There is also a need to explain, "why" I suppose we could go to the Catechism of the Church and read it, but somehow I believe Father Paul might be able to put some of the teachings in a more engaging context. When our girls were in confirmation, 7-8 years ago, or so, there was very little effort to engage pre-teens and teens in the life of the Church. What opportunities there were to be a part of the Mass and hook them in were limited to altar serving. Only students at OLG school were given an opportunity to have any presence outside altar serving. My wife, who was on the Parish Council at the time, asked about this and was shot down by Father Ray who believed all parents who could send their kids to Catholic school should, and defensive members of the faith education community who weren't receptive to any criticism or suggestions. That experience caused her to resign from the Council. From what I have seen, there have been some positive steps taken to engage young people beyond their classes. I am glad that is happening. One thing we wish existed when our kids were very young was a Summer Vacation Bible School. No Catholic Church in our area puts one on and that is too bad. Our girls went to Bible Schools in various Protestant churches and had a ball. Unfortunately, the kind of outreach to the young you see at Journey of Faith and other Protestant congregations was non-existent at OLG and, I think, is one of the reasons (not the only reason) our young-adult daughters are not currently close to the Church.
