A Message from Fr. Paul

During this Time of Limiting our Interactions to help prevent the spread of COVID-19

As of Monday March 16th, the Archbishop has suspended the PUBLIC celebration of the Mass. Additionally, he has given further directives about the other celebrations and services. I will reprint these briefly below. HOWEVER, I ask that you continue to go to our website: ourladyofguadalupechurch.org to find the latest information, as this printing might already be out of date! The updated information will be on the front page of the website, under the "Church Updates" post. The website will have our most complete and latest information. If you do not use the web, call our church office at 310-372-7077 for a summary of the latest information.

We do plan to continue to celebrate Masses privately, honoring our Mass intentions, and praying for all our parishioners, those who are sick, those who care for them, public health officials and others in positions of authority, and for the world, that God will deliver us from this soon. Additionally, Fr. Carlos and I will be available for individual confessions and/or counseling in the church during the week, or by appointment. The times Fr. Carlos and Fr. Paul will be in church will be posted on the website/phone. To make an appointment call the parish office, and Fr. Carlos is extension 222, and Fr. Paul is extension 225. We also do plan to keep the church open for private prayer as long as we can. If you come to the church to pray, please respect the recommended social distancing, at this time 6 feet.

I encourage all of us to continue to follow the directives of our church and civil authorities, and to PRAY, PRAY, PRAY. This is a time of fasting. A fast we have not chosen, but that has been chosen for us. The Archbishop has reminded us of the tradition of the church to offer "Spiritual communion" when during this time when we are unable to receive the sacrament. An appropriate way to make a Spiritual Communion is with your families, to follow the outline of the liturgy, proclaiming and reflecting on the readings for the day, reciting the Creed on Sundays, lifting intercessory prayers to God, and then to make an act of spiritually joining ourselves to the sacrifice of Christ on the Cross, made in obedience to the Father in Love for all, opening our Hearts to receive Him, for He is Risen and in His Risen Body is able to be with us in the Flesh and Blood of the Sacrament, and when we cannot receive the Sacrament, we trust He will be present in our flesh and blood through our Spiritual Communion. Of course another fine way to have Spiritual Communion in our day, is to watch one of the Masses via livestream, or recorded, participating fully as possible.

RECONCILIATION/CONFESSION

Communal reconciliation services should be cancelled, private confessions honoring the social distancing guidelines. Those waiting for the priest are asked to observe "social distancing."

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Priests are to attend to the needs of those who ask for the Anointing of the Sick. If a priest is sick or considered to be a high-risk individual (e.g. elderly, suffers from respiratory conditions, immunocompromised, etc.), he should request assistance from another priest.

Priests attending to the needs of the sick are to observe all proper sanitary protocols and, if necessary, check-in with proper medical personnel before entering the room of the patient.

For the time being, sick calls and distribution of Holy Communion for the homebound are reserved to priests only.

BAPTISM

Unless an emergency, the celebration of the Sacrament of Baptism is to be postponed.

WEDDINGS

Weddings are limited to celebration of the Marriage Rite itself and must be limited to a total of 10 people, including ministers.

It is recommended that pastors notify couples who have already scheduled weddings.

FUNERALS

Funerals may take place only in the form of "The Rite of Committal with Final Commendation" (also known as the "graveside"). If desired by the family, a memorial Mass can be scheduled appropriately at a later date.

CONFIRMATIONS

All Confirmations from now until Easter Sunday are postponed. The Office of the Confirming Prelate will contact parishes with Confirmations scheduled during the affected dates. Rescheduling will be handled at a later time.

HOLY WEEK

An announcement regarding the parish celebrations for Holy Week will be issued on or before Friday, March 27, 2020.

Let us also regularly pray the prayer composed by Archbishop Gomez for these times:

Holy Virgin of Guadalupe, Queen of the Angels and Mother of the Americas. We fly to you today as your beloved children. We ask you to intercede for us with your Son, as you did at the wedding in Cana. Pray for us, loving Mother, and gain for our nation and world, and for all our families and loved ones, the protection of your holy angels, that we may be spared the worst of this illness. For those already afflicted, we ask you to obtain the grace of healing and deliverance. Hear the cries of those who are vulnerable and fearful, wipe away their tears and help them to trust. In this time of trial and testing, teach all of us in the Church to love one another and to be patient and kind.

Help us to bring the peace of Jesus to our land and to our hearts. We come to you with confidence, knowing that you truly are our compassionate mother, health of the sick and cause of our joy. Shelter us under the mantle of your protection, keep us in the embrace of your arms, help us always to know the love of your Son, Jesus. Amen

Mensaje del P. Pablo

Este es un tiempo de limitar nuestras interacciones para ayudar a prevenir la propagación de COVID-19. A partir del lunes 16 de marzo, el Arzobispo ha suspendido la celebración PÚBLICA de la Misa. Además, ha dado más directivas sobre las otras celebraciones y servicios. Re-escribere estos brevemente a continuación. SIN EMBARGO, les pido que continúen visitando nuestro sitio web: ourladyofguadalupechurch.org para encontrar una información más actualizada, ya que esta seguramente estará desactualizada pues habrán cambios. La información actualizada estará en la página principal del sitio web, bajo la publicación "Actualizaciones de la Iglesia". El sitio web tendrá nuestra información más completa y más reciente. Si no usa la web, llame a la oficina de nuestra iglesia al 310 - 372-7077 para obtener un resumen de la información más reciente.

Planeamos continuar celebrando misas en privado, honrando nuestras intenciones de misa y orando por todos nuestros feligreses, aquellos que están enfermos, aquellos que los cuidan, los funcionarios de salud pública y otros en posiciones de autoridad, y por el mundo, que Dios nos libre de esto pronto. Además, el p. Carlos y yo estaremos disponibles para confesiones individuales y / o asesoramiento en horarios regulares durante la semana, o con cita previa. Los horarios regulares se publicarán en el sitio web / teléfono, y para citas llame a la oficina de la parroquia, y el Padre. Carlos es la extensión 222 y el p. Paul es la extensión 225. También planeamos mantener la iglesia abierta para la oración privada siempre que podamos. Si vienes a la iglesia a rezar, respeta el distanciamiento social recomendado, en este momento 6 pies.

Los animo a todos a seguir las directivas de nuestra iglesia y autoridades civiles, y ORAR, ORAR, ORAR. Este es un momento de ayuno. Un ayuno que no hemos elegido, pero que ha sido elegido por nosotros. El arzobispo nos ha recordado la tradición de la iglesia de ofrecer la "comunión espiritual" cuando durante este tiempo no podemos recibir el sacramento. La manera apropiada de hacer una Comunión Espiritual es con sus familias, seguir el esquema de la liturgia, proclamar y reflexionar sobre las lecturas del día, recitar el Credo los domingos, hacer oraciones de intercesión a Dios y luego hacer un acto de imaginación. y uniéndonos al sacrificio de Cristo en la Cruz, hecho en obediencia al Amor del Padre por todos, y luego abriendo nuestros Corazones para recibirlo Espiritualmente, porque Él ha Resucitado y en Su Cuerpo Resucitado puede estar con nosotros en la Carne y Sangre del Sacramento, y cuando no podemos recibir el Sacramento, confiamos en nuestra carne y sangre a través de la Comunión Espiritual. O, por supuesto, otra buena manera de tener la Comunión Espiritual en nuestros días, es mirar las Misas a través de transmisión en vivo o grabadas, participando lo más posible.
