

Wednesday. Do you have a plan for this Lent? Do you have a good Penitential practice for yourself and your family?

Remember the three pillars of Lent are PRAYER – FASTING – ALMS GIVING. We will do several actions as a parish during Lent. It is highly recommended that all parishioners use the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Lent. It is good for the Soul, especially an honest examination of our conscious –

- where am I at in my life and in my commitments

- where do I need to grow in Love.

- *Prayer* taking time, every day for reflection, reading scripture, meditation, time with the Eucharist or one of the many other forms of prayer.
- ✤ *Fasting* traditionally food was central to this but there are many other ways of fasting – TV, the computer, Facebook, tobacco, alcohol, etc.
- Alms Giving helping others whether it be our time, talent or treasure. Doing the good that we can do, especially for the poor, each day.

Once again this year, we will be distributing Lenten Folders and Lenten Offering Cans. As in the previous years, your Lenten sacrifices are used to help the poor in Mission territories. Please use them each day as families and individuals to remind us of our need to care for the poor.



Tuesday Adoration

Lent is only a few days away. Instead of giving up something for Lent, how about coming to church on Tuesday's to spend some time with our Lord? Adoration of the Blessed

Sacrament has been a tradition of the Catholic Church since the middle ages. It is an opportunity to converse with the Lord in a most intimate way. Adoration is where a consecrated host is place in the monstrance (Latin for "showpiece") and set upon the Altar for all to venerate. Often time, the adoration time is present with the Blessed Sacrament. The Adoration time is 4PM – 7PM every Tuesday in the Church.

HERMOSA BEACH, CALIFORNIA

An Update on our Capital Campaign

Greetings and Peace. I want to take the time to thank all who have donated to our capital campaign. We are making good progress because of your generous response. I want to also update you on the latest. The project was approved unanimously by the Hermosa Beach Building Commission. The Archdiocese of Los Angeles has also approved the next phase of the project, to do detailed design documents. These should be done at the end of April, at which time we can send them out to get an actual cost. Based on that actual cost, and our fundraising at that time, the Archdiocese will then decide if we can go ahead and begin construction. To date we've raised nearly \$2.4 Million in cash and pledges. This means we have only \$600,000 yet to go. Many have donated so far, but we've come this far with only about 33% of our families (combined in both church and school) participating.

Given that we are spending well over \$100,000 on the detailed design documents, we really don't want to fall short of our goal of \$3 Million, and not receive approval to begin construction this summer. Now is the time when we really need everyone's <u>help.</u> As pastor I really want all our parish families to be able to look at the new additions and be reminded that we all did this together. I ask every family to donate something, as much as you prayerfully discern, to this project. Let's have 100% participation! At this time, we need pledges to be paid anytime over the next five years. If every family not yet participating were to donate \$1 per day (that is a pledge of almost \$2,000 over the next 5 years) we would easily meet our remaining goal! Let us each help to the extent one is able, and together let us Build our Faith, and our church and school!

Please recall that this project not only brings a new STEM lab, office and meeting space for the school, but includes much space to be shared between church and school; the new Arts/Music room, new gathering space outside our church entrance, a renovation of our gazebo area, and also includes new dedicated ministry space for the church (in the area where the school offices currently are). It is a much -needed project benefitting our ONE Community of both church and school. If you have questions, please call me.

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CUARESMA: EN EL HORIZONTE DE LA PASCUA

Este domingo es el VIII del tiempo Ordinario, con la particularidad que el miércoles, será, miércoles de ceniza y con esto comenzamos la cuaresma del año 2019. Las lecturas de este domingo con cierta sabiduría antigua, múltiples veces contrastada por la experiencia, se recoge hoy en los breves versículos que se proclaman en la liturgia, procedentes del libro del Eclesiástico. Se ha de reconocer que, repetidamente, el desarrollo de la vida ofrece ocasiones para evidenciar si se poseen los valores auténticos y poder diversificarlos de los que lo son tan solo en apariencia. El fruto puede ofrecer por fuera signos de buena salud, pero, en ocasiones, esta apreciación cae por tierra apenas se intenta consumirlo. Las situaciones difíciles confirman si la aparente fragilidad de la arcilla es capaz de endurecerse a fuego y convertirse así en vasija resistente. El trato criba los actos humanos y pone de manifiesto, en el roce diario, si la mies trillada o cernida desprende el preciado grano o, por el contrario, todo se resuelve en paja y tamo que se lo lleva el viento. En términos equivalentes, puede expresarse cuanto pide la Palabra de Dios en el Evangelio de este domingo (Lc 6, 39-45): es preciso lanzarse a velas desplegadas a la conquista de lo auténtico, lo real, lo bueno y lo verdadero. Constituye un compromiso adquirido desde la iniciación en la fe. Tenemos prometido que lo corruptible se vestirá de inmortalidad y la muerte será absorbida por la victoria.

