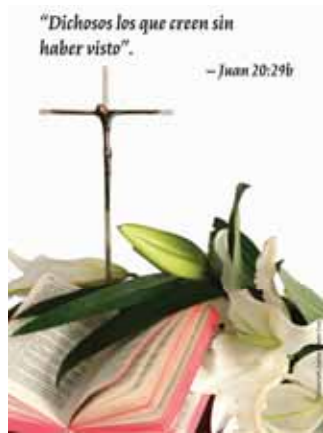

## ***Una nota del p. Carlos***

Por su Dolorosa Pasión !! Ten misericordia de Nosotros y del mundo entero !! Este es el domingo de la divina misericordia y precisamente la Iglesia termina la novena a la Divina Misericordia acordándonos que Jesús Ha resucitado y que se hace presente en la comunidad y que los empodera para la misión. Porque su amor al mundo es tan grande y su misericordia es eterna hasta el punto de seguir cuidándonos de muchas formas, por ejemplo en como hacerse presente y alentarnos a seguir adelante. Hoy es la oportunidad de renovar ese amor que Dios nos tiene y acogernos a su Espíritu Santo para que seamos misioneros y misioneras de su salvación.

**Hemos sido ungidos con el poder del Espíritu Santo, nos vamos a encontrar con el apóstol Tomas, y tal vez nos desvía un poquito de quien es el protagonista o sea del Resucitado . Ver a Tomas nos hace** reflexionar una vez más sobre nuestras altitudes, sobre el peso de nuestra fe en nuestra vida. Sin embargo, eso no es lo mejor que podemos hacer durante estos domingos. Pascua no es tiempo de centrarnos en nosotros mismos sino de levantar los ojos y ver al resucitado, de dejar que su presencia y sus palabras nos lleguen al corazón. Lo primero que hoy Jesús ofrece a los atemorizados discípulos es un mensaje de paz (¡qué bueno para estos tiempos de turbulencia!). El mensaje sigue siendo el mismo que Jesús había predicado cuando, caminando por los montes de Galilea les había hablado del Reino. La paz que les desea Jesús es el fruto de la presencia poderosa de Dios. Con la Resurrección de Jesús ha comenzado la nueva y definitiva etapa de la historia. El Reino ya está aquí. Si se sienten perseguidos y atemorizados, si nos sentimos nosotros de esa manera, no hay razón para ello. La paz de Dios está con nosotros.

Hoy con esta palabra podemos tomar distintas actitudes, o la vemos como muy linda y emocionarnos, y alegrarnos. O podríamos pensar que no es algo que estoy recibiendo para quedarme con ello como de forma un poco egoísta. Y es que Jesús nos regala la paz, lo que pide es que salgan y que prediquen, que comuniquen la paz con su fe, con su decisión de hacer partícipes a todos de la Resurrección y eso es invitación para todos, todos.

La fuerza del Espíritu de Jesús les acompaña en esa misión, que es misión universal, que no conoce fronteras, que es para todos los pueblos, razas y naciones. También nos invita a compartir nuestros dones, acompañar al necesitado, escucharlo, darle una mano. También hasta desprendernos de algo nuestro y poder ofrecerlo a alguien que lo necesita más que yo. Habla e invita de que la Resurrección es orar, caminar, anunciar, compartir, dar gracias, y todo eso vivido desde la paz y la fe.

Es importante centrar nuestra mirada en Jesús durante estos domingos de Pascua. Y sentir que Jesús nos devuelve la mirada y en el mismo viaje nos envía a ser sus testigos. Ser luz del mundo y sal de la tierra es la misión del cristiano. Y ni la luz está puesta para ser escondida ni la sal sirve para nada si se vuelve sosa. Ser cristiano es volverse a los hermanos, cercanos y lejanos, y regalarles la mirada con que nos mira Jesús.

La fe, la experiencia de haberse encontrado con el Resucitado, no es nunca algo que nos deje exactamente igual que antes. La fe nos transforma, nos cambia, nos obliga a salir de nosotros mismos, nos obliga a comunicar a otros lo que vivimos. La fe nos hace entrar en un dinamismo de relación que nos lleva a reconocer a los otros como hermanos y hermanas con los que compartir la experiencia de la fe, la experiencia de que el Reino ha empezado ya en Jesús y de que en él se abre una nueva esperanza para la humanidad.

