### *Happy New Year & Building Our Faith Campaign Update From Fr. Paul*

I pray you had a Merry Christmas, and wish you continued Blessing through this Christmas Season, and a Happy New Year on January 1, 2020 Feast of Mary Mother of God.

Thank You for Your Prayers for our recent meeting with the Archdiocese Financial Services on Monday December 16<sup>th</sup>. The meeting went well. At the meeting we presented a detailed examination of our progress to date, an overview of all our other assets, and the cost remaining on the project. Based on our presentation, the Archdiocese is considering our request for a construction loan to begin as soon as April 2020. I wish to be clear; at the meeting we were asked to respond to a few requests for more detailed information and it helped us to formulate the wording of a more formal written request for the loan that we have submitted since the meeting. We are still waiting their official response. The process is a bit drawn out because we are still short of the amount needed to fully fund the project, as the cost of the project has increased to 3.8 Million over the years that we have been conducting this campaign. If the approval comes, we will still need to raise a bit more money, as we currently have raised almost 3.3 Million. I recognize the great sacrifice many have made and acknowledge that we have done a good job even surpassing our original goal of 3 Million. Thank You very much to all those who have pledged and donated to this campaign! It is a blessing. I again ask all to participate. If you have not yet helped, or if you can help some more, would you please consider doing so? We are so close at this point. Thank You. I am very hopeful that God will soon answer our prayers to break ground in the next few coming months, helping 2020 to indeed be a "Happy New Year!"

### ***LA FAMILIA, NUESTRO MEJOR TESORO***

Celebrando la Navidad tiempo litúrgico de esperanza y alegría, tenemos la festividad de la Sagrada Familia, Jesús nace en una familia, con su padre Jose y su Madre María. Este es un valor universal y de todos los tiempos. Vivimos una época de muchos cambios y transformaciones que han afectado también a la familia. Las encuestas, sin embargo, ponen de relieve que seguimos valorando altamente la familia, que sigue siendo una referencia esencial en nuestras vidas. Pero múltiples peligros acechan su estabilidad: problemas de convivencia, nuevos hábitos laborales, situaciones de riesgo para los hijos, falta de referencias educativas sólidas, malos tratos, crisis del compromiso estable... La familia de Nazaret es un modelo universal para todos los tiempos. Las difíciles circunstancias en las que Jesús creció fueron solventadas con el amor y la entrega mutua. Así lo contemplamos en el evangelio de hoy: María y José no comprendían lo que les quería decir Jesús. A muchos padres les cuesta también comprender a sus hijos, no saben qué hacer con sus hijos adolescentes. El hogar es la primera escuela, la iglesia do-

méstica, donde el niño aprende lo que observa de los padres, es el lugar privilegiado para la iniciación en la fe. La familia satisface las necesidades básicas de todo ser humano. Todos tenemos la necesidad de amar y ser amado, necesidad de ser válidos, necesidad de ser autónomos y necesidad de vivir en pertenencia. La familia nos da seguridad: necesitamos sentirnos incluidos y que nos lo recuerden. Da la impresión de que muchos hijos de hoy sienten que pertenecen más a las abuelas o a su profesor que a los padres, pues ellos suelen pertenecer a su trabajo más que a nadie, sin embargo el tiempo para vivir con ellos y compartir, transmitir buenas costumbres no puede desaparecer. Los abuelos, a su vez, tienen la sensación de que son una carga para sus hijos. El Libro del Eclesiástico recuerda la obligación de todo hijo de honrar a su padre, que incluye no abandonarle.

Jesús iba creciendo en sabiduría, en estatura y en gracia ante Dios y los hombres. Nunca ha sido fácil la educación de los hijos, sin embargo hoy parece una tarea más difícil. Hay que predicar con el ejemplo.... A veces se les da todo, sin darse cuenta de lo que implica. Los hijos se creen que todo les es debido. Esto ocurre cuando los padres son demasiado protectores. Ante todo, los padres son los primeros educadores de sus hijos y deben ir con el ejemplo por delante. ¿Qué es educar? Educar es tratar a cada hijo como persona distinta, diferente, independiente y libre. Hay que aceptar la individualidad que es sagrada y permitirle ser él mismo, seguir su camino, su vocación. Educar es estar atentos a reforzar y alentar cuanto de positivo tenga el educando, aunque debe evitarse elogiar por todo y a cada momento, dando la sensación de que se le está juzgando constantemente. Educar es descartar las etiquetas, las frases destructivas (“me avergüenzo de ti, eres un desastre, no serás nada en la vida, cada día vas peor, tenías que ser tu etc. ...”). Estos juicios negativos causan verdaderos estragos en la autoestima, bloquean su seguridad y aumentan la culpabilidad. Y educar no es no es pasarse entre los esposos las culpas de la malacrianza de los hijos. Es asumir cada cual su parte de error y poner remedio cuanto antes. Educar no es que un padre consienta todo mientras el otro se muestra intransigente, pues se confunde y desorienta al educando. Educar no es aplicar parámetros distintos según el buen o mal humor del momento. Es asumir valores y tener buenas raíces. Es poner mucho amor, dedicación y entrega.

Pautas para la buena educación de los hijos. Reflexionemos detenidamente sobre lo que dice esta “Carta de un hijo a todos los padres del mundo”. “No me grites Te respeto menos cuando lo haces. Y me enseñas a gritar a mí también y yo no quiero hacerlo. Trátame con amabilidad y cordialidad igual que a tus amigos, Que seamos familia, no significa que no podamos ser amigos. Si hago algo malo, no me preguntes por qué lo hice, pues a veces ni yo lo sé. El reto es encontrar un camino adecuado para conocerse, ayudarse, comunicarse, y sobre todo para orar juntos y asistir a la Iglesia, crecer en la fe y sabiduría como la familia de Nazaret. Oremos unas familias por otras. Bendiciones.
