

St. Blaise became the patron saint of throats after healing a boy choking on a fishbone.

¡ME HAS DICHO LLAMADO POR MI NOMBRE, SEÑOR!

Durante el año litúrgico el evangelio de San Mateo, nos va acompañar, comenzamos a caminar detrás del cayado de Jesús, escuchando sus primeras palabras (llamada a la conversión) y asombrándonos con sus profundas miradas. Hoy, el Señor, sigue pronunciando nuestro nombre. Nos necesita para que, su misión, lejos de desvanecerse siga propagándose por los cuatro puntos de nuestro mundo. Ese es nuestro objetivo evangelizar, o sea expandir el evangelio de la buena nueva por todo lugar.

La Galilea de hoy (allá donde Jesús quiere hacerse presente) es el lugar donde cada uno de nosotros nos encontramos hoy, podríamos decir es mi Galilea, o sea, donde estoy, que hago, que pienso, cuáles son mis dones, dificultades, malos entendidos, grandezas etc. Tal vez unos, más acomodados que otros pero envueltos en muchas cosas. Seguimos escuchando al Señor que viene a nuestro encuentro. Y claro Él quiere lo mejor para nosotros, porque de verdad nos ama, un cambio de ruta y de rumbo.

Por ello mismo, porque nos aprecia, desea un fruto para nuestra vida completamente distinto del que nos afanamos o por el cual nos desvivimos. Es duro dejar las redes con las que estamos acostumbrados a salir adelante según los parámetros exclusivos del mundo. Es difícil, ante otras miradas más influyentes y seductoras, captar aquella otra mirada de Jesús más humilde y, por otra parte, más interpelante. Al escuchar el evangelio de este día, nuestro bautismo, se vuelve a actualizar. No es algo del pasado. No es una gracia muerta. El bautismo, ante la llamada del Señor, nos invita a tomar partido: estamos llamados a ser testigos de Jesús. ¿Cómo serlo? ¿Cómo hacerlo? En principio por el camino de la conversión. O conversión...o más de lo mismo. Es decir; mediocridad antes que santidad.

En distintas circunstancias me ha tocado escuchar expresiones como las siguientes: "yo creo en Dios y punto" "yo creo en Jesús a mi manera" "no he hecho mal a nadie, no he matado, etc., y, con eso, ya es bastante". Y, cuando uno escucha estas expresiones, no puede menos que pensar si –en el fondo- no estamos moldeando un Dios a nuestra medida. Si, en el fondo –además de un Dios humillado en Belén- no lo pretendemos, además, sometido a nuestros caprichos. Sin limitaciones a nuestra libertad. ¿Es eso amor y seguimiento a Jesús? ¿Cuándo entenderemos que –conversión y fe- van agarradas de la mano? ¿Puede decir el esposo a la esposa "te quiero" si, a continuación, sólo busca una felicidad unilateral y exclusiva para él? Ponerse en las manos de Jesús o fiarnos totalmente de sus indicaciones pueden ser perfectamente signos que denotan nuestra conversión, nuestras ganas de cambiar a mejor, nuestra ilusión para que El, sólo El, sea la brújula de nuestra vida.

El mundo que nos toca vivir está lleno de técnica y de comodidad pero, por el contrario, huérfano de amor. Hay muchas mal llamadas, marketing y ventanas de tiendas, que dibujan realidades superficiales. Por el contrario cuesta, y mucho, encontrar ventanas o puertas abiertas que nos lleven al amor de Dios. Y no porque el amor de Dios no exista, que siempre está ahí, sino porque los oídos del hombre moderno están acostumbrados a percibir exclusivamente sonidos superficiales, cómodos y con poco esfuerzo de sacrificio o de superación personal. Y, el Señor.....desea testigos valientes, capaces de renunciar a sí mismos, con ideas claras y –sobre todo- que estén dispuestos a ir contra corriente.

Que el Señor, por lo menos en este domingo, nos encuentre con un corazón dispuesto a una renovación personal y comunitaria. Que el Señor, en este Día del Señor, encuentre en nuestros labios un "sí" como respuesta a todo aquello que nos pide como muestra de nuestra fidelidad y de nuestra fe. ¿Hemos escuchado nuestro nombre? Si Él nos ha llamado personalmente, Escuchémoslo!!!

Learn how to help children suffering from trauma

With mass shootings, natural disasters, and the social climate today, our children are living in a world that can be very scary at times. Children who have suffered from trauma, through abuse, loss, or another tragedy, may have different ways of viewing the world through the distorted lens of their fears and worries, and often need the help of trusted adults to guide them through their emotions. Many children use denial as their first coping method, so getting them to talk about what's happened and explore how they're feeling and what scares them now is important. Consider consulting someone with expertise in child development – a psychologist, counselor or experienced teacher might have suggestions as to how best to support a child in the aftermath of a frightening experience.




FEBRUARY 2, 2020 READINGS
