An Advent Letter from Fr. Paul SPRITUAL Advent Message and Request Greetings and Peace this Advent Season.

I pray you had a Happy Thanksgiving! Now that it is over, it is tempting to turn our attention to Christmas. However, the Church askes us first to enter into ADVENT, as a way of preparing for Christmas. The Gospel this coming Sunday, the First week of Advent compares the time of Noah and the Flood which swept away all those unprepared, to these days. Like Noah needed time to build the Ark to be ready for the flood, this life does require us to use the time we have, to prepare for the coming judgement and Kingdom of God. Are we using our time here wisely? Advent is a period of less than one month, to focus on preparing ourselves for the birth of Christ. Like Mary between the time of the Annunciation and Birth, we take time to nourish the presence of God inside us, so that it grows, so we too may give birth to Christ, in our families, places of work, friends and to those in need. Let us use this Advent to prepare. If you do not already, please consider taking 5-10 minutes daily to pray, reflect and make more room for God in your mind, heart and life.

St. Juan Diego

On July 31, 2002, in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe, our Holy Father canonized Juan Diego Cuauhtlatoatzin. On 9 December 1531, when Juan Diego was on his way to morning Mass, the Blessed Mother appeared to him on Tepeyac Hill, the outskirts of what is now Mexico City. She asked him to go to the Bishop and to request in her name that a shrine be built at Teypeyac, where she promised to pour out her grace upon those who invoked her. The Bishop, who did not believe Juan Diego, asked for a sign to prove that the apparition was true. On December 12, Juan Diego returned to Tepeyac. Here, the Blessed Mother told him to climb the hill and to pick the flowers that he would find in bloom. He obeyed, and although it was winter time, he found roses flowering. He gathered the flowers and took them to Our Lady who carefully placed them in his mantle and told him to take them to the Bishop as proof. When he opened his mantle, the flowers fell on the ground and there remained impressed, in place of the flowers, an image of the Blessed Mother, the apparition at Tepevac. With the Bishop's permission, Juan Diego lived the rest of his life as a hermit in a small hut near the chapel where the miraculous image was placed for veneration. Here he cared for the church and the first pilgrims who came to pray to the Mother of Jesus. Much deeper than the exterior grace of having been chosen as Our Lady's messenger, Juan Diego received the grace of interior enlightenment and from that moment he began a life dedicated to prayer and the practice of virtue and boundless love of God and neighbor. He died in 1548 and was buried in the first chapel dedicated to the Virgin of Guadalupe. The Church in the Americas celebrates St. Juan Diego annually on December 9th.



Our major Feast is this week – the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Many, many people will be joining us for this Feast. It is the Feast of our parish. Please plan to join in the Liturgies of the day and give the honor that is due to Mary, Our Blessed Mother, Our Lady of Guadalupe.

Agradecer a Dios habernos regalado a las personas con las que convivimos.

Buscar el bien común por encima de los intereses personales. Corregir con empatía a aquél que se equivoca.

Dar lo mejor de uno mismo, poniéndose siempre al servicio de los otros.

Estimar a los otros, sabiendo reconocer sus capacidades. Facilitar las cosas dando soluciones y no creando más problemas.

Ganar la confianza de los otros compartiendo con ellos sus preocupaciones.

Heredar la capacidad de aquellos que saben ser sinceros con valentía y respeto.

Interceder por los otros a Dios, antes de hablarle de nuestras cosas. Juzgar a los otros por lo que son, no por lo que tienen ni por lo que aparentan.

Limitar las ansias personales frente a las necesidades del grupo. Llenarse con lo mejor que uno encuentra en el camino de la vida.


Mediar entre los compañeros que no se entienden. Olvidar el miedo al "qué dirán".


