Can It be? The Holiday Season is Around the Corner!




Thanksgiving Mass

LA PARADOJA DE LA VIUDA POBRE

La dificultad de algunas personas para tener el poder del Espíritu Santo es como la de aquella niña que fue a la sala de estar y tomó un vaso griego de porcelana metiendo la mano por su estrecho cuello para sacar una moneda que vio en su fondo, de la que se apoderó con destreza. Al comprobar que no podía sacar la mano llamó a su madre, pero ésta tampoco pudo conseguir que la niña la sacara. Llamó al padre, y éste tampoco pudo. Finalmente, la madre comprendió en qué consistía la dificultad y dijo a la niña: - María abre bien tu mano, ponla estirada y papá tirará del brazo y te la sacará. La niña miró a su padre y dijo: - Papá, si lo hago así se caerá la moneda. Padre y madre se echaron a reír pues comprendieron la razón de la aparente dificultad. Así es con muchas personas que retienen en sus corazones cosas que no quieren soltar. La viuda pobre tenía solo eso y lo supo soltar. Llama la atención que Jesús no diga: "Esa pobre viuda no debería haber echado nada en el canasto." Se refiere, sin embargo, al acto de suprema generosidad, que es entregar para el culto a Dios lo que era necesario y no superfluo. Los pobres, los desheredados, los marginados, los pecadores también deben ayudar a la Iglesia, igual que los ricos, los guapos, los triunfadores o los que se consideran justos y buenos. Igual, unos que otros, en cuanto al gesto de aportar y, obviamente, no igual respecto a la cantidad. A veces quienes reciben ayuda material de la Iglesia pueden negar a la Casa de Dios, en cualquier momento, su ayuda personal. Y eso no es justo. Incluso, si se quiere ver así, resulta discriminatorio para la Iglesia. Todos somos iguales ante la Madre Iglesia y todos debemos de atenderla y cuidarla. Si la Iglesia -- todos los días -- reza por nosotros, hemos de hacerlo igualmente por ella y sus necesidades. Es verdad que todos somos Iglesia y por eso aparece esa igualdad que obliga a ricos y pobres. Jesús valoró la pequeña limosna de la viuda pobre, pero no aconsejó que no diera su moneda de dos reales. Es una enseñanza para meditar y entender que todos somos iguales en el Templo. A veces, pues, no solo hay que "obligar" a los ricos a esa igualdad, a los pobres también. Pero tampoco es lícito obviar en el tema de la pobreza las desigualdades o abusos que producen la pobreza. Jesús dijo que siempre tendríamos pobres con nosotros. Pero lo deseable es que algunos de los pobres que se acercan a nosotros dejen de serlo. Con ello, sin duda, no se terminarán, pero habremos ido resolviendo los problemas que nos llegan. Y tendremos la oportunidad de ayudar a nueva gente con problemas que llegue a nosotros. Y hay otra cuestión: hay personas dentro de la Iglesia que desprecian la limosna que llamaríamos inmediata... ¿Hay que dar algo al mendigo --o mendiga-- que pide a la puerta de nuestra parroquia? ¿O es una fórmula de implementar la vagancia? Pues no, siempre --en la inmensa mayoría de los casos-- la gente pide porque lo necesita. Se ha dicho que es mejor enseñar a pescar, que dar un pez. ¿Pero ese pez no vendrá a resolver un problema de inmediata hambre y después habrá que intentar lo de la enseñanza? Claro podemos también ayudar no necesariamente a ese que está a la entrada del templo, pero si conocemos personas que realmente son pobres aun trabajando tienen necesidades a esas personas específicas que conozco ahí debe ir mi ayuda, y así no tendré dudas si estoy fomentando la pereza o la vagancia. A veces ponemos nuestras excusas, busquemos a esa familia, o persona que no me está pidiendo y que realmente está necesitado. La viuda del relato evangélico no hizo tantas suposiciones respecto al momento y fin de su limosna, su misericordia le llevó a dar más de lo superfluo, a darlo todo. Jesús de Nazaret cuando ponía el ejemplo de la viuda no estaba creando un tratado sobre la pobreza o sobre la justicia social, advertía, sin embargo, la grandeza de un corazón, eso es lo que necesitamos practicar la grandeza de nuestro corazón. Paz y Bien.

Entendiendo las tácticas de engaño de los abusadores

A los abusadores sexuales les gusta engañar a todos a su alrededor. Y para muchas personas, es duro reconocer la realidad de que existen depredadores entre nosotros, y, que usualmente se trata de las personas que menos esperamos. Muchos abusadores utilizan sus posiciones de confianza en la comunidad, como entrenadores de deportes, profesores, líderes de organizaciones, para encontrar y atraer a sus víctimas, y ellos cuentan con que la importancia de sus posiciones les sirva para que no exista sospecha contra ellos. Entender los distintos tipos de engaño utilizados por un abusador nos ayuda a saber reconocer las alertas y señales de potencial abuso.

Understanding the deception tactics of abusers Sex abusers are out to deceive everyone around them. And for many people, it's hard to acknowledge the reality that predators are among us, and, are often the last people we expect. Many abusers utilize trusted positions in the community — coaches, teachers, organization leaders — to find and groom victims, and they count on the esteem of their positions to excuse them from any suspicion. Understanding the layers of deception utilized by an abuser helps us have a better handle on recognizing red flags and signs of potential abuse.
