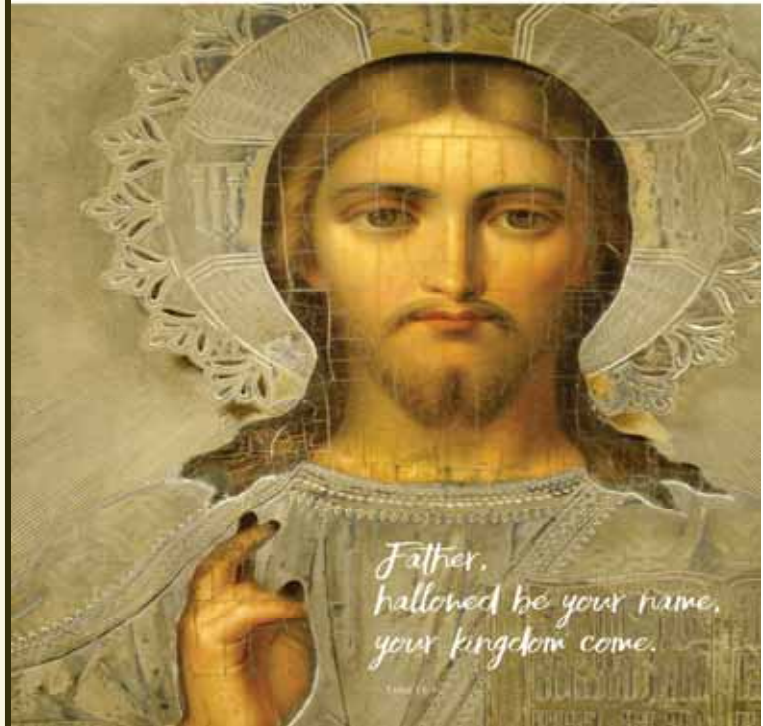

EN NUESTRA ORACION. PENSAMOS EN LOS DEMAS?

El Evangelio de este domingo tiene para los creyentes una importancia especial. Recoge el momento en el que Jesús enseña a los discípulos la oración que hoy en día seguimos rezando y que nos identifica como discípulos de Jesús: el Padrenuestro. Es importante subrayar el contexto en el que el evangelio sitúa esta oración. La acompaña de una catequesis en la que Jesús ilumina a los discípulos sobre la insistencia en la oración. Por eso la parábola o el cuento del señor que va a pedir pan a su amigo porque ha tenido una visita. Y sobre la confianza con que debemos rogar a Dios. Por eso la parábola que compara entre la bondad de un padre de los nuestros y la bondad del Padre celestial.

Además la Iglesia en su liturgia hace que este Evangelio esté precedido por la lectura del Génesis en la que Abrahán intercede ante Dios por los habitantes de Sodoma y Gomorra a los que Dios quiere castigar por sus iniquidades. Ahí diría que está la clave en la que nos podemos fijar este domingo. La oración que nos plantea Jesús no es la del que pide de forma egoísta por su propio bien sino la del que intercede por sus hermanos. Abrahán participa en esa especie de subasta a la baja con Dios para intentar encontrar una razón que salve a sus hermanos, los habitantes de Sodoma y Gomorra, del castigo y la muerte que se les avecina. En principio, Abrahán no tiene nada que ver con ellos. En Sodoma tiene un sobrino pero ése va a ser salvado por Dios. Con el resto de los habitantes de esas ciudades no le une ningún lazo más allá de pertenecer a la misma humanidad. Ellos son malos, por eso van a ser castigados, y él es el elegido de Dios para ser padre de un pueblo y depositario de la promesa. Abrahán podía haberse dado la vuelta y no mirar a lo que iba a suceder. O haber comentado con Dios cómo es necesario, aunque triste, tomar decisiones radicales y extirpar el mal de la sociedad humana. Pero hace exactamente lo contrario. Trata desesperadamente de salvar a los que se habían condenado por sus propias acciones. Y Dios cede ante él. La cifra de justos necesaria para salvar la ciudad baja de 50 a 10 ante la insistencia de Abrahán. Algo parecido se puede decir del Evangelio, donde el que va a pedir los panes no lo hace para sí sino para dar de comer a un amigo que le ha llegado a casa.

