The Most Holy Trinity

As if his own life, his teachings about God's love, his miracles, his death and resurrection were not enough, Jesus told us something about God that we never would have imagined: There are three Persons in one God. It is

also something we cannot completely comprehend. So instead of trying to explain it, let's look at what it means for us believers. One thing it shows is that God wants to be known by us. In ancient times, people would expect their gods to be mysterious and hidden. Many cultures thought that you could control a spirit or god if you knew its name. God sees us not as a threat, but as beloved children. Just as a couple falling in love wants to know everything about each other, so God wants to be known by those whom God loves. That leads to my second point. The Trinity also shows us that "God is love" (1 John 4:16) because the three Persons are united in one God. God calls us to be united in love with God and with each other. Remember that God knows us perfectly and still loves us. Yet knowing our weaknesses and our sins does not hurt God's love for us. On the contrary, our weaknesses allow God to help us by forgiving sins, or inspiring someone to come to our assistance. We may not be able to grasp the full meaning of the Holy Trinity, but knowing that God shares this with faithful people helps us to love God even more.

QUÉ ENTENDEMOS CUANDO HABLAMOS DE UN DIOS TRINO

Feliz día del Padre, bendiciones a ustedes que tienen el privilegio de educar hijos para la Iglesia, para la salvación, Dios les bendiga y les conceda todo tipo de gracias especialmente espirituales. Hemos regresado al tiempo ordinario, estamos en la semana once pues continuamos la secuencia después de que en cuaresma nos detuvimos con el tiempo ordinario retomado después de la Pascua del Señor.

La fiesta de la Santísima Trinidad nos recuerda que Dios, El Hijo y El Espíritu Santo son una comunidad de amor, una familia, centrada en el Amor, la Salvación. Cuando venga él, el Espíritu de la Verdad, os guiará hasta la verdad plena. Esta es la frase que acabamos de leer en este relato del evangelio de san Juan. Pues bien, tenemos que empezar diciendo que la verdad plena del misterio de la Santísima Trinidad no podremos nunca alcanzarla, mientras vivamos en este mundo, porque la verdad plena del misterio de la Trinidad está más allá de nuestra capacidad humana de entender. Los misterios no se pueden explicar nunca del todo racionalmente; los misterios se creen, no se explican. Los agustinos, cuando hablan, en concreto, del misterio de la Trinidad, suelen contar una bonita y muy antigua leyenda que llamamos de “san Agustín y el niño de la concha”, tal como está representada en el famoso cuadro de Rubens. En este cuadro aparece el santo obispo de Hipona paseando por la playa; cuando ve que un niño está echando agua del mar en un pequeño hoyito, con una concha que lleva en la mano. El santo se acerca al niño y le pregunta: ¿qué haces? A lo que el niño responde sin dudar: voy a meter toda el agua del mar en este agujero. El santo, paternal y bondadoso, le responde al niño: toda el agua del mar no va a caber en este agujero. El niño le mira y le dice: tampoco Dios cabe en tu inteligencia. Esta respuesta del niño hizo reflexionar al santo, que llevaba varios años pensando en el libro que iba a escribir, y que de hecho escribió, sobre misterio de la Trinidad. Pues tampoco nosotros vamos a entender nunca del todo el misterio de la Santísima Trinidad. ¿Qué nos dice, en concreto, a los creyentes, el misterio de la Trinidad de Dios? Porque algo, de hecho, entendemos cuando hablamos de este misterio. Las palabras con las que hablamos de los misterios no pueden ser palabras vacías de significado. Los misterios, aunque sean racionalmente inexplicables, siempre nos dicen algo a los que creemos en ellos. Yo creo que el principal mensaje que nos dice a los cristianos este misterio es que el Dios en el que nosotros creemos es un Dios familia, un Dios comunidad, un Dios amor. Nuestro Dios no es un individuo aislado e incomunicado, como una isla remota e inaccesible. Es un Dios católico, es decir, universal. La fe nos dice que Dios es nuestro Padre, que el Hijo es nuestro redentor y que el Espíritu Santo es el amor que une al Padre con el Hijo. Por consiguiente, si nosotros queremos entender algo de este misterio, sólo podremos hacerlo entendiendo a Dios como amor. Y si nosotros queremos entender vivencialmente algo de este misterio, sólo podremos hacerlo viviendo en el amor de Dios. Todos nosotros somos criaturas de Dios, hijos de Dios, y podemos ser, vivir y existir en Dios, si amamos a Dios. Un católico no puede ser una persona egoísta, que sólo piensa en sí mismo, porque entonces no está creyendo en un Dios Trinitario. El individuo, y la familia cristiana, deben tener como ideal vivir creyendo y amando a un Dios que es, en sí mismo, una familia. Este, creo yo, que es el principal mensaje que nos dice a nosotros la fiesta que hoy estamos celebrando.

