RCIA Starts Wednesday September 18th 2019



Rite of Christian Initiation
for Adults

RCIA starts on September 18th, 2019 at 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm at Our Lady of Guadalupe School classroom. The RCIA program is typically an 8 to 9 month journey into a relationship with Jesus. Many a time the people that come to the

RCIA program have no knowledge about the faith. Hence the RCIA starts at the most basic level i.e. Images of GOD, what is Holy Scripture, what are the various sacraments, the saints and how they help us to come into a deeper relationship with GOD, etc. At Our Lady of Guadalupe we start in September and go on till May/June. The Candidates (receiving Eucharist and/or Confirmation) and Catechumens (receiving all 3 sacraments) receive their sacraments on Easter Vigil.

Baptisms At Our Lady of Guadalupe Church

Families who are registered and active parishioners of our parish for three months or more, or of another parish for three months or more (with a letter from that parish stating they are registered and active) must attend the monthly baptismal class, along with the chosen Godparents for their child, and schedule the baptism on one of the designated Sundays at 1PM. If they or their chosen Godparents have attended the class within the last 2 years, they do not need to repeat it. Classes are held at Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic Church the second Wednesday of every month in the Parish Hall, 7:00-8:30 pm in English, (and first Monday of every month in Spanish). To register, please call the parish office (310 372-7077) for an appointment to fill out a form. Please come 15 minutes early to check in. Given the hour of the day and length of the pre-Baptism class, parents and godparents are encouraged not to bring their children with them to class. Baptisms are on the third Sunday of every month at 1:00PM in English and the Second Sunday of every month at 1:00PM in Spanish. Please call the parish office if you need additional information.

SEAMOS HOSPITALARIOS CON DIOS

Este domingo el Evangelio de San Lucas sin citar Betania, es "solo una aldea", nos presenta la casa donde Jesús iba a descansar muchas veces y el entorno en el que se produjo la resurrección de Lázaro. El relato de Lucas de hoy es, sin duda, una de las páginas más citadas y analizadas de todos los textos evangélicos, pues siempre se ha querido ver dos posiciones contrarias en la forma de asumir el seguimiento de Cristo. Marta es la acción. María es la contemplación. Marta se desvive para tenerlo todo a tiempo. María prefiere quedar junto al Maestro para, solamente, escucharle. Y, sin embargo, esas dos posiciones pueden ser complementarias. En la Iglesia no sobra nadie. Es necesario el ejercicio de la acción, de la entrega, del trabajo hasta la extenuación por servir a los hermanos. Pero también es muy necesario ese plano de la oración y la contemplación constantes. Miles y miles de hombres y mujeres consagrados viven orando por los demás. Ese es su quehacer fundamental. Apartados en sus conventos y abadías elevan, día a día, sus oraciones para que Dios siga cuidando de sus hijos, lo que no dejará de hacer jamás.

Y uno tiene el recuerdo de la impresión que recibió en sus primeras horas de cristiano converso a descubrir la existencia de Betania. Ese lugar donde Jesús iba a descansar tras sus batallas finales en Jerusalén. Es probable que acudiera a la casa de María, Marta y Lázaro muchas más veces, muchas más de las que citan los Evangelios. Y de ahí surgió la idea de llamar a nuestra página de Internet Betania. Han pasado casi 20 años y ahí estamos. Y en el medio Internet 20 años son muchos años... La idea, la contemplación, del reposo y descanso del Señor nos llena de alegría y de un poco de nostalgia por, tal vez, no haberle podido acompañar allí. Pero en fin.

También me ha impresionado desde siempre, la continua cercanía de Abrahán a Dios. Esa familiaridad y contacto permanente. En el fragmento del Génesis que leemos hoy usa de la hospitalidad oriental para el Señor y sus enviados preparándoles descanso, limpieza y comida. Y como nos ocurre que la casa de Betania, alguna vez, por extraordinario que parezca decirlo aquí y ahora, nos gustaría tener la oportunidad de Abrahán de tener al Señor como huésped e invitarle a comer. Es verdad que Él está cerca y en muchas ocasiones de nuestra vida le hemos sentido al lado. Otras, cuando la desolación llega, puede parecer que no le encontramos. Pero, tal vez, nos debe pasar lo que a Marta: estamos tan atareados, de un lado para otro, con más sentido del movimiento que de la eficacia, con, asimismo, más capacidad para trajar y poca calidad en nuestro trabajo espiritual que no somos capaces de verle u oírle.

Aquí —y ahora— merece la pena profundizar un poco más, junto con Abrahán, en esa necesidad de que Dios —el Señor, la imagen visible del Dios invisible, Jesús— esté siempre cerca de nosotros. La mayoría de las grandes preguntas de fe o las cuestiones difíciles de nuestra vida como cristianos solo se van a poder resolver si, puestos en la presencia de Dios, le preguntamos a Él. Hay muchas gentes que, sin duda, creen en Él, pero no cuentan con Él. Les asusta esa cercanía que, sin duda, incluye compromiso. Nadie puede —salvo uno mismo— saber con exactitud cuál es el nivel de relación con Dios de los otros. No olvidemos que esto es algo muy sagrado nuestra relación con Dios, pero podemos sospechar o intuir que a veces hay una lejanía de Dios. Debemos ser consistentes en ponernos a los pies de Jesús todos los días, pero también, estar atentos a nuestro alrededor, porque siempre el hermano o hermana nos necesitara en cualquier momento. NO nos conformemos solo con hacer y hacer, pero tampoco solo con contemplarlo y estar a sus pies. Lo único que es válido es el balance entre los dos. Que Dios nos ayude a seguirlo y a dar testimonio de El en nuestras vidas. Amen.
