Our Loan Was Approved!

With Gratitude to God, and All who have been so generous, I am able to finally let you know that we have been approved by the Archdiocese of Los Angeles, to receive a loan for the amount we've yet to raise for our Building Our Faith expansion of our school and church! This addition will add a S.T.E.M. Lab, Music & Arts Multipurpose room, office space, conference room space, and greeting space outside the church entrance on the parking lot side. Additionally, this will free up the current school office space for meeting space for ministry and give us more outdoor picnic and barbeque area and greater campus security. I am very grateful for this approval that will allow us to begin construction in the next few months. Many have contributed to this effort by your donations of time, talent, and treasure! Thank you so much!

This good news comes with the responsibility to continue our fundraising so that we can payback this loan. So far we have raised more than 3.3 Million! The project is expected to cost 3.8 Million. To be conservative, I'd like to say our goal needs to be 4.0 Million. Now more than ever, we need everyone's support. Thanks to all who have pledged and donated! I would like to ask that we continue to be faithful to our pledges. If you have helped us already, but could at this time increase your pledge or donation, that would be a tremendous blessing and a big help! Finally, I ask all who have not yet contributed, would you please help us now? It is my dream that all parish (church and school) families contribute. May I suggest you consider pledging just slightly more than \$1 a day, or \$33 per month, so as to make a 5-year pledge of \$2,000. If all our families did this, we'd be able to fully fund this project. If this amount is not possible, please help at whatever level you can afford to do. ¡HAY QUE SALIR!

La transfiguración del Señor: ¿será algo que nosotros creemos? ¿Valoramos? O nunca hemos entrado en ese misterio de la soledad con Dios, El y tú? ¿Sera que debo tener esta experiencia de irme a un lugar apartado y dejarme hablar por Dios?

Aquellos apóstoles, estoy seguro, no entendían “ni papa”. De repente todo se transforma de tal manera que, por querer, hasta pretendían quedarse indefinidamente en lo más alto de la cumbre. Y es que, cuando uno sale de sus obligaciones, del ajeteo de cada día para encontrarse con Dios, llega a pensar que, es en ese lugar, donde mejor se está y donde merecería la pena vivir para siempre. Luego, por supuesto, los pies en la tierra, y la conciencia de que nuestra fe no sólo es espiritualidad, nos harán caminar y optar también por la senda del compromiso. Jesús, no nos quiere volando ni perdidos entre nubes, sino embarrados y entretejidos con las cuestiones que preocupan al hombre de hoy.

El Monte Tabor es el escenario de una experiencia que marcaría el rumbo de las vidas de Pedro, Santiago y Juan. Aquel “qué bien se está aquí” que el espontáneo Pedro exclamó con fuerza, emoción y con paz, es idéntico al que nosotros, con una eucaristía bien celebrada y atendida, una oración pausada o contemplativa o con cualquier otro acto de piedad podemos expresar.

Tabor, en este segundo domingo de la Santa Cuaresma, es el compromiso de acompañar a un Jesús que se ofrece como camino, recorrido con cruz, para que el hombre no olvide ni su dignidad ni su ser hijo de Dios. No nos podemos quedar cómodamente sentados en la felicidad de nuestros sueños; en una fe personal y privada. ¡Qué más quisieran algunos! Uno, cuando escucha la Palabra, con la misma confianza y credulidad que lo hicieron Abraham, Pablo, Pedro, Santiago o Juan, a la fuerza ha de ponerse inmediatamente en movimiento. Nuestra presencia en esta Eucaristía nos debe de llevar a soltar un “qué bien se está aquí” pero también nos ha de llevar a un convencimiento: el mundo nos espera fuera; en el mundo es donde hemos de dar muestras de lo que aquí, en este “monte tabor que es la Eucaristía”, hemos vivido, visualizado, escuchado y compartido. ¿Seremos capaces? ¿O nos conformaremos con este puntual “tabor” que es la misa dominical?

¿Qué significa la transfiguración? La transformación luminosa de Jesús delante de sus discípulos, ya camino de Jerusalén y de la pasión, es como un respiro que se concede Jesús para ponerse en comunicación con lo más profundo de su ser y de su obediencia a Dios. Jesús lee, digamos, su propia historia a la luz de su obediencia a Dios con objeto de llevar adelante ese plan de salvación para todos los hombres. Jesús no sube al monte de la transfiguración siendo el Hijo de Dios de la alta cristología, sino el hombre-profeta de Galilea que pregunta a Dios si el camino que ha emprendido se cumplirá. Por eso Lucas pone tanto interés en la oración, porque estas cosas se preguntan y se viven en la oración. Y las respuestas de Dios se escuchan también en la experiencia de la oración. De esa manera, los dos personajes que se presentan acompañando a la nube divina, Moisés y Elías, representantes cualificados del Antiguo Testamento, indican que ahora es Jesús quien revela a Dios y a su mundo. Los discípulos le acompañan, pero no pueden percibir más que una especie de sosiego que les lleva a pedir y desear “plantarse” allí, construir tiendas en lo alto del monte.

¿Cómo vivir hoy transfigurados? ¿Cuál será el secreto para que nos transparentemos y demos a conocer la Gloria del Señor en nuestras vidas? Busquemos como. Paz y Bien.

Almsgiving

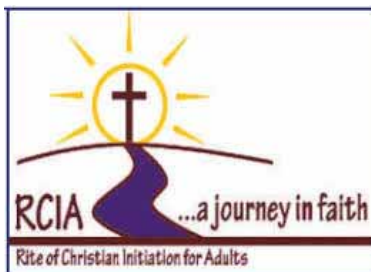
We have provided Lenten Coin Banks at the back of the church today so your family can easily practice Almsgiving this Lent. This year as in the previous years all of your dona-

Our bookkeeper, Robin, will be on vacation February 27– March 16. If you donate by check, those checks will be deposited after her return

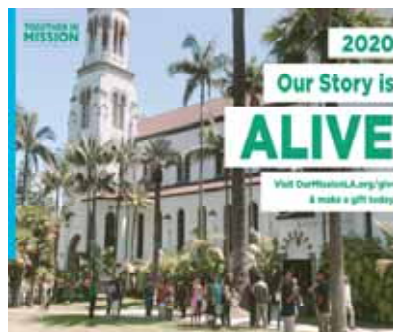


RCIA Celebration of the Scrutinies