El mandato de Jesús Resucitado es “vayan y hagan discípulos de todos los pueblos, bautizándolos en el Nombre del Padre, y del Hijo, y del Espíritu Santo. Este es el mensaje claro para los apóstoles antes de subir al Cielo y es el mensaje e invitación para nosotros aquí. Vayan y Evangelicen. Felicidades a todos los Padres de familia.

God's Dream for Us

"If you wish to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to [the] poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me." —Matthew 19:21



Father Paul Gawłowski, OFM Conv

Paul Gawłowski had arrived, by many standards. An up-and-coming engineer at Hughes Aircraft in southern California, he made good money, owned a home, and loved his job.

Yet something was missing. "I recognized that I was empty inside and longing for more," he recalls. Then in his 20s, he asked his father for advice, who told him, as he had so often, "God's the answer for everything." He recommended that Paul read *The Imitation of Christ*.

Paul carried it everywhere and one day found his way to Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish in Hermosa Beach, California, run by the Conventual Franciscans. The friars invited churchgoers to come up to the Nativity scene and say a prayer. Paul prayed, "God, if you're really real, if you can make a difference in my life, please show me."

The Franciscans made an impression on him. "They were down to earth, fresh. They weren't formal or stuffy," he recalls. As he became more involved in the parish, a friar suggested spiritual direction.

His spiritual director invited Paul to reflect on a passage from Matthew 19:16, 21 that was instrumental in the life of St. Francis: "Teacher, what good must I do to gain eternal life?" Jesus replied, "If you wish to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to [the] poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me."

The passage haunted Paul. He had taken a leave of absence to discern what to do with his life when one of the friars preached on Vocation Sunday. At around age 30, Paul decided to become a Franciscan. He never looked back. "It was like finding true riches for the first time," he recalls.

From the start, Father Paul felt called to work with the poor. He did not want to become a priest, more interested in direct service than the sacramental aspects of priesthood.

That changed after novitiate, when he was assigned to a high school in Torrance, California. "I fell in love with teaching the faith," he recalls, something he knew was integral to the role of the priest.

Father Paul's first assignment in 1998 was as associate pastor of St. Paul of the Shipwreck Church in San Francisco, a diverse community where he coordinated social outreach ministries. He started a food pantry and an after-school program, and became involved in helping the homeless and anti-violence street vigils.

After seven years, Father Paul was asked to become pastor. Initially reluctant, he later embraced his role. "I became motivated to help people grow in the faith by teaching, preaching, and through the sacraments," he recalls. In 2014, Father Paul became vocation director for the Conventual Franciscans of California, continuing to study the new evangelization. "I really feel that's where God is calling the Church and where God is calling me," he says.

In July 2018, Father Paul became pastor of Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish, where the young engineer had first met the Franciscans. He is excited about implementing the new evangelization, helping the parish reach beyond the pews to invite others to encounter Christ. "For all of us, I think that's what God's got in store: to really take us places we never dreamed of going if we have the courage to follow his will wherever that might lead," he says.
