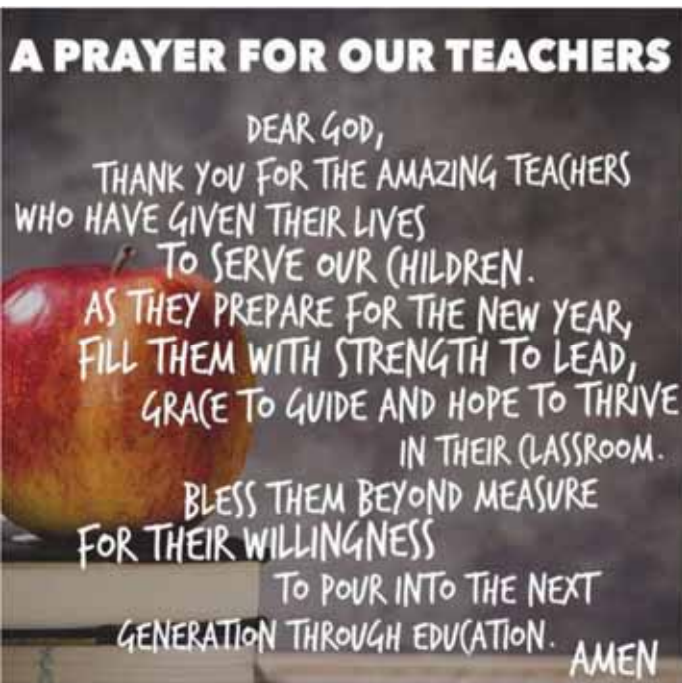

Note from Fr. Paul on Our Capital Campaign

On July 22, 2019, we met with the Archdiocese and presented to them the status of our fundraising for the “Building Our Faith” campaign. On August 5, 2019, we received notice that they did not approve our loan at that time. In subsequent conversations with the Archdiocese, they continued to express their strong support for our project. They understand our need, and the urgency to begin construction. They further indicate that they may be willing to give us a loan, even before we reach our goal of raising the cost of the entire project. (This is not their normal process, but they understand our urgency and need). Exactly how close to our total cost we need to get before they give us the loan, we do not know. For this reason, we will keep in constant contact with the Archdiocese to keep them updated on our progress, hoping to receive the approval as soon as possible. It is important for me to remind us, that even if we get approved for the loan before we have reached the more than \$3.8 million needed to fund the project, we will need to continue to raise new pledges and donations to completely pay back the loan.

Additionally, I would like to share, that in just the last few weeks since our meeting with the Archdiocese, we have received more than \$16,000 in new donations and more than \$360,000 in new pledges! Because of these recent blessings I am hopeful that we are close to getting approval. Our campaign totals to date are that we raised \$2,326,942 in cash on hand, and \$826,132 more in pledges. I am still asking every family to pledge what they prayerfully decide they can. In that prayerful decision, I ask that every family consider a pledge of at least \$2,000 over the next five years. That is about \$1 a day. To honor those (or their loved ones) who say yes to this request, we will be placing the names of all who have pledged \$2,000 or more (or the name of a loved one you wish to remember or honor) on top of the wall around our outdoor gathering area just outside the church exit. (For donations at the \$5,000 and \$10,000 levels there will be options to customize the names and have larger fonts). As pastor my goal is to begin construction as soon as possible, but also to have ALL our families contributing. We will all benefit from this project giving more space for our school and church ministries. Let’s work together, so that the new addition will remind us all that we are called to be Building the Kingdom of God together, united with each other and Christ, we can do great things! You may donate and make pledges using the blue envelopes in the pews, or on our website. The envelopes have the form by which you can make a pledge on the inside of the flap, and may also be used for a one-time donation although they do not specifically say so.

“La brisa y el abrigo”

En cierta ocasión hicieron una apuesta el agua, el viento y la brisa. El juego consistía en comprobar quién era el más hábil para que, un señor que caminaba todos los días por una calle, se quitara su valioso abrigo.

El viento, impetuoso, contestó: ¡yo seré quien lo consiga! Cogió fuerza y sopló sobre aquel señor que se paseaba con su flamante abrigo. Éste, al sentir el aire, agarró fuertemente con sus manos el abrigo para que no se lo llevara aquella corriente traicionera.

