

The Waters of Baptism

When new sod is put in, it needs constant saturation with water. Landscapers say that this “knits” the sod to the soil. The same when a branch is grafted onto a tree: the poultice that joins them at the splice must be kept wet at all times. Water is the stuff that binds the very cells of our bodies together. No wonder religions throughout all times and cultures have used it so prominently.

When Jesus stepped into the Jordan for baptism, he “knit” himself to what had come before him. By going to the Jordan, he made himself one with the people of Israel who had crossed it into their Promised Land. With John the Baptist, Christ wove himself into the prophetic tradition that heralded the coming reign of God. He had become fully human in the waters of Mary’s womb, and by partaking in the rite of the baptism of repentance, Jesus identified himself with our sinful, frail humanity. It is through the waters of baptism that Christ continues to graft new members onto his Body, the Church; through these waters we are cleansed from sin and filled with the promise of grace, given our destiny for eternal life. For us, as for Jesus, it is also the waters of baptism that inaugurate our mission to proclaim the Good News.



Homebound Ministers

The Ministers to the Sick & Homebound are those who are called to unite those unable to attend with the faith community that gathered in way of serving as Extraordinary Eucharistic Ministers to bring the

Blessed Sacrament – the Body of our Lord Christ Jesus and the lives of Our Lady of Guadalupe Parish to our sick & homebound brothers and sisters. **NUESTRO BAUTISMO.****¿LO VIVIMOS?**

Iniciamos el tiempo ordinario y terminamos la navidad celebrando el Bautismo de Nuestro Señor Jesús. Es importante en este día caer en la cuenta de que el bautismo de Juan Bautista en el Jordán no era como nuestro bautismo. Juan bautizaba con agua, como él mismo nos dice en el Evangelio de hoy, en espera de la llegada del Mesías que bautizará con Espíritu Santo y fuego. El bautismo de Juan por tanto es un bautismo que prepara la llegada del Mesías. Era un bautismo de purificación, de conversión, de arrepentimiento. Era muy común entre los israelitas la práctica de

lavarse con agua como signo de purificación. Lo hacían por ejemplo los judíos antes de entrar en el templo de Jerusalén, lo hacían también los sacerdotes antes de oficiar el culto, y así en muchas otras ocasiones. La fe de Israel se fijaba mucho en la impureza, en las cosas que podían hacer impuro al hombre, sobre todo lo que venía de fuera según creían ellos, por eso utilizaban mucho este signo de lavarse como signo de purificación. El bautismo de Juan en el Jordán tiene este mismo sentido. Juan, el precursor, sabía que estaba cerca la llegada del Mesías, y por eso prepara esta venida con el bautismo, llamando a la conversión del corazón, invitando a dejar atrás todo aquello que nos separa de Dios y lavándose externamente como signo de esta conversión interna.

Jesús bajó a bautizarse como uno más. Es impactante esta escena del Evangelio, pues vemos a Jesús, Dios hecho hombre, que no tiene pecado ninguno, unirse a la fila de los que se acercaban a Juan para que los bautizase. Es un acto de humildad el de Cristo, que se pone en la fila como un pecador más, en espera de recibir el agua purificadora del Bautista. Dios está entre los hombres, pero ellos no le reconocen. Hasta que, al salir Jesús del agua del Jordán, Dios se pronuncia, hace resonar su voz desde el cielo, y presenta a Cristo como su hijo amado: “Tú eres mi Hijo, el amado, el predilecto”. Ésta es la epifanía que hoy celebramos: la manifestación de Cristo como el Hijo amado del Padre. Y esta escena se completa con la venida del Espíritu Santo que, en forma de paloma, se posa sobre Cristo. Queda por tanto de manifiesto en el Bautismo del Señor, que Cristo es el Hijo, que ha salido del Padre, como hemos celebrado esta Navidad, que se ha hecho hombre y que tiene la fuerza del Espíritu Santo para hablar y actuar en nombre de Dios Padre.

Nuestro bautismo. Aunque el día propio para recordar nuestro bautismo es la noche de la Vigilia Pascual, la noche de la Resurrección, hoy también es un buen día para recordar que también nosotros fuimos bautizados. No es nuestro bautismo igual que el de Juan el Bautista, pues como ya hemos dicho, el bautismo de Juan en el Jordán era un bautismo simbólico. Sin embargo, éste es anuncio y preparación del bautismo inaugurado por Cristo con su muerte y su resurrección. El mismo Juan lo afirma en el pasaje del Evangelio de hoy: “Yo los bautizo con agua, pero viene el que puede más que yo, y no merezco desatarle la correa de sus sandalias. Él los bautizará con Espíritu Santo y fuego”. Éste es el bautismo que nosotros hemos recibido, mediante el cual hemos entrado en la muerte y la resurrección de Cristo. Por medio de nuestro bautismo, hemos sido hechos hijos de Dios por el Hijo, que es Cristo, y hemos recibido el Espíritu Santo en nosotros. Cuando nosotros fuimos bautizados, también Dios dijo de nosotros lo que dijo de Jesús en el día de su bautismo: “Este es mi hijo”. Hoy es por tanto un buen día para recordar que somos hijos de Dios por nuestro bautismo, y que por tanto hemos de vivir como bautizados, como verdaderos hijos de Dios. Dios es nuestro Padre, que nos ama, que nos lo ha dado todo, y nosotros hemos de seguirle, cumpliendo siempre su voluntad.

Al terminar hoy el tiempo de Navidad y volver de nuevo al Tiempo Ordinario, al celebrar esta solemnidad del Bautismo del Señor, es una buena oportunidad para hacer memoria de nuestro bautismo. Somos hijos de Dios, Él nos ama como a hijos queridos. Dejemos por tanto atrás todo aquello que es contrario a este nombre de hijos de Dios y vivamos cada día, en este Tiempo Ordinario que comenzamos, con la alegría de sabernos amados por Dios Padre y seamos buenos hijos suyos dispuestos siempre a cumplir su voluntad siguiendo el ejemplo de Cristo. Sobre todo construyendo el Reino de Dios aquí en la tierra con nuestras obras. Amen.
