

ESPERAME, DEBO HACER OTRAS COSAS ANTES.

Estamos en la semana decimotercera del tiempo ordinario, y es un tiempo lleno de muchas invitaciones de Dios para que nosotros construyamos su Reino aquí en la Tierra, Reino de Justicia y de Paz. Pero el tinte de esta semana es la llamada directa a hombres y mujeres que Dios unge para su servicio. Y eso es de todos, porque por el bautismo hemos sido seleccionados a la vida de Dios, hemos sido ungidos, eso quiere decir separados, somos por el bautismo, sacerdotes, profetas y reyes, todos no solo unos cuantos.

Escucho mucho, "ya luego voy a ponerme a hacer algo en la Iglesia" como que si fuera algo que debemos hacer después de todo, no, es algo que primero lo haremos y luego lo haremos y siempre lo haremos, porque es parte de nuestro ser de cristianos bautizados. No es algo que haga cuando el tiempo ya se me paso. No pongamos todo antes de servir a Dios y a su Iglesia, eso es un pretexto muy peligroso para nuestra salvación.

Sería mejor empezar diciendo que se debe tener y aceptar y ser fiel a una escala de valores. Me gusta decir que el hombre es el único animal capaz de comprometerse. Descubrir cuál debe ser el porvenir, especialmente mi responsabilidad, es que es una responsabilidad adquirida cada vez que nos acercamos a la Eucaristía.

Todo esto se vive y se asume porque tenemos todos una vocación a la salvación, no es una vocación al sacerdocio es a la salvación y si después comprendemos que existe un llamado específico en mi vida entonces trabajare en eso. Pero cuidado, especialmente los jóvenes, ustedes y los adultos y los niños todos tenemos esa vocación.

Las lecturas de hoy tratan de esto. Del llamado o la llamada, como mejor les suene. El primer solicitante o vocero es Elías. Quien le oye es un labrador llamado Eliseo. Elías no tiene prisa. Eliseo no pierde el tiempo. Se despide de sus padres y, de inmediato, intuyendo que la llamada es de Dios, ya que le llega por boca de un profeta, recoge lo que tiene y ofrece un sacrificio. La víctima sagrada serán sus bueyes, entrar en comunión con la Divinidad, será el banquete que comparte con los suyos. De alguna manera se parece al santiaguarse antes de comenzar un acto importante, gesto de adoración y súplica que algunos observamos hacen. O el bendecir la mesa antes de comenzar, dando gracias y pidiendo por los que no disponen de alimento.

La actualidad invita a que sean emprendedores. Dios a que le sean fieles. El Maestro llama. Es la vocación. Algunos dicen que es el llamado, en masculino, pero podemos decir es la llamada. He comprobado que los dos términos son correctos. Preguntarse preguntando a Dios es honesto proceder. Es preciso retirarse en silencio, sin auriculares, sin el celular, pidiendo, si es preciso, ayuda. O estar dispuesto a aceptar lo que se nos ofrece, sin pensar en las mejores salidas profesionales que se nos pueden ofrecer unos estudios o una ocupación inicial.

La llamada de Jesús es exigente. También otorga más provecho. El joven debe acceder de inmediato. Quien pone la mano en el arado y mira atrás no es digno del Reino de los Cielos. Pero ustedes y yo y especialmente los jóvenes, seguramente desconocerán lo que es un arado, o lo que era un arado hasta hace poco tiempo. Hoy los agricultores laboran sus campos con tractores.

Es posible un llamado o una llamada de Dios, claro que si, invitamos a nuestros amigos, amigas, a sus hijos e hijas a que se dispongan a escuchar la voz de Dios. Que sean conscientes que Dios puede llamarnos y nos llama a todos a una vocación. Oremos por el aumento de vocaciones, por el aumento de matrimonios sacramentados, por los solteros consagrados a la Iglesia, a Dios y a la vida. Amen.



Did you Know?

Teach children to be safe in the water this summer

Drowning is the second leading cause of death for people ages 5-24. Families need to talk to their children about safe habits to use whenever they go to the pool or beach.

Children should never go in the water if they don't know how to swim, and should never swim alone or without a lifeguard present. For parents, avoiding distractions is critical when supervising swimming children

Can you please help with any of these Food Drive requests?

For the past 30 years, we have been serving our parishioners in need with the monthly Food Drive.

With the blessing of Fr. Paul, Food Drive committee members have recently (April and May 2019) done assessments of every current recipient family, asking what other needs they have besides food, what they are doing to meet those needs, and how (if at all) we can help them meet those needs. For example, two of our adult recipients would like to learn English, so we are researching local adult school options and are willing to pay any tuition. We are also researching information on how to apply for health insurance and food stamps.

There are other requests that we want to bring to you to see if you have any of these items and can donate them. Please note that we are not asking you to donate money or to purchase these items. We just want to know if you can donate any of these items you may already have that are used, useable, and no longer needed by you.

Two of our senior citizens would like a twin bed. One currently sleeps on a floor mat; the other has a bed with a flimsy bed frame.

One of our families would like a dining room set (table and chairs) so they can eat together as a family, and so the children have somewhere to do their homework.

One family (one senior citizen and one disabled adult) cannot afford air conditioning or heating, so they would like a medium fan; an electric blanket for a twin-sized bed; and an electric blanket for a king-sized bed. They would also like bed pillows.

One family would like a small toaster oven and a medium-sized cast iron skillet.

One of our recipients is a high school student who has to go to the library every day to use the computer and internet access. That student could use a personal computer or laptop, and a printer.

Some of our recipients would like help finding a job, such as stocking grocery shelves, bagging groceries, gardening, etc. One would like a morning shift as a restaurant cook. One is in sales.

Another family could use better housing, since they have a one-bedroom apartment for four people, along with three grandchildren who occasionally visit.
