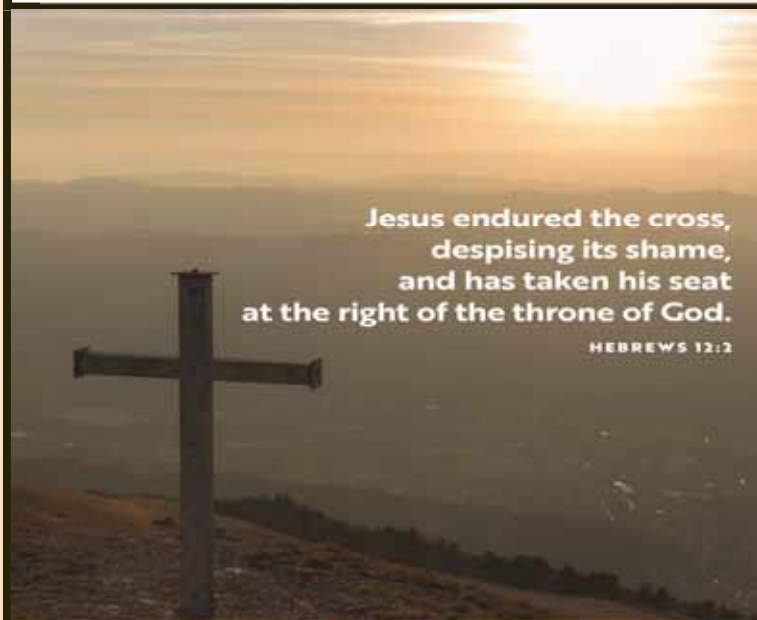

## ***JESÚS REMUEVE NUESTRA CONCIENCIA***

Cuando Jesús habla de esa forma seguramente algunos nos asustamos, claro que si traía, trajo y traerá la paz siempre, pero habla de ser perseguido0s a causa de nuestra fe, porque debemos dar testimonio de nuestro seguimiento a Él y poder dejar de acumular aquí lo que no es necesario. Significa, ser perseguido por ser consecuente. Por ejemplo el profeta Jeremías está siendo perseguido y lo quieren matar porque está haciendo su misión: que es, anunciar y denunciar, y por eso viene la molestia de la vida, porque denunciar lo que no esta bien, no es fácil y tampoco gusta a los demás.

En el caso de Jeremías la palabra que tiene que anunciar le molesta y le complica la vida. La vida y la misión del profeta no son fáciles. A Jeremías le meten en prisión y a punto estuvo de perder la vida. Pero él fue honrado al avisar del peligro inminente de la llegada de los babilonios. Intentan acallar su voz, pero el desastre va a venir precisamente porque no le escucharon. Nosotros debemos ser consecuentes. Aunque no esté de moda ser cristiano, aunque nos critiquen o se metan con nosotros, tenemos que anunciar la verdad y denunciar el peligro que acecha a nuestro mundo cuando los criterios dominantes son los del materialismo o los de la violencia, la persecución, el crimen. Cristo Jesús soportó la cruz, despreciando la ignominia, nos dice la Carta a los Hebreos. Ahora está sentado a la derecha del trono de Dios. Por eso nos invita a no perder el ánimo en nuestra lucha contra el pecado. El salmo 39 nos invita a volvernos más bien hacia Dios, en la desgracia. Nos consuelan las palabras del salmista: "Dios se inclinó sobre mí para escuchar mi clamor... El asentó mis pies". Distinta esta actitud de confianza de la de los falsos agoreros que anuncian toda clase de desgracias sin proponer solución. Ya advirtió Juan XXIII que desconfiaríamos de los profetas de desgracias que se creen enviados por Dios para oscurecer nuestro universo.

El fuego que transforma. "He venido a prender fuego al mundo". El fuego era un elemento importante en la vida de Israel: para cocer los alimentos, para calentarse, para alumbrarse. También se servían de él para destruir lo que era contagioso y malo, como los ídolos. En el Templo se debía siempre mantener el fuego del altar de los holocaustos para los sacrificios. El fuego es frecuentemente relacionado con la aparición de Dios (a Moisés en una brasa ardiente, en la columna de fuego en el desierto, cuando Ezequiel es escogido como profeta, el día de Pentecostés en forma de lenguas de fuego...). El fuego es calor y luz, signo del Espíritu. El fuego está también ligado a la purificación de Dios y al juicio final. Es sin duda este aspecto del fuego del que Jesús habla cuando dice haber venido para traer fuego sobre la tierra. El fuego de su amor purificará el mundo el día de la Pasión, de ahí el deseo de Cristo: "¡Cuánto desearía que ya estuviera encendido!".

Jesús quiere que reaccionemos. "No he venido a traer la paz". Jesús quiere decir que no ha venido a traer la falsa paz. La paz verdadera no es la de la tranquilidad (cuando tranquilidad viene de tranca y de miedo), ni la paz de la falta de compromiso, ni la falsa paz basada en la injusticia. La verdad, la libertad y la justicia son difíciles de establecer en la tierra. El pacifismo cristiano no es aprobación del desorden o de la división. Para que "estalle" la paz es necesario provocar cierta violencia interior para no quedarnos tranquilos con nuestro cristianismo acomodado y aburguesado. Cristo viene a despertar nuestra conciencia, a provocarnos en cierto modo. La respuesta a esta provocación puede generar falta de comprensión en la familia. ¿Qué decir cuando un hijo opta por irse al Tercer Mundo o abraza la vocación sacerdotal o religiosa? En muchos casos se produce la división en la propia familia, "el padre contra el hijo y el hijo contra el padre, la madre contra la hija y la hija contra la madre". Jesucristo no ha venido al mundo para dejar las cosas como están, para tranquilizar nuestras conciencias, para que nos olvidemos de las sangrantes injusticias de nuestro mundo. La paz que El anuncia se basa en la justicia y en la lucha por la transformación de las estructuras injustas. No es simplemente ausencia de guerra, es trabajo constante para derribar lo que impide la consecución de un mundo más humano. Esa es nuestra misión la de crear ambientes de justicia, paz, solidaridad, amor etc. Bendecida semana para todos. Amen.

**Did you Know?**

Many victims of abuse don't report the abuse right away, if ever. Predators groom their victims, and part of this process is designed to make the victim feel like they should trust their predator, even more so than their own parents. Many victims also have a fear that their parents or trusted adults won't believe them, or that they will get in trouble for what happened — sometimes an abuser will threaten a child, using the child's fear to buy the child's silence. It's important for parents to teach their children to talk with their parents about what is happening to them, what might be frightening them, and that they will be supported in disclosing.



RCIA is the way to become Catholic. Adults approach the church for a variety of reasons and bring with them a personal history and richness of life experiences. The OLG RCIA Team responds with both information about the church and a formational process that introduces the individual to the message of Jesus, prayer, community, and service to others. The process invites participants to embark on a journey. There are stages on the way, crossroads, and crisis, rest stops, guides and companions who lead the way to the final destination. These companions are team members and sponsors, people from the parish who want to share their faith and walk with others as they discover what it means to be Catholic. Everyone is welcome to join. 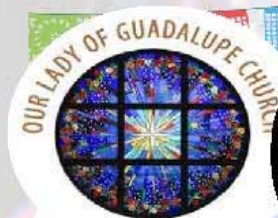
