



***DAME MI HERENCIA: Y LE DIO HERENCIA EN AMOR Y MISERICORDIA.***

Este domingo como es normal de Dios con nosotros nos sigue invitando a acogernos a su amor, su perdón, su misericordia y como veremos en las lecturas siempre está abierta la posibilidad de la conversión, del cambio, del apartarnos de lo que no nos deja paz.

Los fariseos y los escribas murmuraban entre ellos: ese acoge a los pecadores y come con ellos. Jesús les dijo esta parábola. De la lectura del texto evangélico se deduce claramente que Jesús no dirige su parábola a los fariseos y escribas para que estos se fijen en el comportamiento del hijo, sino para que se fijen en el comportamiento del Padre. Por eso, esta parábola debe llamarse con propiedad parábola del Padre pródigo, mejor que llamarla parábola del hijo pródigo. Y no

hay duda de que esta parábola refleja mejor aún que ninguna otra la inmensa misericordia de Dios, como padre, hacia todos sus hijos, hacia los que siempre se portaron bien –hijo mayor- y hacia los que se portaron muy mal –hijo menor-. Lo que Jesús quiere decir con esta parábola a los fariseos y escribas que le criticaban es que él está haciendo con los pecadores que se acercaban a él exactamente lo que hace Dios con todos nosotros, justos y pecadores: amarnos pródigamente, es decir, con una generosidad sin límites. Pues bien, si nosotros queremos ser seguidores de Jesús, deberemos hacer lo mismo que él hacía: amar a todas las personas con generosidad extrema. Sólo así puede entenderse el mandamiento de Jesús de amar al prójimo, incluso al prójimo enemigo. Porque también parece claro que Jesús no amaba a los pecadores, para que siguieran siendo pecadores, sino para que dejaran de serlo. El amor a Jesús, exige de nosotros la conversión a Jesús. Debemos amar a todas las personas, precisamente para que todas las personas, incluidos nuestros enemigos, se hagan mejores, con nuestro amor. La seguridad que tenía el hijo menor en el amor pródigo de su padre es lo que le animó a volver a la casa paterna. Sí, si los cristianos queremos salvar el mundo, deberemos intentar hacerlo a base de mucho amor, de un amor pródigo, como hizo el Padre pródigo con su hijo. En este Año Jubilar de la Misericordia, éste puede ser un buen propósito para esta cuaresma.

El día siguiente a la Pascua, ese mismo día, comieron del fruto de la tierra: panes ázimos y espigas fritas. Cuando comenzaron a comer del fruto de la tierra, cesó el maná. La confianza en que Dios proveerá, no debe nunca excluir nuestro trabajo para conseguir lo que necesitamos, nuestra colaboración. En este libro de Josué se nos dice que Dios les dio el maná cuando no tenían otro medio de alimentarse, de sobrevivir, pero que cuando ellos, el pueblo, ya podía vivir del fruto de su trabajo, cesó el maná. Así debemos vivir nosotros: a Dios rogando y con el mazo dando. Y mientras nosotros tengamos trabajo y posibilidades de vivir del fruto de nuestro trabajo, demos gracias a Dios y acordémonos de los que no tienen trabajo, ni posibilidades de vivir del fruto de su trabajo. Este sentido debe tener nuestra limosna cuaresmal: dar a los que lo necesitan parte de lo que a nosotros nos sobra, de lo que para nosotros resulta no necesario, superfluo. La limosna es una virtud cristiana, que en este tiempo de cuaresma debemos practicar de una manera especial. Seamos capaces de discernir en cada caso, con sentido cristiano, cuánta limosna podemos dar y a quiénes debemos dar limosna.

El que es de Cristo es una criatura nueva... En nombre de Cristo os pedimos que se reconcilien con Dios. Cristo, con su vida, pasión y muerte, nos reconcilió a nosotros con Dios, haciéndonos una criatura nueva. Lo que ahora San Pablo pide a los fieles cristianos de Corinto es que ellos se reconcilien con Dios, viviendo como criaturas nuevas. Sabemos que en la comunidad cristiana de Corinto existían desacuerdos y divisiones dentro de la comunidad cristiana, precisamente porque, en muchos aspectos, seguían viviendo como criaturas carnales. San Pablo les dice que por el bautismo de Cristo han sido ya hechos criaturas nuevas, espirituales, y que deben vivir como tales, amándose mutuamente y viviendo como auténticos hijos de Dios, no como esclavos del pecado y de los ídolos. Apliquémonos a nosotros mismos estos consejos de San Pablo y vivamos como personas espirituales, dirigidos y gobernados por el espíritu de Cristo, por el amor cristiano, no por nuestras pasiones y esclavitudes corporales. Viviendo así podremos “gustar y ver qué bueno es el Señor”, como nos pide el salmo 33. Paz y Bien.