Al día siguiente le tocó el turno al agua. Pensó; si descargo con furia sobre este señor, no le quedará otro remedio que desprenderse del abrigo si no quiere estropearlo. Y así fue. Comenzó a llover con intensidad. Pero, el señor del abrigo sacó un paraguas de un bolsillo y además logró cobijarse en unos porches a tiempo.

No muchos días después, entre sonrisas y burlas, le tocó el turno a la brisa. Ésta era humilde, constante en aquello que se proponía y no solía maltratar a nadie. Cuando se dio cuenta de que, aquel señor, pasaba por la calle... comenzó a ser lo que siempre quiso ser: suave brisa con un poco de calor. El señor al sentir la presencia de una brisa tan agradable se dijo: “qué bien se va por esta calle”. Y se quitó el valioso abrigo.

Así es la oración que quiere Jesús. Confiada y suave. Constante y persistente. El Señor, que no se deja ganar en generosidad, nos da todo aquello que le pedimos con una condición: que lo hagamos con delicadeza, a tiempo y destiempo pero con amor. Como la brisa lo hizo con el abrigo de aquel paseante. Y, el Señor, nos abraza con su mano, con su paz y con su presencia. Se desprende de todo lo que haga falta... cuando lo pedimos con humildad y cariño.

Las lecturas de este domingo nos invitan a la persistencia en nuestra vida cristiana, perseverancia en nuestros buenos propósitos y que lo llevemos a cabo. Es su misericordia la que recibimos, pero debemos quererla y trabajarla en nuestras vidas y así entrar siempre por la puerta angosta, parece difícil. Pero con la perseverancia nos acostumbraremos a ver esa posibilidad muy cerca siempre.

El Evangelio siempre será una fuente o un manantial de los más elementales y óptimos valores a los que el mundo puede aspirar. Pero para eso... no vino precisamente Jesucristo. -Vino para recordarnos que hay un Dios que nos ama con locura y que espera que en nuestros caminos le dejemos caminar junto a nosotros.

-Vino para hacernos saber que Dios perdona faltas y pecados, limitaciones y fragilidades pero que -por si lo hemos olvidado- también da a cada uno lo suyo por su única y magnánima justicia.

-Vino para recordarnos que, si somos hijos de Dios, somos hermanos y que por lo tanto estamos llamados a dar el callo a favor de la justicia y de la atención a los más necesitados.

-Vino, en definitiva, a darnos una palabra de aliento y de esperanza, de salvación y de optimismo que se sostiene en la seguridad de que hay un Dios que trasciende y deja pequeños nuestros pobres e interesados planteamientos.

¿Serán muchos o pocos los que se salven? Tal vez, hoy y aquí, es el momento de clarificar conceptos. El hombre no se salva por sus obras ni Dios es tan bueno como para llegar a ser “tonto”. La cuestión es saber si en el centro de todo lo que hacemos, decimos, pensamos y construimos... vamos poniendo a Dios o nos vamos pregonando a nosotros mismos. Con perseverancia en nuestras obras, pero siempre, no cuando estamos en apuros. Dios nos ha hecho para la vida del amor, a nosotros, al prójimo, a nuestra familia. Busquemos su bien y su justicia. Amen.

Did You Know?

Many victims of abuse don't report the abuse right away, if ever. Predators groom their victims, and part of this process is designed to make the victim feel like they should trust their predator, even more so than their own parents. Many victims also have a fear that their parents or trusted adults won't believe them, or that they will get in trouble for what happened — sometimes an abuser will threaten a child, using the child's fear to buy the child's silence. It's important for parents to teach their children to talk with their parents about what is happening to them, what might be frightening them, and that they will be supported in disclosing.



RCIA is the way to become Catholic. Adults approach the church for a variety of reasons and bring with them a personal history and richness of life experiences. The OLG RCIA Team responds with both information about the church and a formational process that introduces the individual to the message of Jesus, prayer, community, and service to others. The process invites participants to embark on a journey. There are stages on the way, crossroads, and crisis, rest stops, guides and companions who lead the way to the final destination. These companions are team members and sponsors, people from the parish who want to share their faith and walk with others as they discover what it means to be Catholic. Everyone is welcome to join. 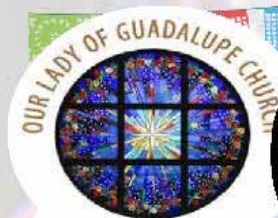
