Special Days in August

Maximilian Kolbe died in Auschwitz by offering his life in charity so a man with a family could live. His act of charity and his Marian movement the Militia Immaculata are testimonies of faith that inspire us today.

Transfiguration

On Tuesday August 6, we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord, is a day of eyewitness accounts. The first, a vision reported by the prophet Daniel, was well known to Jesus and his apostles. The vision account was written in quite mystical and figurative language. It is a vision of heaven, powerful and memorable. There are flames of fire,

burning wheels, the Ancient One, and a Son of Man. Clearly, Daniel saw something. But was it a dream? Was it real? Was it merely a clever myth? Peter wants no such confusion about his vision! We are told in Mark's Gospel what he and his friends James and John saw when they went up on the mountain with Jesus one day. Jesus warned the three witnesses to tell no one until "the Son of Man had risen from the dead" (Mark 9:9). Lest readers of one of the Gospels discount the story or simply write it off as a pious myth, Peter gives his own account of the Transfiguration of Jesus in his second letter to the church. He writes with authority, as an eyewitness. He reports this message from God concerning Jesus: "This is my Son, my beloved, with whom I am well pleased," and he assures us that the message is "altogether reliable" (2 Peter 1:17, 19).



Assumption of Mary

Celebrated every year on August 15, the Feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary commemorates the death of Mary and her bodily assumption into Heaven, before her body could begin to decay--a foretaste of our own bodily

resurrection at the end of time. Because it signifies the Blessed Virgin's passing into eternal life, it is the most important of all Marian feasts and a **HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION**.

LO QUE DE VERDAD LLENA NUESTRA VIDA

Buena semana a todos, Dios en su amor por nosotros nos habla directamente con palabras claras, acumulemos experiencia con El, en su presencia, a sus pies. Hoy muchos viven una vaciedad en sus vidas, no hay sentido o falta el sentido para vivir la vida con pasión, con amor, proyecto de salvación etc. Esta palabra se emplea muchas veces en el libro del Eclesiastés y el tema central del libro se encuentra expresado en ella: una reflexión sobre lo limitado de la vida, hasta llegar al desencanto. De una fuerza destructora impresionante, y de un realismo que nadie puede contestar, esta reflexión sobre la inutilidad de nuestras utilidades llegará hasta el final del libro. Es ésta una realidad que ocurre a diario. Además, recordemos que trabajar y no disfrutar, trabajar para otros, es una de las maldiciones clásicas de la ley y los profetas. Piensa el autor que hay hombres que se condenan a sí mismos a semejante maldición. Aunque el Eclesiástico no se lo llega a plantear así, estas palabras muestran la necesidad de una trascendencia, de una apertura hacia algo más que la limitación del hombre. La vida del hombre cerrada sobre sí misma es un imposible. Eclesiástico quiere comprender el sentido de la vida, da vueltas en torno a ella ("como el viento"), pero se estrella siempre ante el muro de la muerte. Por eso su grito desconsolado: "todo es fatiga". Porque o el hombre, ocupado en el esfuerzo de acumular, no tiene tiempo para disfrutar, o bien es un egoísmo cerrado que no ayuda a nadie. Una de las formas de salir de este círculo opresor será el de apagar nuestra sed fundamental ayudando a apagar con nuestro mayor bien, que es la vida, la sed de los demás. Todo este modo de pensar, oscuro e imperfecto, se aclarará con la luz que aporta el hecho de Jesús. La vida adquiere nuevo sentido en la fe de Jesús. La auténtica riqueza. Hay un peligro de las riquezas: pueden esclavizar, cuando la "mamón", (su origen es de una palabra aramea que significa dinero o tesoro) nombre hebreo de las riquezas, es un falso dios objeto de adoración. Mientras millones de personas pasan hambre, nuestra sociedad derrocha a raudales lo que otros necesitan para vivir. Como cristianos estamos llamados a compartir lo que hemos recibido y debemos tener cuidado, pues "no podemos servir a Dios y al dinero". Hay riquezas carísimas y riquezas baratas. Es triste que, mientras la gente se pasa la vida llorando por no poder alcanzar los bienes caros, se dejen de cultivar los que tenemos al alcance de la mano. La más grande y "barata" de las riquezas es la amistad. Un buen amigo vale más que una mina de oro. Sentirse comprendido y acompañado es mayor capital que dar la vuelta al mundo. Alguien que nos ayude a sonreír cuando estamos tristes es más sólido que mil acciones en bolsa. ¡Y qué barato sale tener un buen amigo!: cuesta menos que un vaso de vino, menos que un trozo de pan. Lo pueden tener los pobres y los ricos y casi les es más fácil a los primeros. Hace falta mucho dinero para hacer un safari por África, pero no hace falta una sola moneda para acariciar la cabeza de un perro y ver cómo levanta hacia nosotros sus ojos agradecidos. No hace falta dinero para comprar la felicidad que proporciona la paz interior o palpar la presencia de Dios en un momento de oración meditativa. El amor verdadero no se compra ni se vende, como tampoco se compra la felicidad que proporciona el hacer una obra buena en favor de un necesitado, acompañar a un enfermo o escuchar a una persona atormentada. Nos han engañado, nos han estafado acostumbrándonos a creer que es el dinero y el lujo la verdadera moneda de la felicidad. Hay multimillonarios que gastan la vida en llorar por creerse pobres, que se encuentran solos sin nadie que les quiera. ¿Dónde está la verdadera felicidad, en Dios o en el dinero? Aprendamos a poner en primer lugar las cosas importantes, Dios, nuestra familia, amigos, la caminata o el café con alguien que te quiere y tal vez no puede ofrecerte nada. Eso es lo primero eso es lo más grande, coloquemos lo más grande primero. No es lo que nosotros creemos a veces que es lo más grande. Pensemos en esto, meditemos y demos ese lugar a lo que nos hace vivir tranquilos, en paz, felices. Amen.