Durante la semana pensemos de que forma podríamos comunicar la fe y la presencia de Cristo Resucitado? De que modo podría traspasar la luz a los otros y como podría ser sal de la tierra. No tenemos que salir, podemos llamar a alguien e interesarnos en como esta y desde ahí va a nacer ese deseo de compartir el gozo y la paz de la Pascua. Paz y Bien. Oramos por ustedes y oremos unos por otros.

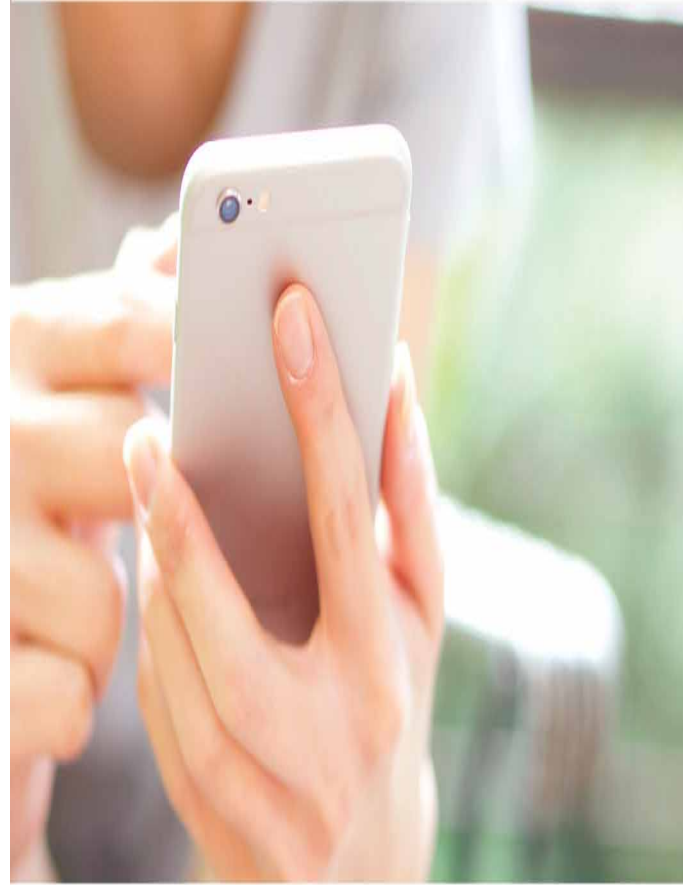

### *Scripture Reflection*

You may notice that Acts of the Apostles is the source of the first reading during the Easter season. This book describes how Christianity grew from a handful of disciples to a major religion. Today's reading about an ideal Christian community is meant to show ordinary believers how to be extraordinary, using three examples I call power, property, and prayer.

Power means the "signs and wonders" (Acts 2:43) performed by the disciples through the power of the Holy Spirit. This should be named last because it takes a lot of faith to heal the sick. If you had the same faith as the apostles, you just might be able to cure the sick. Or you might study to become a doctor and cure them with medical skills. As long as you acknowledge that God gave you the brains and the talent to become a doctor, you are doing God's work.

By property, I mean sharing what you have with those in need. Many disciples were moved to sell their goods and share them with the poor, and word of that must have spread. If you are not called to sell all your goods and become a monk or a nun, you can still tithe to your church or the poor, tutor disadvantaged kids, or help build or repair houses in poor areas. The point is that followers of Christ are not just individual do-gooders. They are a community of believers who care about each other and also care about the non-believers who need help of any kind.

So where did these first disciples get the faith to cure the sick and the love to help the needy? The answer is the third example--prayer. In the first reading we hear how "they devoted themselves . . . to the breaking of the bread" (Acts 2:42, 46)--their name for the Eucharist. They also went to the temple to pray, because at that time most disciples were Jewish Christians. As they heard the Hebrew scriptures, they saw how God's promises were fulfilled in Christ. All of these practices helped unite them to Christ and to each other.
