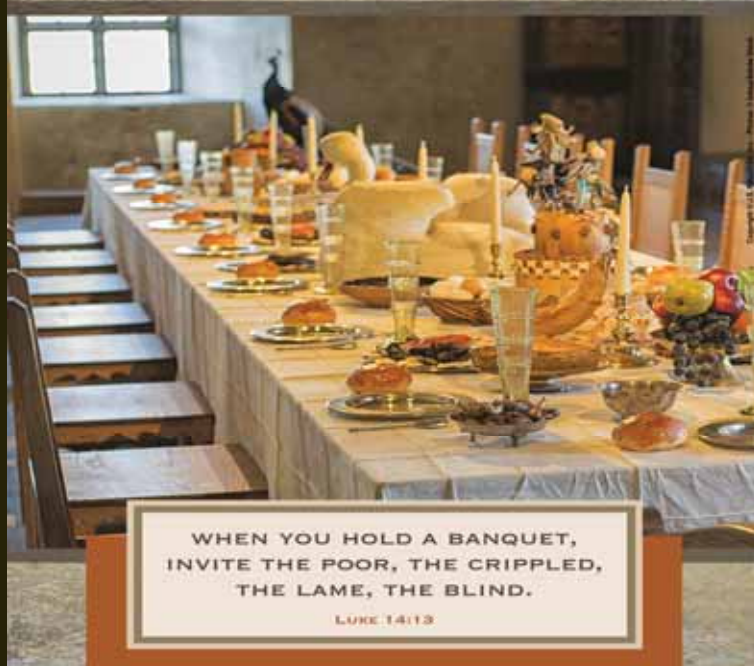

The Church has celebrated Mary's birth since at least the sixth century. A September birth was chosen because the Easter church begins its Church year with September. The September 8 date helped determine the date for the feast of the Immaculate Conception on December 8.

Scripture does not give an account of Mary's birth. However, the apocryphal Protoevangelium of James fills in the gap. This work has no historical value, but it does reflect the development of Christian piety. According to this account, Anna and Joachim are infertile but pray for a child. They receive the promise of a child who will advance God's plan of salvation for the world. Such a story, like many biblical counterparts, stresses the special presence of God in Mary's life from the beginning. St. Augustine connects Mary's birth with Jesus' saving work. He tells the earth to rejoice and shine forth in the light of her birth. "She is the flower of the field from whom bloomed the precious lily of the valley. Through her birth the nature inherited from our first parents is changed". The opening prayer at Mass speaks of the birth of Mary's Son as the dawn of or salvation, and asks for an increase of peace.

¿HABLO MUCHO DE MI ?

Hablar mucho, presumir de lo que uno tiene, de lo que uno hace es lo que se llama mucho ruido y pocas nueces, o dime de qué presumes y te diré de lo que careces, leamos esto, que habla de humildad, de hablar mucho porque precisamente tiene poco en su interior. Se llama la anécdota, la carreta vacía... Caminab con mi padre cuando él se detuvo en una curva y después de un pequeño silencio me preguntó: Además del cantar de los pájaros, ¿escuchas alguna cosa más? Agudicé mis oídos y algunos segundos después le respondí: Estoy escuchando el ruido de una carreta. Eso es -dijo mi padre-. Es una carreta vacía. Pregunté a mi padre: ¿Cómo sabes que es una carreta vacía, si aún no la vemos? Entonces mi padre respondió: Es muy fácil saber cuándo una carreta está vacía, por el ruido. Cuanto más vacía la carreta, mayor es el ruido que hace. Me convertí en adulto, y ahora, cuando veo a una persona hablando demasiado, interrumpiendo la conversación de todos, siendo inoportuna o violenta, presumiendo de lo que tiene, sintiéndose prepotente y haciendo de menos a la gente, tengo la impresión de oír la voz de mi padre diciendo: «Cuanto más vacía la carreta, mayor es el ruido que hace». La humildad consiste en callar nuestras virtudes y permitirle a los demás descubrirlas. Nadie está más vacío que aquel que está lleno de sí mismo. Por lo busquemos el camino de la humildad. La humildad es una virtud rara, porque pocos son los humanos que la asumen sincera y completamente. La

