

Who is St. Maximilian?



Maximilian was born in Poland in 1894. He entered the Franciscans and while studying in Rome contracted tuberculosis, which afflicted him all his life. Before ordination he founded the Militia Immaculata movement to promote consecration to Mary. After ordination he returned to Poland and spread his movement especially through the print media. His magazine, "Knight of the Immaculata" went to hundreds of thousands of readers from his "City of the Immaculata", a Franciscan Friary that grew to 800 friars by 1939. In 1930 he established a smaller friary to do the same work in Japan. He was recalled to Poland in 1936 to be superior of the Polish friary. During World War II he was arrested twice by the Nazis and eventually was sent to Auschwitz. On August 14, 1941, he was executed after spending two weeks in a starvation bunker with nine other prisoners. He had volunteered to take the place of a father of a family who was to be executed. He was canonized in 1982, and his feast is celebrated on August 14th. Fr. Maximilian's statue is located in our vestibule as well as the actual picture of the man that Fr. Maximilian saved next to Pope John Paul VI. Please join us for the celebration of this saint who is the patron saint of journalist, families, prisoners, and the chemically addicted on Wednesday, August 14 at 8AM.

Hoy celebramos el día de Santa Clara de Asís y ella si supo encontrar el tesoro de su corazón, de su vida y de la Iglesia, decidiendo vivir como Dios le pedía y se hizo seguidora de Él , adorando el Tesoro de la Eucaristía. Las hermanas clarisas adoran siempre el tesoro de Jesús presente en la Eucaristía.

Hoy las lecturas van por ese lado, encuentra el Tesoro, pero debes discernir exactamente que entiendes por tesoro en este caso. Parece evidente que durante siglos la fe en Dios ha sido el principal tesoro que ha dirigido el corazón de muchos cristianos. No me refiero, en este momento, a los líderes o protagonistas principales de la historia, sino a los millones de personas anónimas para quienes la fe en Dios fue su principal sostén y alimento. "Vela ahí, Dios lo ha querido"; "Si Dios quiere"; "que sea lo que Dios quiera"; "gracias a Dios"; "que Dios nos agarre confesados"; "cuando Dios nos lo manda, por algo será". Estas expresiones y otras muchas parecidas que decían tan frecuentemente nuestros abuelos y abuelas eran fruto y consecuencia de una actitud de resignación y consuelo que sólo encontraban explicación y razón de ser en su fe en Dios. Sin la fe en Dios muchas de esas personas se hubieran derrumbado y desesperado. Todavía hoy día, aunque en número muchísimo menor, se encuentran personas profundamente creyentes que, ante una grave enfermedad, o ante una gran desgracia, encuentran fuerza y ánimo para luchar gracias a su fe en Dios. Es cierto que la fe en Dios tiene hoy, para la mayor parte de las personas, una importancia menor, pero sigue siendo verdad que, en general, la fe en Dios es, para los que la tienen, fuente de fortaleza y de ánimo. Encauzar rectamente la fuerza que nos debe proporcionar nuestra fe en Dios es una tarea psicológica y espiritual que no debemos abandonar nunca.

Los hijos piadosos... se imponían esta ley sagrada: que todos los santos serían solidarios en los peligros y en los bienes. Los "hijos piadosos" a los que se refiere el libro de la Sabiduría son los judíos del tiempo del éxodo que vieron y sintieron a Dios como la causa primera de su liberación. El sentirse hijos del mismo Dios los animaba a comportarse como hermanos, ayudándose mutuamente en los peligros y compartiendo los bienes. Para estos judíos piadosos era evidente que su fe en Dios debía ser siempre su principal fuerza para vencer al mal y hacer el bien. Nosotros, los cristianos, creemos que nuestra fe en Dios nos obliga a ser solidarios no sólo con "los santos", o con los de nuestra misma religión, sino con todas las personas, porque todos somos hijos del mismo Dios, de un Dios liberador.

La fe es seguridad de lo que se espera, y prueba de lo que no se ve. La esperanza es la fuerza que alimenta la fe. Sin esperanza la fe se desinfla y se pierde. El patriarca Abrahán fue capaz de esperar que la promesa de Dios se cumpliría, aun cuando, humanamente hablando, todo hacía prever que no se iba a cumplir. Nuestra esperanza debe ser siempre una esperanza activa, que nos impulse y nos dé fuerza para seguir caminando con fortaleza y ánimo. Una persona que vive animado por una esperanza activa suele ser una persona más eficaz y más alegre que las personas desesperanzadas. El patriarca Abrahán debe ser nuestro modelo de fe y nuestro modelo de esperanza.

Ustedes deben estar como los que aguardan a que su señor vuelva. La esperanza activa exige vigilancia activa. Cuando esperamos a alguna persona querida o importante nos preparamos para recibirla lo mejor que sepamos y podamos. Así, nuestra vida debe ser una continua espera vigilante. La vigilancia nos exige una continua preparación y una continua atención. Somos viajeros y caminantes que esperamos encontrarnos, al final de nuestro camino, con nuestra anhelada tierra prometida. Si nuestra fe es firme, también nuestra esperanza y nuestra actitud vigilante serán firmes y continuadas. No es fácil tener fe y esperar en lo que no se puede ver con los ojos del cuerpo, pero así es nuestra fe religiosa. Creemos en Dios y esperamos en Dios, porque nos fiamos de Dios. La fe activa del patriarca Abrahán estuvo siempre sostenida por su confianza en Dios.

Pongamos nuestra esperanza en el único que puede salvarnos , eso sí , debemos cambiar nuestras actitudes . Que esta sea una semana de mucha bendición para ustedes. Paz y Bien.



Using vanishing communication technology to send harmful messages

From your cell phone you can send virtually any form of communication — even messages that disappear almost immediately after being sent. With apps like Snapchat and Instagram, or even some texting apps, children with social media accounts can communicate privately and secretly, sending messages and pictures that disappear after they are seen. Obviously, vanishing messages pose a problem, as parents can't monitor what their children are saying or receiving. Check your child's phone for these apps and talk about the importance of transparency and honesty. It's also important for children to know that even a "vanishing" message can be saved through a screenshot.


