### *Fr. Paul and the New Parish Council Are Asking for your Help!*

Last weekend, on the Feast of the Ascension, we began a process of asking our parishioners to fill out a series of 5 surveys on the life of our parish. These surveys are intended to help us identify our weaknesses so that we can strengthen them, and our strengths so we can build on them.

When Jesus ascended into heaven, he did not leave us alone, but instead promised that it would be better for us if he did leave (Jn 16:7) and that he would send the Holy Spirit (Jn 16:8, Lk 24:49, Acts 1:4-5). The church is the Body of Christ still on earth, and a vibrant and alive church shares in the ministry of Christ to make disciples. We discern the Holy Spirit, and submit to its power, by working together to understand how we can be a better church, and then mobilizing to become one. My job as pastor is to initiate and guide this process. I have recently formed a parish council. The council is now meeting twice a month along with our parish staff, some of our school staff, and other key leaders to develop a pastoral plan for growth of our church. We are asking your help as we begin this process, to seek your input so that we may best understand where we stand now, and how we can improve. Will you help us?

If you have not already filled in these surveys, I am asking in this email that you please do so. There are five surveys:

*Sunday Matters*  
*Welcome Matters*  
*Belonging Matters*  
*Witness Matters*  
*Mission Matters.*

Studies have shown that the best Catholic Parishes throughout the world are strong in these five areas. They are understood as the key best practices of Churches. By improving in these five areas, we will make a large step towards a more vibrant church, and better share in the Mission Christ gave us; "To go and make disciples of all nations" (Mt 28:19).

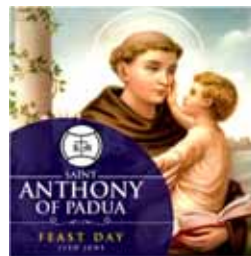

### *Pentecost*

The roots of today's "birthday of the Church" are in an ancient Jewish festival of springtime harvest, seven weeks after Passover. Now, seven weeks after Easter, our great fifty days of rejoicing come to an end. In

the countries where the Church first came to life, this is a time of harvest, and the first fruits appear: apricots and lemons, cherries and strawberries. Even in our gardens, herbs are abundant and asparagus, that close relation of the Easter lily, comes fresh to our tables. The earth is laden with so much new life, and that has always been a sign to Christians of Easter's glory. Pentecost means "fifty" and our fifty days of Easter joy are complete. This Sunday is a day to savor the glory of Easter once more: picnics and cookouts, walks by the water, time in the garden—are all ways of extending the feast. Notice the paschal candle today, still burning during Mass. Our Easter celebration now complete, the candle will soon be moved to a place near the baptismal font, and be lighted at baptisms and funerals as a silent witness to Christ's abiding presence.



### *The Feast of St. Anthony*

The Feast of St. Anthony is Thursday – June 13<sup>th</sup>. St. Anthony of Padua is one of the Catholic Church's most popular saints. Saint Anthony of Padua, patron saint of lost and stolen

articles, was a powerful Franciscan preacher and teacher. He's typically portrayed holding the child Jesus—or a lily—or a book—or all three—in his arms. Many people give alms to St. Anthony Bread in thanksgiving to God for blessings received through the prayers of St. Anthony. St. Anthony of Padua's life is what every Christian's life is meant to be; a steady courage to face the ups and downs of life, the call to love and forgive, to be concerned for the needs of others, to deal with crisis great and small, and to have our feet solidly on the ground of total trusting love and dependence on God. Pray for the intercession of St. Anthony and then be generous to the poor. St. Anthony, the wondrous worker, pray for us.

Ya somos un Iglesia bendecida, pero veo que hay mucho espacio donde podríamos crecer aún más, y creo firmemente que Dios nos está pidiendo que lo hagamos, que acojamos a más personas, y que nos involucremos más nosotros, que nos animemos más y nos sintamos con más celo apostólico para testimoniar y servir. ¿Serás parte de este proceso? Pedimos, que usted, y los miembros de su familia mayores de 12 años respondan a las evaluaciones.

