The Waters of Baptism
When new sod is put in, it needs constant saturation with water. Landscapers say that this “knits” the sod to the soil. The same when a branch is grafted onto a tree: the poultice that joins them at the splice must be kept wet at all times. Water is the stuff that binds the very cells of our bodies together. No wonder religions throughout all times

and cultures have used it so prominently. When Jesus stepped into the Jordan for baptism, he “knit” himself to what had come before him. By going to the Jordan, he made himself one with the people of Israel who had crossed it into their Promised Land. With John the Baptist, Christ wove himself into the prophetic tradition that heralded the coming reign of God. He had become fully human in the waters of Mary’s womb, and by partaking in the rite of the baptism of repentance, Jesus identified himself with our sinful, frail humanity. It is through the waters of baptism that Christ continues to graft new members onto his Body, the Church; through these waters we are cleansed from sin and filled with the promise of grace, given our destiny for eternal life. For us, as for Jesus, it is also the waters of baptism that inaugurate our mission to proclaim the Good News.

Mass Intentions at Our Lady of Guadalupe

Mass intentions refer to the particular purpose for which a specific Mass is offered.” (Catholicculture.org) This tradition is closely linked with the concept of “communion with the saints,” that is, the [Catholic teaching](#) that all the faithful (including us here on earth, our brothers and sisters who are already in heaven, and those who are in Purgatory) form one community.¹ When we ask a priest to offer a Mass for a deceased loved one, we do so as an expression of our belief in the communion of saints, as part of our acknowledgment that our loved one, although deceased, is still a member of the community of the faithful. Because it is ultimately an expression of communal faith in the Lord and in His promise of eternal life, the tradition of offering Masses for those who have died often brings some measure of comfort to the loved ones they left behind. Masses are offered for many reasons: in thanksgiving to God, for someone who is sick, in remembrance of a loved one’s birthday or anniversary, and perhaps most frequently, in remembrance of a loved one who has passed away. NUESTRO BAUTISMO ES UN COMPROMISO.

Hoy celebramos el bautismo del Señor y con esta fiesta terminamos el tiempo de navidad, y comenzamos el tiempo ordinario. Por fin hemos visto al Señor, a Dios, eso fue lo que ocurre con el nacimiento de Cristo y hoy veremos a Jesús en su ministerio Público como adulto. Dios nos invita a fijar nuestros ojos en su elegido, en el amado, en el Mesías. Por fin se ha corrido el velo, se nos ha revelado hasta el límite máximo que se podía Dios revelar. Estamos en el tiempo de la Epifanía, de la manifestación, de la revelación.

"Yo, el Señor, te he llamado con justicia, te he tomado de la mano, te he formado y te he hecho alianza de un pueblo, luz de las naciones. Para que abras los ojos de los ciegos, saques a los cautivos de la prisión, y de la mazmorra a los que habitan en las tinieblas". Tú, Jesús, eres la más perfecta teofanía, la mejor revelación de Dios, la expresión perfecta del infinito amor del Padre. Abre nuestros ciegos ojos para que podamos ver el resplandor de la luz de Dios, libéranos de nuestra torpe esclavitud, sácanos de la profunda mazmorra de nuestro egoísmo y de nuestra mezquindad.

"No gritará, no clamará, no voceará por las calles", sigue diciendo Isaías (Is 42, 2). Gran contraste con los poderosos del mundo que gritan, se encuentran con derecho para dar voces, hablan con malos modos a los que están por debajo de ellos. Se valen de mil resortes para hacerse oír. Y a través de la tierra, del mar y del aire llegan sus voces potentes, sus noticias, sus vanos discursos, sus ideas sucias.

Tanto gritan, que tan sólo ellos se oyen, dando la impresión de que sólo ellos existen. Y hacen creer a la muchedumbre, a la pobre gente de siempre, que todo es del color oscuro e irritante con que ellos ven las cosas... Pero no es así. Hay mucho silencio en los mil rincones de la tierra. Silencio de los que trabajan honradamente, de los oprimidos que no pueden hablar, silencio de los humildes, de los sencillos, de los simplemente buenos, de los que no han recibido nunca el aplauso de los hombres.

Danos oídos, Señor, para saber escuchar el silencio, para saber captar el mensaje de los que callan, intuir esas vidas heroicas y escondidas que se desgranan, minuto a minuto, en el cumplimiento del deber de cada día. Y haznos también amantes de ese silencio, de ese camino sin brillo de lo ordinario, de la perseverante entrega con desinterés y generosidad al servicio de los demás.

ALMA SACERDOTAL.- Según las creencias judías, cuando llegara el Mesías, el pueblo sería purificado con un bautismo peculiar. Ya Ezequiel había hablado en nombre de Yahvé para prometer un agua limpia y un Espíritu nuevo, que vendría sobre los hombres cuando llegase el que tenía que venir. Entonces una época distinta iniciaría los tiempos gozosos de la salvación mesiánica. Les cambiaré el corazón, dice también el libro de Ezequiel. En lugar del que tienen, duro como la piedra, os daré un corazón de carne. Así será posible para el hombre cumplir con la ley divina, que se resume en la caridad, en un limpio y encendido amor.

Por esa creencia acerca del bautismo mesiánico, la gente de Israel pensaba que Juan podría ser el Esperado. Pero el Bautista confiesa abiertamente que él no es el Mesías, y que su bautismo es sólo un anticipo y una figura de ese otro bautismo que Cristo instituiría para la salvación del hombre. El bautismo de Juan era sólo en agua, servía para preparar el alma al encuentro del Señor, despertando en ella su conciencia de pecado, pero no borrándolo. Era una preparación más bien externa, sin limpiar radicalmente la culpa y la mancha que todo pecado, también el original, graba sobre el hombre.

Él los bautizará con Espíritu Santo y fuego, proclama el Precursor de Cristo. El Señor habló también de ese bautismo al decir que era preciso renacer por el agua y el Espíritu para poder entrar en el Reino de los cielos. Por eso cuando envía a los apóstoles a predicar el Evangelio a todo el mundo, les encarga además que bauticen a quienes crean en él. De ese modo, el hombre queda limpio de todo pecado, también del pecado original. Es una purificación radical que permite de nuevo la amistad con el Señor. Más aún, por el bautismo el hombre pasa a ser hijo de Dios, participa de la gracia, de la misma vida divina, se identifica en cierto modo con Cristo.

El bautismo nos hace agradables a los ojos del Señor. Nuestra existencia adquiere desde ese momento una dimensión nueva, todo nuestro ser y nuestro actuar es para Dios algo meritorio y agradable. El que está en gracia hace de su vida, hasta en los detalles más insignificantes, una ofrenda grata al Señor. El alma del cristiano se transforma por el bautismo en alma sacerdotal. Gracias a eso, todo cuanto haga, el trabajo y el descanso, el sufrimiento y el gozo, se transforma en un culto hecho a Dios en Espíritu y verdad. Es nuestro Compromiso dado con la gracia de Dios. Paz y Bien.
