Serve others; especially the lonely and the poor. Serve as individuals and serve together as families.

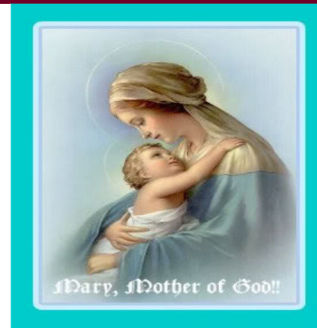
Volunteer more in church and in your community.

FAMILIA, HOGAR DE LA MISERICORDIA

Este domingo nos reúne un gran acontecimiento como siempre la Eucaristía, donde celebramos a La familia, Iglesia doméstica. Celebramos la Sagrada Familia, que nace del corazón de Cristo. Que cada familia se haga voz de cada hombre y mujer y sea un hogar donde sanar las heridas del corazón. Hagamos nuestro aquel lema que reflexionamos hace unos años, «Familia, hogar de la misericordia». Que la Sagrada Familia sea un punto de referencia en nuestros hogares. Que, poniendo en el centro el Evangelio, como Buena Noticia, la sepamos transmitir con alegría. Que esta celebración nos ayude y haga de nuestros hogares verdaderas Iglesias domésticas, y lugares de encuentro y misericordia. El amor es la base de la familia; el amor en palabras de San Pablo a los Colosenses, es el ceñidor de la unidad consumada. Del amor nacen la misericordia entrañable, la bondad, la humildad, la dulzura, la comprensión, todas las virtudes que adornan y sostienen la vida del matrimonio y la comunidad. Si falta el amor todo se derrumba. Pero, ¿qué es amar? No es "poseer" al otro, no es "utilizar" al otro, no es "servirse del otro". Amar es darse, entregarse, es una "auto donación" de tu propia vida. Es tener al otro como en un pedestal valorando todo lo bueno que tiene y disculpando sus defectos, ¿quién no los tiene? Algunos se empeñan en poner en crisis la institución familiar, sin darse cuenta de que si la familia se viene abajo se derrumba también la sociedad. Pero amor sigue reinando, a pesar de todo. Nazaret es la primera escuela de amor, donde empieza a entenderse la vida de Jesús. El contempló la actitud de sus padres y lo asumió. Hoy día la familia sigue siendo la primera escuela, donde el niño se impregna de los auténticos valores. Los niños son esponjas, que observan e imitan lo que hacen los padres. La familia, iglesia doméstica, es la primera escuela de educación en la fe, es donde se asume la actitud ante la sociedad y el prójimo. Cuando faltan estas experiencias fundamentales es el conjunto de la sociedad el que sufre la violencia y se vuelve, a su vez, generador de múltiples violencias. El consumismo, el individualismo, la incomunicación aunque decimos que nos comunicamos con nuestros medios modernos, pero esto nos hace mucho daño en el área de la comunicación familiar, la falta de madurez y de auto-entrega son los auténticos enemigos de la familia. Esto hace que muchas personas busquen únicamente su propio bien o interés personal, arrinconando a los ancianos porque estorban, retrasando la llegada de los hijos porque son una carga para "el disfrute de la vida". Puede que se paguen las consecuencias de esta actitud egoísta e inmadura. La familia de Nazaret pasó por muchas dificultades económicas y sociales, pero todo lo superó porque estaba cimentada en la roca firme del amor y de la confianza en Sigue triunfando el amor y nadie podrá detener la energía y el calor que irradia un hogar donde se vive de verdad la mutua entrega. El amor es algo más que un sentimiento. Así lo expresa esta parábola: “Un esposo fue a visitar a un sabio consejero y le dijo que ya no quería a su esposa que pensaba separarse. El sabio lo escuchó, lo miró a los ojos y solamente le dijo una palabra: "Ámala". Luego se calló. "Pero es que ya no siento nada por ella", insistió el esposo. "Ámala", respondió el sabio. Y ante el desconcierto del esposo, después de un oportuno silencio, el viejo sabio agregó lo siguiente: "Amar es una decisión, no un sentimiento. Amar es dedicación y entrega. Amar es un verbo que invita a la acción y el fruto de esa acción es el Amor. El Amor es un ejercicio de jardinería: arranca lo que hace daño, prepara el terreno, siembra, sé paciente, riega y cuida. Debes estar preparado porque habrá plagas, sequías y exceso de lluvias....más no por eso abandones tu jardín. Ama a tu pareja, es decir, acéptala, valórala, respétala, dale afecto y ternura, admírala y compréndela. Eso es todo: ¡Ámala!” Esta es una realidad en nuestro medio, no se lucha a veces por lo que se quiere y no se le cuida, amémonos y cuidémonos unos a otros, este es el plan familiar, amor, perdón, cuidado, atención, mirarse unos a otros. Hermanos cuidemos a la familia, es ahí donde Dios se gestó y se hizo hombre. Feliz Día a todas las familias y oremos unos por otros. Bendiciones. Paz y Bien.