Comenzamos la Santa Cuaresma. Este tiempo no es un fin y, sí en cambio, un camino. Su máxima y su cometido están en empujarnos y prepararnos a la gran fiesta de la Pascua.

Si la Semana Santa queremos que impacte en nosotros hemos de procurar hacer de estas semanas una sensibilización para vivir lo que nos espera en el horizonte de Jerusalén, en la mesa del Cenáculo, en el monte del Gólgota o detrás de la roca desplazada del sepulcro en la mañana de la Pascua. Todo acontecimiento reseñable merece una preparación no menos importante.

No podemos quedarnos, como aquellos turistas, mirando al faro que destellaba luz pero sin percatarse de que, a sus espaldas, tenían el mar. La Cuaresma es esa posibilidad que Dios nos ofrece para que, a través de su Palabra, de la Conversión y de la penitencia, de la oración y de las obras de caridad trabajemos un buen terreno en el corazón y en el alma de cada uno para que Jesús no pase de largo.

No podemos conformarnos con el rito mágico de la ceniza y obviar el mensaje del evangelio: jconviértete y cree en el evangelio! No es suficiente buscar, con el dedo, un rastro de ceniza en nuestra frente y no ahondar en el corazón para ver en qué tengo que cambiar.

No es de recibo levantar la mano hasta el cabello para comprobar si el sacerdote nos ha impuesto abundancia de ceniza y no elevarla ante situaciones de desamparo o en aquellas otras de urgente necesidad que salen a nuestro paso.

La cuaresma, con el miércoles de ceniza como arranque, es un tiempo con doble movimiento: hacia Dios y hacia el hermano: Hacia Dios, porque necesitamos de su presencia. Por eso hemos de intensificar nuestra asistencia a la eucaristía o nuestra búsqueda de espacios de silencio en una iglesia abierta.

Hacia el hermano. Si Dios bajó a la tierra (por su Encarnación en María) en la persona de Jesús, no fue solamente para recordarnos que existía un cielo sino que, además, somos hermanos y que el espíritu de las bienaventuranzas ha de marcar el itinerario de nuestra existencia. Si DIOS dio tan gran salto vertiginoso ¿no podríamos nosotros dar alguno, aunque fuera más pequeño, de una vida mediocre a una existencia mejor?

La cuaresma, en ese sentido, nos puede ayudar a usar el metro con nosotros mismos antes que utilizar el metro y medio con los demás. La ceniza es quemar la hojarasca y el artificio para que Dios pueda de verdad hacer obras grandes en nosotros. La cuaresma, y por eso no tiene más brillo que el conducirnos a la Pascua, es ese ejercicio de salud mental, espiritual y hasta física que todos cristianos tendríamos que realizar para vivir y contemplar en toda su intensidad el culmen y la vida de Jesús de Nazaret: su pasión, muerte y resurrección. Busquemos con Esperanza y Alegría esta salvación, ya fue dada, no la perdamos, renovémosla y cuidémosla. Amen.

THE EIGHT SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. In addition, all Catholics 14 years old and older must abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays

of Lent. Fasting as explained by the U.S. bishops means partaking of only one full meal. Some food (not equaling another full meal) is permitted at breakfast and around midday or in the evening—depending on when a person chooses to eat the main or full meal. Abstinence forbids the use of meat, but not of eggs, milk products or condiments made of animal fat.


Abstinence does not include meat juices and liquid foods made from meat. Thus, such foods as chicken broth, soups cooked or flavored with meat, meat gravies or sauces, as well as seasonings or condiments made from animal fat are not forbidden. So it is permissible to use margarine and lard. Even bacon drippings which contain little bits of meat may be poured over lettuce as seasoning.

Each year in publishing the Lenten penance requirements, the U.S. bishops quote the teaching of the Holy Father concerning the seriousness of observing these days of penance. The obligation to do penance is a serious one; the obligation to observe, as a whole or "substantially," the days of penance is also serious.

But no one should be scrupulous in this regard; failure to observe individual days of penance is not considered serious. Moral theologians remind us that some people are excused from fasting and/or abstinence because of sickness or other reasons.

In his "Apostolic Constitution on Penance," Pope Paul VI did more than simply reorganize Church law concerning fast and abstinence. He reminded us of the divine law that each of us in our own way do penance. We must all turn from sin and make reparation to God for our sins. We must forgive and show love for one another just as we ask for God's love and forgiveness.

The Code of Canon Law and our bishops remind us of other works and means of doing penance: prayer, acts of selfdenial, almsgiving and works of personal charity. Attending Mass daily or several times a week, praying the rosary, making the way of the cross, attending the parish evening prayer service, teaching the illiterate to read, reading to the blind, helping at a soup kitchen, visiting the sick and shutins and giving an overworked mother a break by babysitting—all of these can be even more meaningful and demanding than simply abstaining from meat on Friday.
