

On all Saints Day we remember and celebrate the communion of Saints—our unity of all Saints both earth and heaven. It is our day, to be mindful of what we are called to be—*SAINTS*.

8:00AM, Friday, November 1st (English) and *7:00PM November 1st (Spanish)* Please join us.

Looking to the Last Day

On Saturday, November 2, the Church remembers all who have walked the way of Christ and passed from this life. The readings all look to the last day, when we shall all rise from the dead and be reunited. The prophet Daniel announces words of warning and welfare. He cautions us against the judgment to come, but he also comforts us and assures us that all who live a life of virtue and justice will find life eternal. The reading from Romans reminds us that, because of Christ's passion, death, and resurrection and our entrance into that paschal mystery through baptism, we now share in the new life won by Christ. This recognition has repercussions: we need to live righteously now, that we might rise to life forever with Christ on the last day. In the Gospel Jesus pledges that all the Father has given him will not be lost. All the faithful will be raised to joy and live forever in the presence of God. Please join us for Mass on **Saturday, November 2nd at 8AM in English** As in the previous years, you are welcome to bring a picture of your lost loved one and place it on the altar.

Our Recently Departed

The Book of the Dead will be at the center of our parish worship place during the Novena for All Souls Day. Please take a moment and look through the book. This book reminds us all to pray for those who have gone home to the Father before us. November is the month of the faithful departed. Life, safety, and happiness with Christ are the blessings we beg from God as we pray for the departed. It is “a...hold and wholesome thought to pray for the dead...” (2Mac 12:45). The Letter to the Ephesians affirms that these blessings also come to us, the living.”...”You are the light in the Lord. Live as children of Light” (Eph 5:8). In the Light we find every kind of goodness and truth, this is our prayer for all the faithful departed and for ourselves as well.

EL ORGULLOSO CON SU “YO” Y EL HUMILDE CON DIOS

Todos necesitamos de todos y vivimos de todos, aunque estemos inflados de orgullo y vanidad.-- Unas veces somos tan “farisaicos” que nos cuesta muy poco y casi nada traspasar los límites y ajustar cuentas con el mismo Dios sin percarnos que todo nos viene de Él.--En otras ocasiones sale a relucir la humildad que llevamos dentro y optamos por ponernos al final del templo sacando de la maleta los más viejos y negativos recuerdos sin reflexionar que Dios hace tiempo que los olvidó.

--Aunque, ciertamente, hay otros tantos hermanos nuestros que se sitúan tan al fondo de la iglesia que parecen estar (más que ante Dios) jugando al escondite con el Espíritu Santo o, simplemente, cumpliendo para luego marchar cuanto antes para continuar viviendo sin más trascendencia.

Uno y otro, el orgulloso del humilde, se distinguen por algo en esta parábola que nos presenta Jesús: el primero hablaba desde la arrogancia y el segundo, en cambio, desde el corazón. Lo mismo, en una dirección u otra, nos podemos reflejar también nosotros:

*Si vivimos nuestra fe como un simple código de normas... somos fariseo

*Si nos sentimos sostenidos por la mano de Dios... somos publicano

*Si sacamos las medallas al mérito... somos fariseo

*Si buscamos en el trasfondo de todo lo que hemos realizado a Dios....somos publicano

*Si nos sentimos los mejores y los auténticos... somos fariseo

*Si intentamos vivir y pensar en Dios sin comparaciones... somos publicano

En cuántas ocasiones acudimos a la iglesia intentando buscar a Dios y, sin darnos cuenta, ponemos un espejo delante de nosotros para auto complacernos con la caridad que hicimos o con el ramillete de oraciones contabilizadas en el disco duro de nuestra memoria.

Dios, en cambio, saborea y disfruta con la naturalidad y espontaneidad de sus hijos. Sabe, mucho antes de que nos instalemos en su presencia, con qué disfraces venimos y con qué traje deseamos salir de nuevo a la vida. Dios, que tiene de ingenio todo, va al fondo del corazón. Y en el corazón es donde El disfruta y goza con nosotros. En el corazón del creyente no existen las cuentas pendientes ni los reproches. En el corazón humilde es donde hemos de aprender a buscar y guardar la voz de un Dios que valora y potencia la humildad como una gran autopista para ir más deprisa a su encuentro.

Pidamos a Dios que ese “yo” que se siente seguro de sí mismo, que se cree mejor que todo el mundo, más perfecto en todo, más rico, más inteligente, más experto en la vid
