Bien, bendiciones.

GRACIAS A DIOS.

Paz y Bien y muchas bendiciones para todos y todas. Para la biblia y para la vida del Espíritu, y de acuerdo al ejemplo de nuestros mayores es de suma importancia el poder decir, GRACIAS: a los demás, pero sobretodo GRACIAS A DIOS POR TODO. 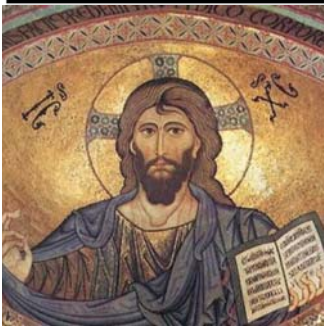

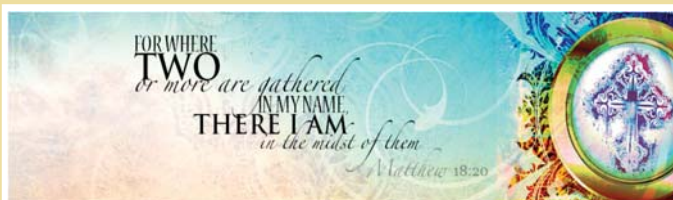

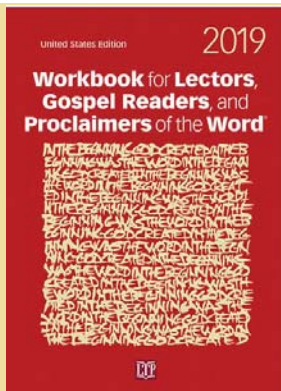
