

***Beware: Cyber Scammers' Latest Text Scams Targeting ADLA (Archdiocese of Los Angeles) Schools and Parishes***

“Smishing” (SMS phishing) is a type of fraudulent activity that involves using SMS or text messages to trick people into giving up personal information so that money can be fraudulently obtained. Perpetrators use various techniques to gain the trust of a victim and may provide specific instructions, which if followed, could result in monetary loss to the victim. Perpetrators may impersonate someone you know that is in some position of authority (a priest, teacher, manager, police, or government agency). **DO NOT BECOME A VICTIM. If you receive such texts do the following:**

- Take time to consider your actions before responding to suspicious text messages.
- If in doubt, call the published main number of the parish, school or administrative office from whom the text claims to have been sent to authenticate the text message.
- Do not respond to the text message if you doubt its origin.

## UNA VIDA RENOVADA


Este sexto domingo de pascua nos invita a recuperar la frescura del evangelio. Esto quiere decir que debemos aplicar y actualizar nuestra fe en Cristo, en el Evangelio, en la Iglesia, es ahí donde nos alimentamos espiritualmente, cada uno de nosotros tiene que revisar su interior a la luz de la palabra de Dios. La fe en Cristo resucitado nos da paz, alegría interior y confianza en su presencia permanente entre nosotros. La fe cristiana nace del corazón, pero corre el peligro de transformarse en religión de ritos. Los judíos "religiosos" quieren imponer la circuncisión. La Iglesia está amenazada de quedarse en los medios, los ritos, y olvidarse de lo fundamental, la interioridad de la fe. También nosotros corremos el riesgo de confundir las tradiciones con la verdad, de afirmar como eterno e inmutable lo que es fruto de una época, de hacer apología de nuestra fe con una filosofía ya superada, de imponer cargas y obligaciones que alejan de lo fundamental, de sostener que viene de Dios lo que viene del hombre. Necesitamos vino nuevo en odres nuevos, recuperar la sintonía con la cultura y con el hombre de nuestro tiempo.

Nuestra vida es el mejor testimonio. Todo este capítulo 14 de Juan está envuelto en una atmósfera de despedida. Jesús anuncia, promete y revela una nueva presencia que, sin duda, supone una novedad significativa. Los frutos de la resurrección son la alegría, la paz y el testimonio de vida. ¿La alegría se nota en nuestra vida y en nuestras celebraciones? Hay muchos niños y jóvenes que no se sienten atraídos por nuestra forma de celebrar rutinaria y triste. Sin embargo, hay muchas comunidades que saben vivir el gozo de la experiencia pascual, que celebraron con entusiasmo la Vigilia Pascual sin mirar al reloj. Ahí se nota que hay algo más que un mero cumplimiento del precepto dominical. ¿Y la paz? La que Jesús nos regala es lo más grande del mundo, es la plenitud de todos los dones del Espíritu. Si la paz reina en nuestro corazón seremos capaces de transmitirla a los demás y de construirla a nuestro alrededor. "La paz os dejo, mi paz os doy": la paz la ofrece Jesús como un don precioso. En la Biblia, la paz es uno de los grandes signos de la presencia de Dios y de la llegada del Reino, síntesis de todos los deseos de bienestar, de justicia, de abundancia, de fraternidad. ¡Casi nada! ¿Cómo dar testimonio de nuestra fe en el mundo de hoy? No bastan las palabras, es nuestra propia vida el mejor testimonio. La diferencia entre alguien "que practica" y alguien "que vive" es que el primero lleva en su mano una antorcha para señalar el camino y el segundo es él mismo la antorcha. Se notará en tu cara, en tus comentarios, en tus gestos, en tu forma de ser si has experimentado la alegría del encuentro con el resucitado. Si eres feliz, transmitirás felicidad. Y quien te vea dirá: "merece la pena seguir a Jesús de Nazaret".

El Espíritu defensor, que nos anima, nos envalentona, ilumina para que nos hagamos presentes en la comunidad y anunciemos que Jesús sigue vivo y presente hoy, que todavía en este siglo podemos ser hombres y mujeres de fe. Este espíritu de Jesús nos recuerda todo lo que Él hizo para salvarnos. Ésta es la gran tarea que Jesús le encomienda. Es fácil deducir que el creyente no está solo, no es un huérfano. Primero, porque el Padre no es Alguien lejano y distante; más bien, somos santuario y morada de Dios mismo: "vendremos a él y haremos morada en él". Esto lógicamente supone unas relaciones nuevas con Dios-Padre: no es posible vivir como si todo fuera como antes; desde Jesús, todo ha cambiado. ¡Cuánto nos cuesta entender a los creyentes esta novedad! ¡Cuán lejos está nuestra espiritualidad de cada día de esta inusitada novedad que se propone y a la que se nos convida! ¡No nos enteramos! Pero es que, además, la muerte de Jesús ha sido ocasión para ser llenados por la presencia viva del Espíritu, que vive en nosotros, está en nosotros y nos enseña el arte de vivir en verdad. El creyente vive animado por el Espíritu, que hace nacer en nosotros el gozo de la fe. Posiblemente, el Espíritu sea el "Gran Desconocido" en la espiritualidad cristiana.

Pablo es el gran animador de la vida nueva en la Resurrección y no se apega a las tradiciones judías por el contrario abre la salvación que Dios en Jesús ofreció, a todos, no solo a una raza, porque eso mismo había dicho Jesús, "no se es profeta en su propia tierra". Unámonos, oremos, amemos a los demás, a la Iglesia, a Dios. Imitemos a San Pablo y los primeros discípulos anunciando incesantemente la vida nueva. Bendiciones, Paz y Bien.

### ¿Sabías?

*Did you Know?*

What constitutes a concern worth reporting?

Parents have a responsibility to report concerns they **have about another person’s behaviors or actions** that could put their children — or any children — at risk. These concerns are anything that makes the parent uneasy or uncomfortable, or anything that a child reports made them feel uneasy or uncomfortable. Some examples of seemingly little things that can be worth reporting include: A teacher covering her glass classroom door with artwork, eliminating the ability to see into the classroom from the hall; a youth ministry ice-breaker activity, where teens have to pass a mint candy from person to person using only toothpicks in their mouth, despite the discomfort of some participants.
