QUIENES SON LOS OBREROS?

Paz y Bien este domingo la invitación misionera está por delante de nosotros, Cristo y sus discípulos y tantos otros se disponen a evangelizar. La necesidad existe y los obreros a veces no quieren disponerse. Pero desde esta palabra de hoy la invitación es a dejar todo, a caminar y a propagar la buena nueva del Reino de Dios.

LA MIES ES MUCHA.- Dios que nos creó sin necesidad de nuestra colaboración, pudo salvarnos también sin que nosotros interviniéramos. Sin embargo, no ha sido así. En la nueva creación que supone nuestra redención, el Señor ha querido que fuéramos colaboradores suyos, que tuviéramos una parte, e importante, en la tarea de nuestra salvación y en la de todos los hombres. En efecto, como dice san Agustín, Dios que nos creó sin nosotros no nos salvará sin nosotros. Cuando Jesucristo redime al hombre, le llama a una vida sobrenatural que implica una respuesta y un compromiso. Así Dios toma la iniciativa en la llamada, pero el encuentro salvador no se realiza sin la respuesta del hombre.

Además de esta participación en la propia salvación, los hombres, porque Dios lo ha querido, tenemos también una participación en la salvación de los demás. En primer lugar llamó a los doce apóstoles para que predicaran el Evangelio, pero también llamó a otros setenta y dos para que fueran delante de Él anunciando su llegada a la gente, preparándolos para recibir al Señor. Aquello no fue más que el principio de una larga historia que se prolonga a lo largo de los siglos. Hoy, de modo particular, se insiste en la responsabilidad de todos, también de los laicos, en la obra de la salvación por medio de la predicación del Evangelio. Así se ha hablado mucho de la llegada a la edad madura de todo aquel que ha sido bautizado.

Se ha profundizado en la responsabilidad personal e intransferible que tiene cada creyente en difundir el mensaje de Cristo, según su propio estado y condición. Es cierto que el modo de predicar el Evangelio en el caso de los seglares no ha de consistir en predicar en las iglesias, o en subirse al ambón a leer una de las lecturas de la misa. Eso está bien -si se hace bien-, pero la responsabilidad de predicar el Evangelio tiene un alcance mucho mayor, una repercusión más comprometida y costosa. Se trata de predicar sobre todo con el ejemplo, dando un testimonio sincero de vida cristiana y dando la cara cuando sea preciso por la doctrina de Cristo.

Las palabras de Jesús siguen teniendo vigencia. También hoy es mucha la mies y pocos los obreros. Hay que reconocer que en el mundo que vivimos es mucha la tarea y escaso el número de los que son responsables, con seriedad, en esta empresa de transformar el mundo, según la mente de Cristo. De ahí que hayamos de rogar, una y otra vez, al dueño de la mies para que envíe obreros a su mies, para que despierte la conciencia dormida de tantos como se dicen cristianos y no lo son a la hora de dar la cara por Cristo, en esos momentos en los que hay que ir contra corriente y defender a la Iglesia y al Papa confesar sin dudas, con obras sobre todo, nuestra condición de cristianos.

Pero entremos en las lecturas. San Pablo en el final de la Epístola a los Gálatas narra, también, otro final en una concreción de toda su doctrina. El Apóstol solo se enorgullece de la Cruz de Cristo y de su efecto en él mismo y en el resto de los fieles. La comunión de Pablo con Jesús hace que presuma, incluso, de llevar sus marcas. En el texto precedente de la misma Epístola es un impresionante cántico a la libertad de los seguidores de Cristo y el epílogo es una unión total mediante la "confraternización" de la Cruz. Y avancemos en tomar nuestra misión, predicar y evangelizar es de todos los católicos, de todos los bautizados, no esperemos, Dios hace su obra, utilizando nuestras vidas. Paz y Bien.

Stewardship has to do with how we manage our time, talent, and resources—basically our entire lives. It's a beautiful concept when properly understood. Here are the basics of good stewardship: *God is the source of all creation, including our lives. God is the primary owner of all that exists.* We are blessed by being given the task of managing well all that we have influence over: our lives, our abilities, our minds and bodies, our time, our part of the earth, our finances, our children, our church buildings, our automobiles, etc. Although we can make decisions regarding each of the above, ultimately we are responsible to God. Sooner or later, we must give an account of our management of God's creation and of God's gifts. When we properly use the talents, resources and property that God allows us to manage, we find great joy. Think of planting a garden which soon overflows with colorful flowers, wonderful vegetables, and flavorful herbs, etc. God gave us the plot of ground, God gave us the seed, God gave us the wisdom and strength to bring forth such beauty, such good things to see or eat, or smell. Yet we did the work, with God's help, to make it a reality. Like Adam we tilled it and kept it. But God gave the increase. God's provisions and our labor brought the garden to its fulfillment. Good stewardship enables us to do something positive and wonderful with the money God has allowed us to have. What feels better than knowing one has managed money well? Our bank account, our checkbook and our portfolio tell the story. When money is handled well, we have enough for ourselves and are still able to give to God's work. That is the beauty of stewardship.

Can you please help with any of these Food Drive requests?

For the past 30 years, we have been serving our parishioners in need with the monthly Food Drive.

With the blessing of Fr. Paul, Food Drive committee members have recently (April and May 2019) done assessments of every current recipient family, asking what other needs they have besides food, what they are doing to meet those needs, and how (if at all) we can help them meet those needs. For example, two of our adult recipients would like to learn English, so we are researching local adult school options and are willing to pay any tuition. We are also researching information on how to apply for health insurance and food stamps.

There are other requests that we want to bring to you to see if you have any of these items and can donate them. Please note that we are not asking you to donate money or to purchase these items. We just want to know if you can donate any of these items you may already have that are used, useable, and no longer needed by you.

Two of our senior citizens would like a twin bed. One currently sleeps on a floor mat; the other has a bed with a flimsy bed frame.

One of our families would like a dining room set (table and chairs) so they can eat together as a family, and so the children have somewhere to do their homework.

One family (one senior citizen and one disabled adult) cannot afford air conditioning or heating, so they would like a medium fan; an electric blanket for a twin-sized bed; and an electric blanket for a king-sized bed. They would also like bed pillows.

One family would like a small toaster oven and a medium-sized cast iron skillet.

One of our recipients is a high school student who has to go to the library every day to use the computer and internet access. That student could use a personal computer or laptop, and a printer.

Some of our recipients would like help finding a job, such as stocking grocery shelves, bagging groceries, gardening, etc. One would like a morning shift as a restaurant cook. One is in sales.

Another family could use better housing, since they have a one-bedroom apartment for four people, along with three grandchildren who occasionally visit.
