

Vivir de las apariencias o vivir en la verdad

Una vez conocí a una persona para la que su fundamental preocupación era mantener su imagen. El tiempo que me tocó vivir cerca de él, me di cuenta de que era un trabajo agotador. Tenía que estar todo el día en guardia, tenía que decir la mentira oportuna a la persona oportuna en el momento justo, tenía que disimular continuamente. Aquella persona no se podía permitir expresar nunca lo que sentía de verdad. Siempre iba como cubierto con una coraza que, supongo, le debía ser incómoda y a la vez pesar muchísimo y resultar muy incómoda. De aquel modo lograba el aplauso de la gente. Pero ciertamente pagaba un precio muy alto. Demasiado alto, No era el mismo, era lo que otros querían de él.

La historia de Zaqueo es parecida. Por lo que nos dice el Evangelio, era un hombre rico. De entrada eso ya nos habla de una persona que tiene una buena imagen. La imagen social se hace a base de tener una buena casa y un buen coche, vivir en un buen barrio y disponer de fondos en el banco. A esas personas, los empleados de los bancos los tratan con respeto. Zaqueo era un hombre rico. Zaqueo había conseguido el respeto de los que vivían con él. Pero sabía que ese respeto era más por temor que por amor. Le tenían respeto pero no cariño. Porque su riqueza, probablemente, había sido amasada a base de hacer harina a los demás. Zaqueo era un publicano, uno que se dedicaba a recaudar los impuestos para los opresores romanos a cambio de quedarse con un tanto por ciento. Había hecho su riqueza a base de oprimir a sus vecinos. Zaqueo sabía que su imagen era sólo apariencia, que si le cedían el paso cuando le encontraban por la calle no era porque le amasen. En absoluto. Más bien, le odiaban. Zaqueo se había esforzado mucho por triunfar pero la verdad era que no lo había logrado. Para nada.

De repente, Jesús pasa por su vida. Porque Jesús es el enviado de Dios y Dios, como dice la primera lectura, ama todo lo que es suyo. Y Zaqueo es suyo. Zaqueo es hijo de Dios. Dios le quiere mostrar el buen camino, lo que tiene que hacer para triunfar de verdad en la vida. Hoy Dios va a pasar por su casa. Jesús se lo dice con claridad. "Hoy me voy a quedar contigo". Jesús le va a hacer de espejo. Mirando a Jesús, Zaqueo se da cuenta de que ha perdido el tiempo y de que su aparente éxito en la vida no es más que un estrepitoso fracaso. Pero Jesús es su oportunidad. Dios le visita y le ofrece un nuevo comienzo. Menos mal que Zaqueo no fue tonto. Abrió su corazón a la salvación que Dios le ofrecía. Aceptó la realidad de su fracaso y reorientó su vida. Empezó a construir de nuevo su futuro pero esta vez apoyado en la realidad: no en el cuidado de la imagen y las apariencias sino en el amor y en la confianza en Dios.

Claro esta imagen de cobrador le daba una posición, pero a la vez también recibía de parte de muchos un repudio o por lo menos no les caía bien. A veces nuestra imagen no es la que Dios nos ha dado, hemos pensado cual es la verdadera imagen de Dios en mi vida? Lo que realmente es muy claro aquí es que Zaqueo quería cambiar su imagen, se cansó, y la llegada de Jesucristo le da la oportunidad de buscar algo nuevo, y sí que se esforzó para que Jesús lo vea y lo acoja, definitivamente el cambio en el corazón es lo que primero debemos buscar eso botara todas nuestras máscaras y pinturas usadas para mantener la falsa apariencia. También estamos invitados a eso hoy, Zaqueo y otros muchos son nuestros ejemplos de nuevas vidas junto a Dios.

¿ Me preocupo de las apariencias y del qué dirán tanto como para olvidarme de la realidad de mi vida? Hoy Jesús me está mirando y me dice que quiere quedarse en mi casa ¿qué le voy a responder? ¿No me está dando la oportunidad de cambiar algunas cosas? ¿Cuales?

Did you Know

Diocesan Clergy (ICP)

As part of our long-standing commitment to provide pastoral care and to support the healing process for victim-survivors, the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, along with five other dioceses in California, is participating in the new Independent Compensation Program by the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, Diocese of Fresno, Diocese of Orange, Diocese of Sacramento, Diocese of San Bernardino, and Diocese of San Diego for Victim-Survivors of Sexual Abuse of Minors by Priests (ICP). The ICP is administered independently of the Church by Kenneth Feinberg and Camille Biros, widely recognized as premier dispute resolution administrators in the country. The program is now accepting registrations from any person who has been sexually abused as a minor by diocesan priests of the participating dioceses, no matter when that abuse might have occurred. Funding for the program in our Archdiocese will come from self-insured reserves, monies set aside for this purpose. We pray that this new program might provide another avenue toward healing and hope.