Podríamos decir que la clave de la oración está en la intercesión. Pedir a Dios por nuestros hermanos y hermanas. Para ello hemos de sentir una gran solidaridad. Es que realmente somos hermanos y hermanas. Su muerte o su fracaso es nuestra muerte y nuestro fracaso. Oremos intercediendo por ellos y ellas porque, si nosotros que somos malos damos cosas buenas a nuestros hijos, cómo no nos va a dar el Espíritu de Vida el Padre del cielo que tanto nos ama.

Para la reflexión

¿Oramos alguna vez? ¿Lo hacemos con las palabras del Padrenuestro? ¿Tenemos en mente las necesidades de nuestros hermanos y hermanas? ¿Siento que son de verdad mías sus necesidades? ¿O acaso sólo miramos por “mis” necesidades? La oración será nuestra meta siempre, hay muchas ocasiones por las que debemos rezar por los demás, y seguramente otros rezaran por nosotros. Pero la oración debe ser constante, sin exigencias, no condiciones, no presiones hacia Dios. Porque cuando lo hagamos todos los días y se nos haga una buena rutina, se convertirá en promesa realizada como en el caso de Abraham y su promesa de descendencia. No condiciones, seamos constantes en la Oración.

***¿Sabías?***

Los padres de niños pequeños suelen repetir la frase de que “los varones son varones” para justificar ciertas conductas masculinas. Pero este entendimiento podría ser un modelo peligroso para la etapa adulta, ya que esos argumentos podrían justificar el abuso sexual y la violación. Recuerden que los mensajes que les transmitimos a los hijos tienen un efecto duradero. Además, cuando los niños aprenden que los “varones” no deben mostrar sus emociones, esto podría ser peligroso en caso de un abuso sexual, ya que ellos no querrían contar lo sucedido. Y cuando las niñas escuchan que los varones tienen que ser duros y poco corteses, ellas también aprenden que ellos deben ser tolerados en vez de rechazados.

RCIA Starts Wednesday September 18th 2019

RCIA starts on September 18th, 2019 at 7:00 pm to 8:30 pm at Our Lady of Guadalupe School classroom. The RCIA program is typically an 8 to 9 month journey into a relationship with Jesus. Many a time the people that come to the RCIA program have no knowledge about the faith. Hence the RCIA starts at the most basic level i.e. Images of GOD, what is Holy Scripture, what are the various sacraments, the saints and how they help us to come into a deeper relationship with GOD, etc. At Our Lady of Guadalupe we start in September and go on till May/June. The Candidates (receiving Eucharist and/or Confirmation) and Catechumens (receiving all 3 sacraments) receive their sacraments on Easter Vigil.

Baptisms At Our Lady of Guadalupe Church

Families who are registered and active parishioners of our parish for three months or more, or of another parish for three months or more (with a letter from that parish stating they are registered and active) must attend the monthly baptismal class, along with the chosen Godparents for their child, and schedule the baptism on one of the designated Sundays at 1PM. If they or their chosen Godparents have attended the class within the last 2 years, they do not need to repeat it. Classes are held at Our Lady of Guadalupe Catholic Church the second Wednesday of every month in the Parish Hall, 7:00-8:30 pm in English, (and first Monday of every month in Spanish). To register, please call the parish office (310 372-7077) for an appointment to fill out a form. Please come 15 minutes early to check in. Given the hour of the day and length of the pre-Baptism class, parents and godparents are encouraged not to bring their children with them to class. Baptisms are on the third Sunday, of every month at 1:00PM in English and the Second Sunday of every month at 1:00PM in Spanish. Please call the parish office if you need additional information.
