


Lent

EPIFANIA ES LA MANIFIESTACION DE DIOS A TODOS LOS HOMBRES

Hoy en ambiente de navidad celebramos la Epifanía es el otro nombre que recibe la Navidad. Es el nombre que le dieron las iglesias orientales desde el principio. Si la Navidad, fiesta de origen latino, alude al nacimiento: "La Palabra se hizo carne y acampó entre nosotros", Epifanía significa manifestación y sugiere la idea de alumbramiento o de dar a luz: "y hemos visto su gloria, gloria propia del Hijo del Padre, lleno de gracia y de verdad". Por consiguiente, la metáfora bíblica de esta fiesta es la luz: "la gloria del Señor que amanece sobre Jerusalén", "la revelación del misterio escondido", la estrella de los magos que vienen de oriente... Debemos esforzarnos para rescatar el auténtico significado de la fiesta que celebramos. Como tantas otras, y quizás más que ninguna esta fiesta, llamada equivocadamente día de Reyes ha sido mercantilizada y no valorada a nivel de nuestra salvación o vida espiritual.

Jesús nace en Belén para todos los hombres, para los de cerca y para los de lejos, para los judíos y para los gentiles, para los pastores y para los magos que vienen de oriente. No hay acepción de personas. Pero los primeros en recibirla van a ser los pobres, los pastores, para que se vea que "los pobres son evangelizados", como había dicho el profeta Isaías. Y, después, llegarán los magos guiados por una estrella y buscando su significado La estrella que nos conduce a todos, debe ser la que nos saca de casa, del acomodo en bienes y opiniones, de las certezas humanas, de la pretensión de poseer la verdad. Herodes interroga a los magos y termina persiguiendo a los niños inocentes. Los que se creen en posesión de la verdad lo único que hacen es enseñar "sus verdades" despóticamente al pueblo. Los magos no fueron a Belén cargados de razón, sino preocupados y encaminados por una pregunta. Se acercaron al pesebre de Belén para contemplar la verdad hecha carne.

¿Qué regalo espera Dios de nosotros? En un día de ilusión para los niños y de regalos para todos debemos hacernos esta pregunta. Dios acepta nuestra debilidad, lo que somos, nuestro pecado y nuestras fragilidades, para rehabilitarnos y hacernos plenamente felices. Quiere que descarguemos ante él las pesadas cargas que nos impiden ser nosotros mismos. Alguien me contó un cuento de Navidad que leyó en alguna parte. Lo contaré a continuación porque realiza un hermoso viaje al corazón de Jesús Niño.

"Se dice que, cuando los pastores se alejaron y la quietud volvió, el niño del pesebre levantó la cabeza y miró la puerta entreabierta. Un muchacho joven, tímido, estaba allí, temblando y temeroso.

Acércate- le dijo Jesús- ¿Por qué tienes miedo? No me atrevo... no tengo nada para darte. Me gustaría que me des un regalo – dijo el recién nacido. El pequeño intruso enrojeció de vergüenza y balbuceó: De verdad no tengo nada... nada es mío, si tuviera algo, algo mío, te lo daría... mira. Y buscando en los bolsillos de su pantalón andrajoso, sacó una hoja de cuchillo herrumbrada que había encontrado. Es todo lo que tengo, si la quieres, te la doy...- No - contestó Jesús-guárdala. Querría que me dieras otra cosa. Me gustaría que me hicieras tres regalos. Con gusto – dijo el muchacho- pero... ¿qué? Ofrécmelo el último de tus dibujos. El chico, cohibido, enrojeció. Se acercó al pesebre y, para impedir que María y José lo oyieran, murmuró algo al oído del Niño Jesús:- No puedo... mi dibujo es horrible... ¡nadie quiere mirarlo...! Justamente, por eso lo quiero... siempre tienes que ofrecerme lo que los demás rechazan y lo que no les gusta de ti. Además quisiera que me dieras tu plato.- Pero... ¡lo rompí esta mañana! tartamudeó el chiquillo.- Por eso lo quiero... Debes ofrecerme siempre lo que está quebrado en tu vida, yo quiero arreglarlo... Y ahora –insistió Jesús- repíteme la respuesta que le diste a tus padres cuando te preguntaron cómo habías roto el plato. El rostro del muchacho se ensombreció, bajó la cabeza. Avergonzado, y, tristemente, murmuró: Les mentí... Di je que el plato se me cayó de las manos, pero no era cierto... ¡estaba enojado y lo tiré con rabia!- Eso es lo que quería oírte decir –dijo Jesús- Dame siempre lo que hay de malo en tu vida, tus mentiras, tus calumnias, tus cobardías, tus crueldades. Yo voy a descargarte de ellas... No tienes necesidad de guardarlas... Quiero que seas feliz y siempre voy a perdonarte tus faltas. A partir de hoy me gustaría que vinieras todos los días a mi casa"

Pareciera fácil, claro y lo es, siempre y cuando avancemos en vivir su Amor y su Misericordia por mí, por ti, todos. Feliz Día de la manifestación de Dios en sus vidas. Paz y bien.