## **NO ESTAMOS SOLOS**

Paz y Bien, hoy terminamos, con esta gran Pascua del Espíritu Santo el tiempo de Pascua, y después de este domingo tendremos la celebración de la Santísima Trinidad y la Fiesta del Cuerpo y Sangre del Señor., ya esta semana retomamos el tiempo litúrgico del tiempo Ordinario. Los días en que hemos celebrado con gran alegría la Pascua de Cristo Resucitado. Hemos seguido, muy cerca, los primeros pasos de la primitiva comunidad cristiana y, al hacerlo, nos hemos visto también nosotros involucrados e interpelados: ¿Cómo vivimos nuestra fe? ¿En tono mayor o en tono menor? ¿Con el calor y el ardor de los primeros discípulos o con la tibieza de este siglo? Desde El, con el Espíritu Santo, percibimos todos estos misterios. Con El, con el Espíritu, entramos de lleno a formar parte de la gran familia de los hijos de Dios; Él es quien nos empuja para entrar en comunión plena con Dios y, el Espíritu Santo, nos hace comprender y entender las huellas de Dios en el marco de nuestra vida. En medio del desconcierto, que a veces lo tenemos, el Espíritu Santo nos serena. Nos hace "contar hasta diez" antes de tomar ciertas decisiones; nos infunde valor cuando tenemos miedo a enfrentarnos a ellas; nos llena de su inteligencia o sabiduría cuando se requiere nuestra palabra o consejo. ¡Sí! El Espíritu Santo es el gran protagonista de nuestra Iglesia. La sostiene y la dinamiza, la traspasa con su fuerza poderosa y transformadora y, sobre todo, le hace estar en un permanente estado de gracia haciéndole experimentar que es Dios, y no ella misma, quien lleva adelante la obra evangelizadora. ¿Por qué — entonces — tantas deficiencias, escándalos o limitaciones en nuestra Iglesia? ¿Dónde está y hasta dónde llega el Espíritu Santo? ¡Ahí está la clave! Donde Él no llega (porque no le dejamos y confundimos su inspiración con nuestra bla bla bla) es cuando aparece en toda su negativa magnitud lo defectuoso de nuestro ser Iglesia. Desde Él y con Él, con el Espíritu Santo, nos llenamos de la piedad de Dios. No podemos vivir huérfanos, aislados de su presencia. Con la oración sentimos que el Espíritu Santo nos hace escalar a las cimas más altas de la perfección cristiana: ¡estar y vivir con Dios! Sin este auxilio del Espíritu Santo nos faltaría identidad en nuestras acciones, luz en nuestros caminos y claridad en nuestro apostolado. Sólo con el Espíritu Santo podemos ser fuertes, como cristianos y como católicos, ante diferentes realidades que intentan desangrar, descafeinar o desvirtuar la esencia de nuestra vida cristiana. Ante lo indefinido o el riesgo a separar el evangelio de la Iglesia o a Cristo de la Iglesia, el Espíritu Santo nos garantiza y nos exige la común unión para que, lejos de dividimos, busquemos la potencia en la hermandad. Ojala que Pentecostés, además de vida e ilusión, nos aporte una gran dosis de fortaleza para seguir adelante en el duro combate de nuestra fe. Para que no caigamos en el pesimismo o en la sensación de que, creer, ya no merece la pena o que, si creemos, hay que hacerlo en el ámbito privado y lejos del testimonio público. Cuando el Señor Jesús Ascende al cielo, no hemos quedado solos, en medio de la confusión y la desesperación de algunos y de otros que ni siquiera le creyeron, nosotros si podemos testificar su acción en la Iglesia, a pesar de todas las tormentas El Espíritu Santo sigue guiando a la Iglesia compuesta por hombres y mujeres con muchos errores. Pero la Gracia de Dios nos debe bastar y su acción espiritual sigue presente aquí hoy y siempre. Que el Señor nos conceda, en esta Pascua de Pentecostés, su Santo Espíritu para que podamos vivir, morir y resucitar un día con El. ¿Sí o no? ¡Recibimos el Espíritu Santo? ¡FELIZ PASCUA DE PENTECOSTÉS! ¡ÉL NOS INUNDE DE LA MISERICORDIA DE DIOS!
