


Lent has begun. What are you doing in the way of Penance to reform your life so that you might live more faithfully your baptismal commitment?

Our Loan Was Approved!

With Gratitude to God, and All who have been so generous, I am able to finally let you know that we have been approved by the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, to receive a loan for the amount we've yet to raise for our Building Our Faith expansion of our school and church! This addition will add a S.T.E.M. Lab, Music & Arts Multipurpose room, office space, conference room space, and greeting space outside the church entrance on the parking lot side. Additionally, this will free up the current school office space for meeting space for ministry and give us more outdoor picnic and barbecue area and greater campus security. I am very grateful for this approval that will allow us to begin construction in the next few months. Many have contributed to this effort by your donations of time, talent, and treasure! Thank you so much!

This good news comes with the responsibility to continue our fundraising so that we can payback this loan. So far we have raised more than 3.3 Million! The project is expected to cost 3.8 Million. To be conservative, I'd like to say our goal needs to be 4.0 Million. Now more than ever, we need everyone's support. Thanks to all who have pledged and donated! I would like to ask that we continue to be faithful to our pledges. If you have helped us already, but could at this time increase your pledge or donation, that would be a tremendous blessing and a big help! Finally, I ask all who have not yet contributed, would you please help us now? It is my dream that all parish (church and school) families contribute. May I suggest you consider pledging just slightly more than \$1 a day, or \$33 per month, so as to make a 5-year pledge of \$2,000. If all our families did this, we'd be able to fully fund this project. If this amount is not possible, please help at whatever level you can afford to do. You may learn more about the project on our website, or in the back of the church. You may pledge and contribute online or using the blue envelopes in the pews in church.

El Hijo de Dios vive nuestra existencia “de verdad”

Hoy es primer domingo de Cuaresma, tiempo litúrgico de abundante gracia, que nos invita a confrontar nuestra vida con el Evangelio y a examinar el ritmo de nuestro seguimiento del Señor de cara a la gran celebración de la Pascua.

La Cuaresma es para tomársela en serio. La austерidad de estos días nos lleva a hacer un sincero análisis de nosotros mismos y de nuestra relación con Dios. La austерidad cuaresmal nos es propuesta como un modo de evitar la distracción y así centrarnos bien en esa toma de conciencia de nosotros mismos: de lo que somos y de cómo somos, de lo que vivimos y de cómo vivimos, de lo que hacemos y de cómo lo hacemos.

Por ello es un tiempo maravilloso donde abunda la gracia de Dios. El don de Dios, la luz de Dios, su amor misericordioso quiere colarse en los entresijos de nuestro ser, donde se cuece lo que somos, para reconstruir fracturas, curar heridas, vigorizar lo débil y volver a modelar nuestro “barro”.

La clave está en la voluntad de abrir la puerta del corazón a esa Gracia que sobreabunda aunque pueda abundar el pecado. ¡Qué magnífico don! ... Las lecturas de hoy nos dan un mensaje extraordinario al respecto animándonos a vivir plenamente y con alegre confianza en Dios el ejercicio cuaresmal.

Cada evangelista, en el respectivo año litúrgico, nos ofrece su versión de Jesús tentado, como Adán y Eva en el paraíso. Los que más se parecen, a diferencia de Marcos, son los relatos de Mateo y Lucas. Éste ha cambiado el orden, por razones teológicas; pero el mensaje no puede ser muy distinto en uno y otro, aunque con matices. En el caso de Mateo se intenta poner de manifiesto la fidelidad de lo que los judíos rezan todos los días en el “shema” (Dt 6,4-5: Escucha Israel, el Señor es tu único Dios... y lo amarás con todo el corazón, con toda el alma, con todas tus fuerzas). No debemos asombrarnos si decimos y subrayamos que el relato va más allá de lo puntualmente “histórico”, para ser un ejemplo vivo en la comunidad de cómo hay que luchar contra lo que nos deshumaniza en razón de una falsa “divinización”. Porque la divinización es pecado cuando viene de nosotros mismos que no aceptamos nuestra vida ni la de nuestros hermanos los hombres; pero es gracia y salvación cuando viene de Dios como don de la creación y de la redención; entonces es auténtica “theoresis”, como pensaban los “padres” griegos.

Sabemos que este relato tiene una característica que los expertos le han llamado “haggada”, sobre las tentaciones del pueblo en el desierto, y actualizadas por la tradición cristiana para presentar el verdadero mesianismo de Jesús. Podemos constatar que las respuestas de Jesús están formuladas según los textos bíblicos que aluden al pueblo en esa travesía: La primera respuesta de Jesús es una cita de Dt 8,3 que, a su vez alude a Ex 16,1 ss (el maná). La respuesta a la segunda tentación es una cita de Dt 6,16 que, a su vez, alude a Ex 17,1-7 (las aguas de Massá). La tercera respuesta cita a Dt 6,13 que puede aludir tanto a Ex 32 (el becerro de oro) como a Ex 23,24 y 34,13-17 (mandato de no adorar las divinidades cananeas). Por tanto respuestas que quieren ser ejemplo “corporativo” para la comunidad, porque Jesús con su rechazo es, para Mateo, el Mesías que hace posible un nuevo pueblo hacia Dios. Pero también deberíamos ver aquí lo más personal de Jesús como hombre, como persona, igual que nosotros, que vence... con opciones personales, al ponerse en manos de Dios.

Caminemos esta jornada cuaresmal en fe y con un decisivo propósito de vivirla a plenitud , especialmente, cambiando nuestra corazón de piedra por uno de carne. Amen.

Personalice su plan de seguridad contra incendios

Estudios demuestran que contar con un plan de escape en caso de incendios, y ejecutarlo rápidamente, aumenta en gran medida las posibilidades de un escape exitoso de una casa incendiada. En los estudios, los investigadores probaron las alarmas de humo estándares de altos decibeles con niños dormidos, y encontraron que solo la mitad de los niños se despertaron con el ruido. Sin embargo, cuando los investigadores usaron mensajes personalizados grabados por los padres de los niños junto con el sonido de las alarmas, casi el 100 por ciento de los niños se levantaron y siguieron con éxito el plan de escape.



What are Scrutinies?

For those preparing for full initiation at Easter, the ninety days from Ash Wednesday through Pentecost, are referred to as the Period of Purification and Enlightenment. During Lent our Elect and Candidates are invited to reflect on three stories found in John's Gospel: The Samaritan Woman at the Well, The Healing of the Man Born Blind, and the Raising of Lazarus

from the dead. These powerful stories challenge us to identify our thirst for living water, to name our spiritual blindness, and to be freed from whatever entombs us. On the third, fourth, and fifth Sundays of Lent we will hear these Gospel stories proclaimed and pray for the Elect asking God to free them from all evil so that they may know Christ as the source of Living Water, the Light of the World and life everlasting. The Scrutiny's will be celebrated at various Masses so all of our parish community will be able to pray for our Catechumens during the final weeks of sacramental preparation.

Personalize your fire safety plan

Research shows that having a fire escape plan, and executing it quickly, greatly increases the chances of a successful escape from a house fire. In studies, researchers tested standard high-decibel smoke alarms

on sleeping children, and found that just over half the children woke up to the noise. However, when researchers used personalized messages recorded by the children's parents in conjunction with the beeping smoke alarms, almost 100 percent of the children woke up and successfully followed their escape plan.
