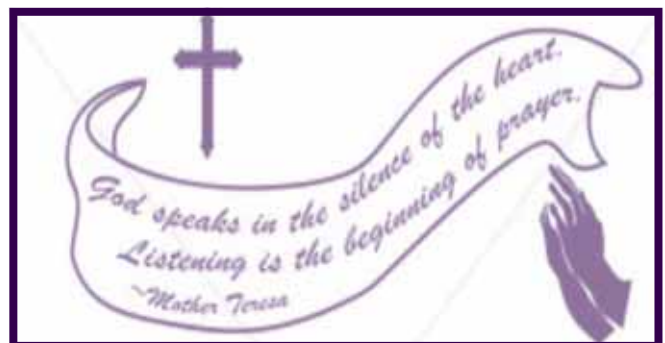

ESCUCHAR Y ACTUAR

Iniciamos una semana más del tiempo de cuaresma y la invitación a la transfiguración de nuestras conductas y hábitos no aceptables por Dios, ni por uno mismo, ni por otros, está aquí hoy, eso es cambiar, movernos a una posición mejor de nuestra vida cristiana y espiritual.

La montaña es el lugar donde muchos van para recargar las pilas, descansar, buscar tranquilidad alejarse del ruido. Es un lugar que no todos quieren estar por diversas circunstancias pero es un lugar donde nos podríamos perder para encontrarnos a nosotros mismos, podría ser como un retiro, donde me doy tiempo para mí mismo. Tenemos recursos para entrar en nosotros y encontrar al Dios del Amor y del Perdón ahí .

De la cruz a la glorificación. El segundo domingo de Cuaresma nos presenta la Transfiguración del Señor. Superada la prueba del desierto, Jesús asciende a lo alto de una montaña para orar. Es éste un lugar donde se produce el encuentro con la divinidad: "su rostro cambió, sus vestidos brillaban de blancos". El rostro iluminado refleja la presencia de Dios. Algunos rostros dan a veces signos de esta iluminación, son como un reflejo de Dios. Son personas llenas de espiritualidad, que llevan a Dios dentro de sí y lo reflejan a los demás. Jesús no subió al monte solo. Le acompañan Pedro, Juan y Santiago, los mismos que están con él en el momento de la agonía en Getsemaní. Sólo aceptando la humillación de la cruz se puede llegar a la glorificación. En las dos ocasiones los apóstoles estaban "dormidos". Este sueño simboliza nuestra pobre condición humana aferrada a las cosas terrenas, e incapaz de ver nuestra condición gloriosa. Estamos ciegos ante la grandeza y la bondad de Dios, no nos damos cuenta de la inmensidad de su amor.

¡Escúchenlo! Junto a Jesús aparecen Moisés y Elías, representantes de la Ley y los Profetas. Jesús está en continuidad con ellos, pero superándolos, dándoles la plenitud que ellos mismos desconocen, pues Él es el Hijo, el escogido. ¿Cuál debe ser nuestra actitud ante esta manifestación de la divinidad de Jesús? La voz que sale de la nube nos lo dice: ¡Escúchenlo! Abram escuchó la voz de Dios y creyó en su promesa: una descendencia como las estrellas del cielo y una tierra como posesión suya. Abrahán escuchó y aceptó la alianza con Dios. Era una costumbre sellar la alianza pasando entre las carnes sangrientas de los animales cortados en dos. Dios toma la iniciativa, pues sólo El, con el signo del fuego, pasa por entre las dos partes de los animales. Pero Abram escucha y acepta el plan de Dios. Desde ese momento transforma su nombre. Ya no será Abram, sino Abraham -padre de muchedumbres-.

Crear, aceptar y vivir lo que Dios nos propone. La gran tentación es quedarse quieto, porque en la montaña "se está muy bien". Hay que bajar al llano, a la vida diaria, de lo contrario la experiencia de Dios no es auténtica. No podemos refugiarnos en un mero espiritualismo que se desentiende de la vida concreta. Somos ciudadanos del cielo, pero ahora vivimos en la tierra y es aquí donde debemos demostrar que Dios transforma nuestro cuerpo humilde y nos hace vivir como hombres nuevos y transformados.

Durante la cuaresma busquemos nuestro sitio aparte, no tenemos que irnos a la montaña simplemente buscarla en mi casa, en algún lugar donde me podamos pasar ese tiempo de silencio y meditación. Es necesario para nuestra alma, para los demás y especialmente para nosotros mismos. Dios nos llama a la conversión, porque Él ya nos salvó de una vez para siempre. No desaprovechemos esta oportunidad. Bendiciones.

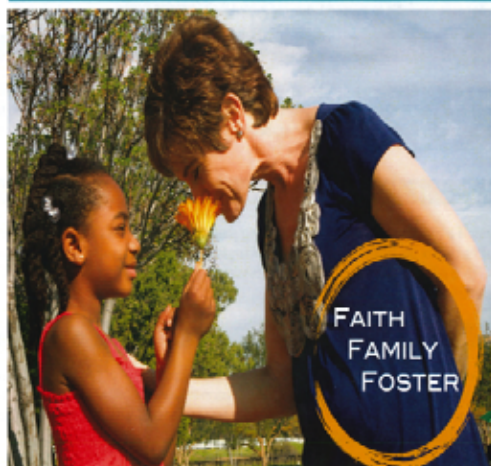
