****EPIFANÍA: DIOS REVELA QUIÉN ES****

Celebramos hoy un día entrañable para todos nosotros, es el día en que Dios se manifiesta al mundo y la escritura y la tradición dice a los más sencillos, los Reyes Magos. Esta fiesta de hoy se llama la Epifanía del Señor. Epifanía significa manifestación. Dios revela quién es. Se dice que hay tres epifanías a lo largo del año: la del día de hoy, la del Bautismo del Señor que celebraremos el domingo próximo, y la de las bodas de Caná. En cada uno de estos momentos Cristo reveló su gloria, manifestó quién es.

Dios manifiesta su gloria. En estas fiestas de Navidad contemplamos a Dios que ha nacido en Belén, y ese niño pequeño, envuelto en pañales y acostado en un pesebre, es la manifestación de la gloria de Dios. Parece algo increíble: que el poder y la gloria de Dios, creador de todo y Señor del mundo entero, se manifieste en la pequeñez de un niño recién nacido e indefenso. Sin embargo, así es como actúa Dios, y así lo creyeron aquellos sabios venidos de Oriente, que reconocieron en aquel niño al mismo Dios hecho hombre. Desde antiguo Dios se manifestaba en signos imponentes: una columna de fuego, una zarza que arde sin consumirse... Dios hablaba a través de los profetas. Sin embargo ahora Dios ha querido mostrarse en persona, hecho hombre. En ese niño pequeño, indefenso, nacido para nuestra salvación, vemos el poder de Dios que viene a salvarnos mediante su entrega por amor a nosotros. Ésta es la manifestación del mismo Dios.

Dios se revela a todos los pueblos de la tierra. Esta manifestación que hoy celebramos no es sólo para unos cuantos hombres, los pastores, el pueblo de Israel o los sacerdotes. Dios se manifiesta a todos los pueblos de la tierra. Así lo ha querido Dios. Lo anuncia ya en la primera lectura de hoy el profeta Isaías, que anima a Jerusalén a levantarse pues sobre la ciudad brilla la gloria de Dios que atrae a todos los pueblos de la tierra. Pablo nos dice en la segunda lectura de la carta a los Efesios que también los gentiles, aquellos que no pertenecen al pueblo de Israel, son coherederos de la salvación que Dios ha traído en su nacimiento. Pero especialmente en este día reconocemos esta salvación universal para todos los pueblos al encontrar a aquellos Magos venidos de Oriente. Desde los confines del mundo vienen a adorar al Niño Dios, se postran ante Él y le ofrecen sus dones. En la tradición cristiana ha quedado esto reflejado en los tres Reyes Magos, representados cada uno de una raza distinta. Así es como nuestra fe, a lo largo de la historia, ha comprendido la manifestación de la gloria de Dios para todos los hombres de la tierra.
