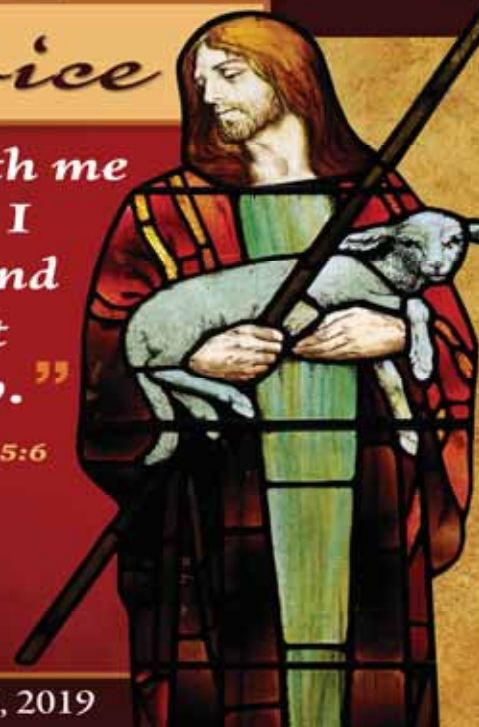

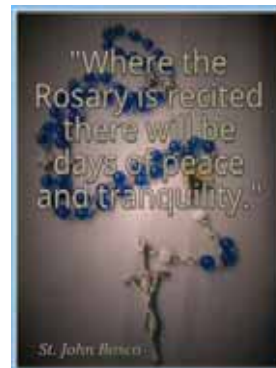

Feast of St. Joseph of Cupertino, Patron Saint of the Conventual Franciscan Province

St. Joseph was a simple man who struggled with studies and was never really successful in tasks of this world. God blessed this simple man with a profound sanctity and awe. In the midst of these ecstasies Joseph would rise from the ground, and move about in the air. In the church especially this would come upon him; he would fly towards the altar or over it, or to a shrine on a special festival. A little thing would suffice to bring about these levitation's; a word of praise of the Creator and His creature, of the beauty of the sky or of the trees on the roadside, and away Joseph would go. Because of his many 'flights', St. Joseph is the patron saint of those traveling by air, astronauts, and is the patron saint of pilots who fly for the NATO Alliance. He is the patron of paratroopers and those serving in the Air Force. He is known as a patron saint of students, having struggled with being a poor student himself. It was naturally fitting that in 1981, the Province of Conventual Franciscans in California adopted him as their patron. This mystic and simple friar is an example for us that nothing is impossible for God (His relics are under our Altar in our church). Please join us for Mass on Tuesday, September 18, 2019 at 8AM.

¿NO TENEMOS LA HUMILDAD DE DEJARNOS AMAR TIERNAMENTE POR DIOS?

Un relato sobre las bondades de Dios en nuestra vida... si lo dejamos entrar en ella

Un joven que fue criado como ateo estaba entrenando para saltos ornamentales a nivel olímpico. La única influencia religiosa que recibió en su vida le había llegado a través de un amigo cristiano. El deportista no prestaba mayor atención a los "sermones" de su amigo, aunque los escuchaba con frecuencia. Una noche, fue a la piscina de la universidad a la que pertenecía. Las luces estaban todas apagadas, pero como la noche estaba clara y la luna brillaba, había suficiente luz para practicar y decidió hacerlo sin encender la luz. El joven se subió al trampolín más alto y en el momento en que volvió la espalda a la piscina al filo de la rampa y extendió sus brazos, vio su propia sombra en la pared. La sombra de su cuerpo tenía la forma exacta de una cruz. Esta imagen lo sorprendió tanto que, en lugar de saltar, se arrodilló en la misma rampa y finalmente le pidió a Dios que entrara en su vida. Mientras el joven permanecía quieto rezando, el personal de limpieza ingresó y encendió las luces... **Habían vaciado la piscina para repararla.**

