



EL CUERPO DE LA MISERICORDIA

Este domingo la Iglesia nos invita a celebrar lo que celebramos todos los días, a todas horas alrededor del mundo, pero con una especial devoción y reflexión de parte nuestra y esto es EL CUERPO Y LA SANGRE DE JESUCRISTO, NUESTRO DIOS VIVO BAJADO DEL CIELO. La Eucaristía es el sacramento por excelencia del mundo espiritual de los que creen en ella. La festividad del Corpus Christi, no obstante, nos hace colocar en el centro de la atención de este día el Misterio de la Eucaristía: el Cuerpo y la Sangre del Señor. En jueves Santo, Jesús, se nos dio y nos mandó perpetuar este Misterio. ¿Qué hemos hecho de él? ¿Rutina o vida? ¿Obligación o necesidad? ¿Encuentro o rito? La misericordia de Dios se expresa especialmente, y visceralmente, en la Eucaristía. Es donde caemos en la cuenta de los quilates del amor de Dios. ¿Qué Padre es capaz de ofrecer a su único para y por salvar a alguien? Dar la vida por los demás por unas horas, por un mes o por un año...resulta fácil. ¿Y darnos totalmente? ¿O entregarnos en cuerpo y alma? ¿Y dejarnos clavar, insultar, lastimar o escupir por la salvación de los demás? A la Eucaristía, por si lo hemos olvidado, no venimos para que nos entretengan. Mucho menos venimos a que, un grupo de guitarras o el coro de turno, nos la hagan más llevadera. Eso, entre otras cosas, sería un insulto a lo más sagrado que ella tiene y ella encierra: Cristo. Sería tanto como acudir a un gran banquete, en el mejor de los restaurantes, y una vez servida la comida llamar al camarero y decirle: "Por favor; ¿puede conectar la música de ambiente porque, la comida, no me gusta?". Nos hace falta fe, y mucha, para gustar, sentir y disfrutar este Misterio.

En el Año de la Misericordia, contemplando a Cristo en el centro de nuestras custodias, caemos en la cuenta de que hemos de ser nosotros los portadores de Jesucristo. El futuro de la fe en nuestra sociedad, en nuestra familia y en nuestros ambientes, depende muchísimo del cómo la vivimos primero nosotros. Sin Eucaristía, la de cada domingo, nos convertimos en simples autómatas del bien (lo hacemos pero porque está de moda el encumbrar ciertos valores altruistas). Nos situamos al margen de Dios (como si comprometernos por el otro fuese responsabilidad nuestra y sin iniciativa de Dios). Nos agotamos en el intento (porque, a la primera de cambio, sentimos que la caridad no es recompensada ni agradecida por un mundo egoísta y egocéntrico). El "Tomen y coman" y "Tomen y beban" llena nuestras entrañas y nuestras venas del mismo Cuerpo y Sangre de Cristo y, cuando así lo creemos y sentimos, vemos que nuestros cuerpos y nuestra sangre se mueven y se desviven por lo mismo que conmovió a Jesucristo: la gloria de Dios y el bienestar de los hermanos. No es lógico, por lo tanto en este día del Corpus Christi, acentuar exclusivamente el dolor de los cuerpos de los hermanos (aunque tengamos que salir en su auxilio). Hoy, especialmente hoy, clavamos nuestros ojos en el Cuerpo de Cristo, saboreamos su Sangre redentora para que, luego, nos infunda su valor, su valentía y su radicalidad para luchar lo que haga falta, donde haga falta para que, nuestra misericordia, sea humana y divina, constante y sin tacha, alegre y virtuosa, respetuosa y humilde, silenciosa e ilimitada. ¿Cómo? Con el Sacramento de la Eucaristía. Es una realidad que transforma, aquiega, perdona y enriquece. Siempre hay un antes y un después en la recepción de la Santa Eucaristía. Muchos días se llega a la misa cotidiana con problemas, aprensiones, tristezas, distracciones o dudas. Gran parte de todos esos problemas van a aclararse. Nuestro cuerpo, alma y pensamiento han cambiado después de recibir a Jesús. No es un espejismo, no es una falsa emoción. Hay momentos en que el fruto del Santo Sacramento es recibir, por ejemplo, un mayor tino para todas las cosas y, sobre todo, en las de índole espiritual. La Eucaristía como dice el Canto apenas la empezamos a vivir, eso es cuando después de la Bendición final nos vamos a nuestras ocupaciones diarias. Vivámosla, no es algo mágico. Es Cristo real y presente, en su cuerpo y en su sangre. Amen.

Fr. Casimir Michael Cypher OFM Conv. is the first U.S. citizen to die by violence for the Catholic faith in Latin America during our century. Fr. Casimir was a Conventual Franciscan, Associate Pastor at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church and a Missionary in Honduras, Central America, in the 1970's. His death was very similar to the death of Jesus. He too was stripped down, publicly humiliated, tortured and killed. The date of martyrdom is June 25, 1975. Fr. Casimir was 34 years old. A Martyr is a witness to the truth of the faith, in which the martyr endures even death to be faithful to Christ. Fr. Casimir Cypher has not been recognized as an official martyr of the Church. Fr. Casimir is our martyr. You can read more about Fr. Casimir in a book entitled "Man of Peace" by Fr. Anselm Romb, OFM Conv.

This is one of many meditations by Father Casimir Cypher:

"What is important is not that we wait for a revelation in some book or in some saying, but take the revelation we have in our everyday life. And the revelation in our everyday life is to use the talents God gave us. Lazarus had no 'talents' — but what he was, he was. And that was all. "There is beauty in life if we only worry about living completely and just being truly what God meant us to be. We miss it when we worry about not being really great, about accomplishing things we cannot accomplish. When we want God to make us greater than we are, we become smaller, because we neglect what we have and what we are already. "Remember this Gospel. It is a sort of warning: Don't look too far into the future. When you look into eternity, don't look on forever; you will stumble over your own life. Look for eternity in those who are near you right now. For eternity begins today; it begins this moment. It begins right NOW!"
