A Parish Wide Assessment.

God has given us the Holy Spirit to guide the Church. But to discern that Spirit is the work of the whole church. As your pastor, I've recently established a parish council who together with my pastoral staff and other key leaders are developing a pastoral plan for our Church. Using a process designed by Renew International and successfully used in many growing churches in the U.S., we are seeking your input to help guide this process. We are asking that you tell us how you see our church by a series of five assessments available online or in paper form, in the areas of 1) Sunday Worship, 2) Sense of Welcome, 3) Sense of Belonging, 4) Witness and 5) Mission. Each of these five assessments seeks your response to various statements, but also has an area for you to add your comments. We need your input to more accurately assess our strengths and build on them, and to identify our weaknesses to strengthen them. We are already a blessed Church, but I see that there is much room for growth, and I strongly believe God is asking us to; welcome more people, involve more of us, encourage the flame of zeal in us to witness and serve. Will you be a part of this process? We are asking that you, and any members of your family 12 years or older, each respond to the assessments.

SE FUE FÍSICAMENTE, PERO NOS DEJÓ SU ESPÍRITU

La Ascensión del Señor al Cielo, es la fiesta de hoy, Jesús como Dios y como hombre es el único que ha resucitado en cuerpo y alma y ha ascendido al cielo, de donde vino, ahí vuelve. Era su lugar a la diestra de Dios Padre. Claro que esto deja un sabor de confusión y malestar a muchos pues lo seguían y esperaban de El algo, pero no lo habían descubierto como el Hijo de Dios Vivo. Lo buscaban tal vez por necesidad o interés o porque ya había realizado alguna buena obra por ellos, pero no se les había abierto los ojos de la Fe. Ellos solos, sin la presencia física guiadora y protectora del Maestro, ¿serían capaces de llevar a cabo la ingente y difícil tarea que les había encomendado de predicar el evangelio a todas las gentes? Yo creo que el dolor de la ausencia tuvo que dejarles, durante los primeros momentos, desorientados y tristes. Pero poco a poco iría ganando fuerza en ellos el recuerdo de las palabras de los dos hombres vestidos de blanco que les habían dicho que el Maestro volvería pronto lleno de majestad y gloria, tal como le habían visto irse. Unos días más tarde, la irrupción del Espíritu, en el día de Pentecostés, seguro que afianzó en ellos esta certeza y les llenó de entusiasmo y fortaleza. Tal como leemos en los escritos de los primeros siglos, fue precisamente esta confianza y esta seguridad de que el Señor volvería pronto lo que realmente mantuvo siempre vivo en los discípulos el entusiasmo y la fortaleza necesaria para seguir predicando en medio de tantas dificultades y persecuciones. Yo creo que a nosotros, a los cristianos de hoy, no debe ser tanto la esperanza en la segunda venida del Señor la que nos anime y nos mueva en nuestro trabajo de cada día, sino la certeza de que el Señor está con nosotros todos los días hasta el fin del mundo, como leemos en el evangelio. Es el Espíritu de Jesús de Nazaret, el Espíritu de Dios, el que queremos que nos guíe y guíe a su Iglesia hoy y siempre, hasta el final de los tiempos. ¿Qué hacéis ahí plantados, mirando al cielo? Lo que quisieron decir a los apóstoles los dos hombres vestidos de blanco, y lo que quieren decírnos hoy a nosotros, es que ahora es el tiempo de la Iglesia, es nuestro turno. Ya no podemos quedarnos parados, mirando al cielo, esperando que sea Dios, en persona, el que baje a la tierra a solucionar nuestros problemas de cada día. Dios quiere que seamos nosotros, en nombre de su Hijo y guiados por su Espíritu, los que hagamos posible la realización de ese Reino que nuestro Maestro inició e instauró ya en la tierra. No echemos a Dios la culpa de nuestros fracasos y de nuestros fallos. Él, por medio de su Hijo, ya nos enseñó el camino, ya nos dijo dónde estaba la verdad y la vida; lo que tenemos que hacer ahora nosotros es ponernos manos a la obra y no dejar que se pierda la obra que él comenzó. Que Dios... ilumine los ojos de nuestros corazones. Es con los ojos del alma con los que tenemos que mirar y ver la verdad de nuestra fe. Con los ojos del cuerpo noaremos capaces de ver la esperanza a la que se nos llama, ni la riqueza de gloria que Dios nos da en herencia, tal como nos dice San Pablo en esta carta a los Efesios. Sí, la Iglesia, y cada uno de nosotros, tenemos que vivir en este mundo como cuerpo de Cristo y esta fe es la que nos debe alimentar la esperanza y el amor para no desfallecer nunca y para actuar siempre de acuerdo con lo que nos dice nuestra Cabeza, que es Cristo Jesús. Esto sólo lo podremos ver con los ojos del corazón, con los ojos de la fe, que son con los que debemos mirar y ver siempre las cosas, a la luz del Espíritu. Es lo que San Pablo le pide al buen Padre Dios para todos los discípulos de Jesús de Nazaret. Dios ya está entre nosotros y es su Espíritu el que nos guía. La fiesta de la Ascensión es consecuencia directa de la fiesta de la Resurrección y está íntimamente unida a la fiesta de Pentecostés. Las tres fiestas forman, como una unidad indisoluble, la Pascua del Señor. Con su resurrección, Cristo nos regaló la victoria sobre la muerte, con su ascensión nos enseñó a buscar las cosas de arriba y con el envío de su Espíritu nos in-