El texto de Lucas nos ofrece tres parábolas de Jesús que son praxis, declaración programática del Reino que esperamos, y, sobre todo, espejo del amor de Dios por sus criaturas. Nos llega más la del Hijo Pródigo por su cercanía, por su plasticidad, sin duda. Y, tal vez, también por esa magnífica pintura del maestro Rembrandt que acoge, en un ambiente de una cierta penumbra al huido y tapa su humanidad arrodillada por la fuerza de sus brazos de padre amoroso. Pero no hemos olvidar --¡para nada!--ninguna de las otras dos. ¿Verdaderamente alguno de nosotros abandonaría las cien ovejas para ir a buscar a la perdida? ¿No nos buscaríamos algún modo alternativo como por ejemplo mandar a un amigo a buscar de la extraviada?, ¿mientras que nosotros guardamos la totalidad de nuestro capital --las 99 ovejas--no vaya a ser qué...se pierda todo? Y parece menos "fuerte" la de las diez monedas. Sin duda, una mujer comprometida con su hacienda hará limpieza general para recuperar la pieza perdida, pues, sin duda, le ayudará a cumplir su presupuesto doméstico, aunque --creo yo--es poco probable que anuncie a los cuatro vientos la pérdida y recuperación de la moneda. Pero tanto da. La cuestión es ilustrar la frase principal de Jesús: la alegría sin límite por la conversión de un solo pecador. Dios, nuestro Jesús, los cuenta uno a uno a los que vuelven al redil, aunque, ya lo sabemos, todos pasamos lista uno a uno ante su mirada. No somos un número o un anónimo. Somos un viejo amigo, conocido desde hace años, sobre el que no puede tolerar la ausencia, el abandono.

Jesús de Nazaret vino al mundo a convertir a un pueblo que se había alejado del mensaje original de Dios, que se había enfrascado en una religión política, fuertemente estructurada, que había terminado por desfigurar la verdadera esencia de Dios que no es otra que la del Dios del Amor. Los judíos de tiempos de Jesús, forzados por los estatutos de la religión oficial, ya sólo adoraban a la norma y con ella habían metido a Dios en una jaula de oro. El hundimiento de esa sociedad y el alejamiento de Dios era total, de una profundidad que, prácticamente, les convertía en paganos en adoradores de las piedad del Templo y de los libros de culto, olvidando a la gente, olvidando el amor que Dios tiene por sus criaturas.

Hay también hoy una necesidad grande de predicar el Reino de Dios y su llegada a todos nosotros. Es necesario recuperar las ovejas perdidas, las monedas extraviadas o los hijos que se han escapado. Pero nosotros no tenemos la humildad de dejarnos amar por Dios, porque nos apartamos de Dios porque endurecemos nuestro corazón, si creyéramos lo que Jesús nos dice del Padre, estaríamos gustando siempre de su misericordia y su perdón, no nos damos cuenta que nos espera siempre.

Abramos nuestro corazón de par en par y dejemos entrar el amor, todo el amor, que nuestro Padre nos ofrece. ¿No tenemos la humildad de dejarnos amar tiernamente por Dios?

¿Sabías?

Como miembros de la comunidad católica, cada uno de nosotros puede contribuir a la sanación de aquellos afectados por el abuso, especialmente recordando a las víctimas-sobrevivientes en nuestras oraciones. Oramos por las personas perjudicadas por alguien, ya sea en la iglesia, la familia, la escuela o la comunidad, confiando en que la sanación es posible y conscientes de que todos podemos trabajar para prevenir el abuso. La Arquidiócesis de Los Angeles, inspirada en la visión de una víctima-sobreviviente, ha creado una tarjeta de oración e información como un símbolo tangible y accesible para la comunidad y como apoyo para los necesitados. Por favor, únase a este esfuerzo y a nuestra esperanza de que los recursos y la oración en la tarjeta lleguen a quienes los necesitan, para que la luz sanadora de Cristo llegue y sane lo más profundo de su dolor. La tarjeta de oración bilingüe y los posters multilingües, que incluyen información sobre cómo denunciar el abuso, se han distribuido a todas las parroquias y están disponibles para descargar en protect.la-archdiocese.org.

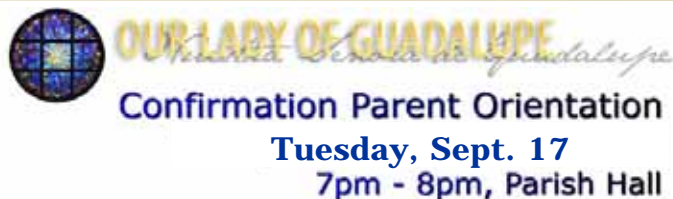
