AL FINAL, SE IMPONDRÁ LA JUSTICIA MISERICORDIOSA DE DIOS

Algo que en nuestras vidas es necesario es albergar siempre en nosotros la **ESPERANZA**: Al jubilarse cierto fabricante de cosméticos, se le pidió que revelara el secreto de su éxito. Al principio rehusó; sin embargo, al festejar el cumplimiento de sus setenta y cinco años de edad, después de un poco de insistencia, decidió compartirlo. Dijo: “Además de las fórmulas usadas por otros consultores de belleza, usé un ingrediente mágico: nunca les prometí a las mujeres que mis cosméticos las harían hermosas, sólo les di esperanza”.

Es necesario predicarnos a nosotros mismos acerca de la esperanza, por más desesperante situación, siempre viene la calma, no olvidemos, revestirnos de la Esperanza Cristiana y humana, todo es posible si nosotros decidimos tomar a Dios de la mano y luchar contra nuestras situaciones difíciles.

Prediquémosles acerca de Cristo, la redención, la reconciliación y la renovación espiritual. Que nuestras palabras sean de vida, de esperanza y de paz.

Con nuestra perseverancia salvaremos nuestras almas. Se impondrá la justicia misericordiosa de Dios, al final de la vida de cada uno y al final de los tiempos. Cuando Lucas escribe su texto evangélico, después del año 70, las primeras comunidades cristianas estaban totalmente desconcertadas y oprimidas. Se retrasaba la segunda venida, la parusía, y a ellos les perseguían, les entregaban a las sinagogas y a la cárcel, les hacían comparecer ante reyes y emperadores, y todo porque estaban siendo fieles a la predicación del evangelio de Jesús. El evangelista Lucas quiere animar a estos cristianos desanimados y les pide que se mantengan firmes en la fe, porque todas esas desgracias tenían que venir primero, pero el final no vendrá enseguida. Si perseveran salvarán sus almas. Y claro que la mayor parte de ellos perseveraron y hoy les veneramos como santos y como mártires. Desde entonces hasta ahora se ha repetido bastantes veces la creencia en que el final de los tiempos ya estaba llegando, pero Dios, por lo que hemos visto, no parece tener prisa. Lo importante para cada uno de nosotros no es saber cuándo llegará el momento final, sino vivir cada momento con fidelidad al evangelio, con paciencia y con perseverancia, como si fuera el momento final. Cuando estemos demasiado asustados por la dureza y crueldad de los tiempos en los que nos toca vivir, recordemos las palabras tranquilizadoras de santa Teresa: “nada te turbe, nada te espante, Dios no se muda, la paciencia todo lo alcanza, sólo Dios basta”. Aprendamos a vivir siempre con paz interior, con confianza en la palabra del Señor, dejando a Dios ser Dios, y actuando nosotros con fuerza y perseverancia cristiana, como si fuera el momento último de nuestra vida, a pesar de todas las desgracias que puedan ocurrirnos, a nosotros y a nuestra sociedad en general.

Con San Pablo podemos concluir que, mientras no sucede ese momento, nos toca dar testimonio y trabajar para que el Señor, y su mensaje, sean conocidos. ¿Hacemos todo lo posible para que el evangelio sea más extendido en todos los rincones de nuestro mundo?

Recuerdo ahora que El Papa Benedicto XVI en su corto pero intenso viaje apostólico a España nos dejó la siguiente reflexión: “Dios tiene que volver a resonar bajo los cielos”. Para ello, hoy más que nunca, es necesario presentar a Dios mismo como esa luz que ilumina toda sombra y que indica con sabiduría el horizonte que al hombre espera. Nuestro esfuerzo y creatividad, siempre sustentado todo en la inspiración del Espíritu Santo, ha de ir precisamente en esa dirección: trabajar sin desmayo, sin pereza y con entusiasmo hasta el día en el que Señor aparezca definitivamente.

Hoy, como desde hace siglos, se sigue hablando si estamos en una etapa final de la historia, del hombre y del mundo mismo. ¿Qué hacer? ¿Cómo reaccionar? ¿Hacia dónde caminar? Las pistas nos las ofrece el evangelio de este día: “No hagan caso”. Pero mantengamos la esperanza viva. Paz y Bien.

Treasures from Our Tradition

We are faced with strong and disturbing readings today that hold a certain fascination, since they seem at first glance to be blueprints for future inevitable wars and hardship. A fundamentalist interpretation focuses on this aspect. Yet we hear them at our Sunday celebration of the Eucharist, which infuses them with hope and optimism. Rather than dreading the future, today's liturgy assures us that God is with us in all of life's inevitable trials, and that we have a role in shaping the outcome of human history. Occasionally, some Christians have attempted to decode these readings for an exact measure of the worlds end, but they have thus far been disappointed.

Nothing lasts forever is a lyric from a Broadway show. Stars fall from the sky, leaves wither and fall, mountains wash into the sea, human projects and governments totter and collapse with great regularity. Today's liturgy opposes this idea as incomplete, reminding us that Christ has made a permanent change in human history, and that life in him is life forever. Rather than inviting us to throw in the towel, today's liturgy strengthens us for acts of goodness and grace in our families, communities, and world.