soberbia es lo contrario de la humildad y es uno de los mayores motivos de separación de Dios. La soberbia nace precisamente en personas que, tal vez, llevan un camino aceptable de perfección, pero que un exceso de autoestima los lleva a soñar y fantasear. Sería el caso del fariseo que rezaba en el lugar más importante del templo agradeciendo a Dios lo que bueno que era él mismo, cuando "el único bueno es Dios". La soberbia impide ejercitar el perdón de las ofensas y son frecuentes tremendos enfrentamientos entre familiares que llevan incluso a la destrucción de las familias. No es ocioso pedir a Dios todos los días para que nos libre de caer en las redes demoníacas de la soberbia. Hay, no obstante, situaciones de vanagloria menos graves que tampoco son útiles para el cristiano. Una conformidad permanente con nuestra forma de ser o de actuar nos impedirá profundizar en los fallos personales y en errores nuestros en el trato con los hermanos. Se da mucho en gente religiosa que se siente feliz de no ser "malos como los otros" y, sin embargo, lo que están haciendo es aproximarse al fariseo del relato evangélico. Si adoramos a Dios, si aceptamos todos los días su grandeza y misericordia, vamos a entender rápidamente nuestra poquedad y de ahí nacerá el reconocimiento de que somos poca cosa. Si miramos a nuestro alrededor Podemos encontrarnos con gentes ejemplares que desde una vida consagrada a Cristo estén trabajando al servicio de los más pobres, de enfermos de difícil trato o de peor aspecto. Y que, sin embargo, el "milagro" reside en que esas personas no se envanezcan íntimamente y sean capaces de pensar que el trabajo de un padre de familia para sacar adelante a su gente sea más importante que el suyo. En el reconocimiento de lo limitado de nuestra misión y, además, poner nuestros ojos en la grandeza de Dios-- aparecerá un buen camino de humildad para nuestra vida. La suprema humildad es cuando Dios -la Segunda Persona de la Trinidad— se anonadó hasta encarnarse en un hombre que terminó muriendo en la Cruz en unas condiciones terribles. No hay humildad mayor que esa. El camino hacia el Gólgota es un ejemplo completo de humildad y entrega. Jesús, no obstante, con su notable capacidad de maestro trazó enseñanzas concretas y afectas a la vida cotidiana para que lo entendiéramos mejor. Él era -ciertamente— el mayor ejemplo de humildad, pero no era cuestión -sin, además, haberse completado su misión en la Tierra— de ponerse de ejemplo. Los ejemplos de puestos principales en banquetes, bodas y celebraciones son muy habituales. Busquemos servir a los demás, pensemos en las necesidades de otros y no solo las mías. Amen.

¿SABÍA QUE?

El tipo correcto de contacto es importante para los niños

Los niños a menudo son naturalmente cariñosos y confiados, y esto puede llevar a abrazos o contactos inesperados que indican su amor por los adultos en sus vidas. Para los adultos que son conscientes de que un poco de contacto físico puede ser inapropiado o puede parecer una violación de los límites aunque el niño lo haya iniciado, puede ser difícil responder en estos casos. Es importante enseñar a los niños cuáles son los contactos saludables y apropiados. Como padre de familia, puede usar algunos momentos con sus hijos para afirmar su afecto hacia ellos con palabras y ejemplos de contactos apropiados seguidos de una descripción. Algunos ejemplos podrían incluir darle una palmadita a un niño en el hombro o la espalda, chocar las manos (high fives), tomar las manos del niño o la niña al salir del salón de clases o al cruzar la calle, o ayudar a un niño/a pequeño/a a amarrarse los cordones de los zapatos.

TERESA OF CALCUTTA

Feast Day: September 5
Canonized: September 4, 2016
Beatified: October 19, 2003
Venerated: December 20, 2002

On August 26, 1910, Mother Teresa was born Agnes Gonxha Bojaxhiu in Skopje, Macedonia. As a young girl she was very involved in parish activities, and her mother told her many stories of missionaries, who inspired her greatly. In 1928, at age 18, Agnes joined the missionary order of the Sisters of Loreto in Dublin, Ireland. There she was given the name Sister Mary Teresa.

As a young Sister in 1929 she traveled to Calcutta (today known as Kolkata), India, to teach at a school for girls. She continued to teach at various schools in India for 20 years. During that time, she was deeply moved by the number of sick and dying people on the streets.

On September 10, 1946, while traveling by train to Darjeeling, Sister Mary Teresa experienced a "call within a call." She felt called to be God's love in action: to serve the sick and dying, the hungry and homeless.

She received permission to leave the Loreto convent. Then she sought medical training and became determined to serve the poorest of the poor.

Eventually, she was joined by other women. Some of these women were her former students and they helped her serve the poor. In 1950 she established an order of religious women called the Missionaries of Charity.

Over time the Missionaries of Charity have built centers throughout the world. In 1979 Mother Teresa, as she was known by then, received the Nobel Peace Prize. She captivated the world as few other people have. Her simple message was: "We are put on earth to do something beautiful for God."

Pope John Paul II chose October 19, 2003, as the date for the beatification of Mother Teresa. The ceremony was a celebration for the entire world. Mother Teresa's life of holiness is respected on a global scale. Her example of humble and loving service is admired by millions of people.

The process that led to Mother's Teresa's beatification was the shortest in modern history. Ordinarily, the cause for beatification cannot begin until five years after the candidate's death. However, Pope John Paul II advanced the cause of Mother Teresa soon after her death on September 5, 1997. The pope explained that he was making an exception because of widespread admiration for the tiny nun.

Mother Teresa's spiritual vitality can be described with these words. "Don't search for God in faraway lands. He is not there. He is close to you. He is with you. Just keep that lamp burning, and you will always see him."
